N.B.: All exhibits are open for Irish quilters to submit until the 15th April. We have extended this deadline due to the number of interested quilters who feel that our original deadlines were too close. This extension is open only to Irish quilters, as postage/shipping is much less of an issue. Therefore, this deadline is not on the website but is final. Also, quilt submission fees do not apply to anyone who can arrange for their quilt to be delivered and picked up at our Galway City offices.

The names and brief descriptions of each exhibit is as follows:

- 1. Cead Mile Failte our official "welcome" exhibit for our international guests, featuring hundreds of 10 inch "hand" blocks.
- 2. My Quilted Garden an indoor garden full of everything you'd expect to see in a wonderful garden and a few you wouldn't! entirely made from fabric.
- 3. Chocolate Decadence a selection of delicious chocolate-themed guilts and projects.
- 4. Antique Quilts of Ireland an exhibition of 18th and 19th century Irish antique quilts.
- 5. The Road Less Travelled quilts inspired by the famous Robert Frost poem, reflecting paths chosen both literally and metaphorically.
- 6. *Christmas* featuring quilts which celebrate that most special time of year, and a quilted ornament exchange.
- 7. *Irish Craft Quilts* a collection of Irish quilts which help display some of Ireland's other iconic crafts, such as knitting, crochet and lace-making.
- 8. *Traditional Miniatures* an exhibition designed to exhibit the extraordinary skill to create detailed patterns in such small dimensions.
- 9. Yin & Yang designed to illustrate the two sides of a quilter's brain both artistic and traditional.
