Food for Families

The programme offers a free nutritious food bank for low-income households in East Vancouver and Port Coquitlam; government-issued photo ID is required for first-time clients. Vancouver hours are from 4 pm to 5:15 pm Tuesdays for senior households, 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm Tuesdays for all other individuals and families, and 11 am to 12 pm Thursdays for individuals and families at The Warehouse; wheelchair accessible.

Breakfast Connect

They provide hot breakfast and referrals to community resources from 9 am to 10 am Fridays. Free Food Market distributes recovered and donated food items from 9 am to 10 am Wednesdays. Nourishing Hope Marketplace allows individuals to choose the food they receive that suit their dietary restrictions and needs; by appointment. Christmas Connect Luncheon provides a holiday meal; gift bags are available for seniors and singles. Also holds an annual Thanksgiving Turkey giveaway. Healthy Eating Community Kitchen courses offer food skills training from 12 noon to 2:30 Thursdays for six weeks; registration required. Emergency Food Hampers are available to low-income families with children living in Vancouver or Burnaby; by appointment only, registration required. New clients must present ID, proof of income, and proof of address. Also provides Christmas Hampers.

Collingwood Community Fridge and Pantry

Provides a fridge, freezer, and dry goods pantry with low-barrier, 24-hour daily access for Renfrew Collingwood residents. Accepts donations of fresh, frozen, or non-perishable foods, as well as pet food and personal hygiene products including diapers, toothpaste, menstrual products, and personal protective equipment (PPE). Does not accept donations of raw meat, seafood, alcohol, home meals, or partly consumed foods. The fridge is stocked by staff and volunteers on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, and on Saturdays if extra food is available. Food is provided in partnership with CityReach Care Society and Refood Food Rescue Foundation. Funded in part by United Way British Columbia (UWBC).

Neighbourhood Pantry

provides groceries to low-income individuals and families in the Hastings Sunrise area. **Multicultural Food Skills Exchange** offers cooking and nutrition workshops for community members. **Kids in the Kitchen** is a drop-in parent-child cooking program for

families with children up to age six. The **Gardeners' Hangout** is a seasonal social group where members share gardening tips and exchange seeds. Also offers an annual Christmas hamper program for families who face barriers to food security.

Provides a free weekly hamper program where families or individuals ages 16 and up can pick up fresh produce, dried goods, and household goods weekly at Sunset Community Centre. Patrons can register online, in-person, or over the phone, weekly to be a part of the program. Pickup schedule is between 9:15 am and 1 pm Saturdays; four pickup timeslots available per day. Registrants are encouraged to be a part of the Leisure Access Program (see separate listing for details). Offered in partnership with the Greater Vancouver Food Bank.

Little Mountain Riley Park (LM-RP) Neighbourhood Food Network (NFN)

is a grassroots network of community members, businesses, and organizations that ensures local residents have access to healthy food through programs such as the Riley Park Community Garden (RPG) and through the Yard Garden Harvest Project; offered in partnership with UBC Farm Practicum Program, with excess produce donated to the Food Hub Program. Food grown is part of the weekly Food Distribution Program which includes delivery of food hampers on a quarterly basis and meals to seniors as well as grocery gift cards for families. The Riley Park Farmers Market Donation Station is a place where community members and farmers donate money and produce for the food distribution program on a monthly basis.
