- · In the "Dad Finds Out" scene, Jackie's disapproval is shown by the short sharp dialogue, "You. Out. Now!".
- · When they are arguing, the guick cuts between their two faces raises the tension of the scene.
- Billy's angry facial expression represents his struggle to convince his father of his dream to do ballet.

- · Jackie's disapproval is a significant hardship that Billy must overcome.
- · Overcoming adversity develops Billy's determination to be successful.

- The photograph represents the shadow hanging over Billy's life because of the loss of his mother.

- The photograph sitting on top of the piano connects Billy's mother to music and creativity.
- · Billy's pursuit of ballet becomes a way for him to keep his mother's memory alive.
- At the beginning of the film, Billy's piano playing is out of tune and somewhat annoying.
- · Billy's poor piano playing is reflective of Billy's sadness and his dysfunctional family.
- · Billy's poor piano playing symbolises his inability to be who he truly is and his feelings of frustration and confinement.

- Their caring relationship is represented through their laughter.

- · Billy and Mrs Wilkinson's relationship shows the importance of compassion in connecting human beings.
- It also shows how successful people need others to help and support them.

- · Billy's rage is emphasised through the extreme close-up of his feet.
- · Billy's rage is emphasised through the quick cuts showing his aggressive dancing routine.
- When faced with his dad's disapproval, Billy dances in a defiant way.
- · This dance of defiance expresses his confidence.
- · This dance of defiance shows him dancing for his dad, standing tall and assertive.
- · The non-diegetic music is grand and loud.
- · The music represents Billy's newly gained self-belief and identity.
- The music represents Billy's determination to turn a difficult situation into a positive one.
- · As shown in these scenes, Billy's emotions are best expressed through dancing.
- · Creative expression can convey emotions that we find too difficult to talk about or say out loud.
