- 3) Four units of Musicology/Ethnomusicology to include MUS 233, 234, and two additional electives from the Musicology/Ethnomusicology courses, one of which must be 300+, and excluding MUS 100 and MUS 123.
- 4) Two units of Music electives to be chosen from: MUS 168/368 (0.5 unit max.), 250, 301, 335, 337, 341, 355, 390, 392, 393, 394, 437, or a 200+ level musicology/ethnomusicology course; a max. of 0.5 unit in applied lessons in a secondary instrument (to be approved by music faculty advisor).
- 5) Performance majors must register for Recital Attendance every semester they are in residence. (MUS 109 as freshmen and sophomores; MUS 309 as juniors and seniors).
- 6) Music majors must attain, maintain membership in, attend, and be registered for credit in the major university ensemble (Voice emphasis: Adelphian Concert Choir, Chorale, or Dorian Singers, as assigned) each semester they are enrolled.
- To advance to the junior year and graduate with a music major, a student must have a 2.3 overall GPA, a 2.5 music GPA, and demonstrate excellence in the jury of their major performance instrument in the spring of sophomore year. Students wishing to study abroad are encouraged to do so in the spring semester of their junior year.
