Step 1: Course Invite

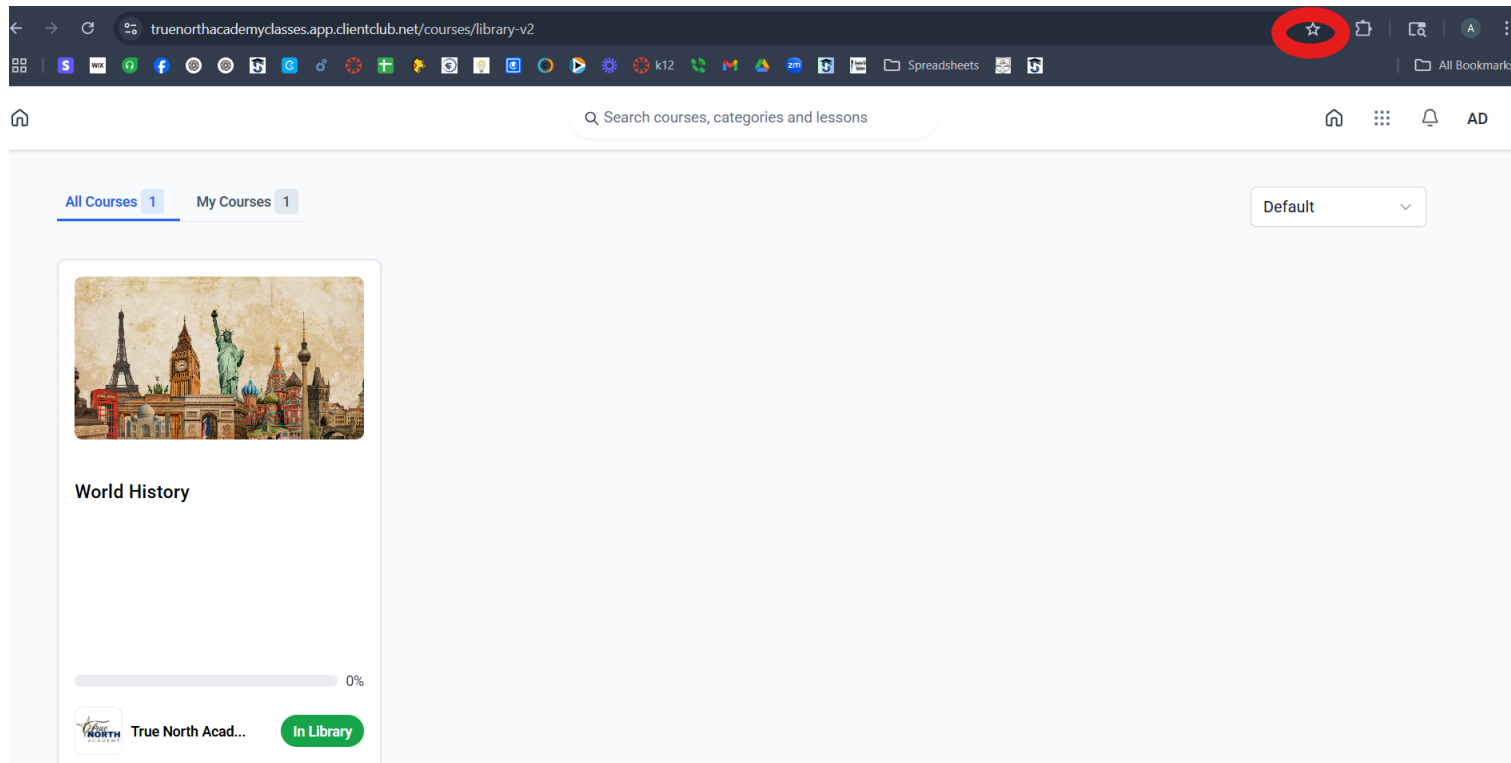

Once you click the invitation link:

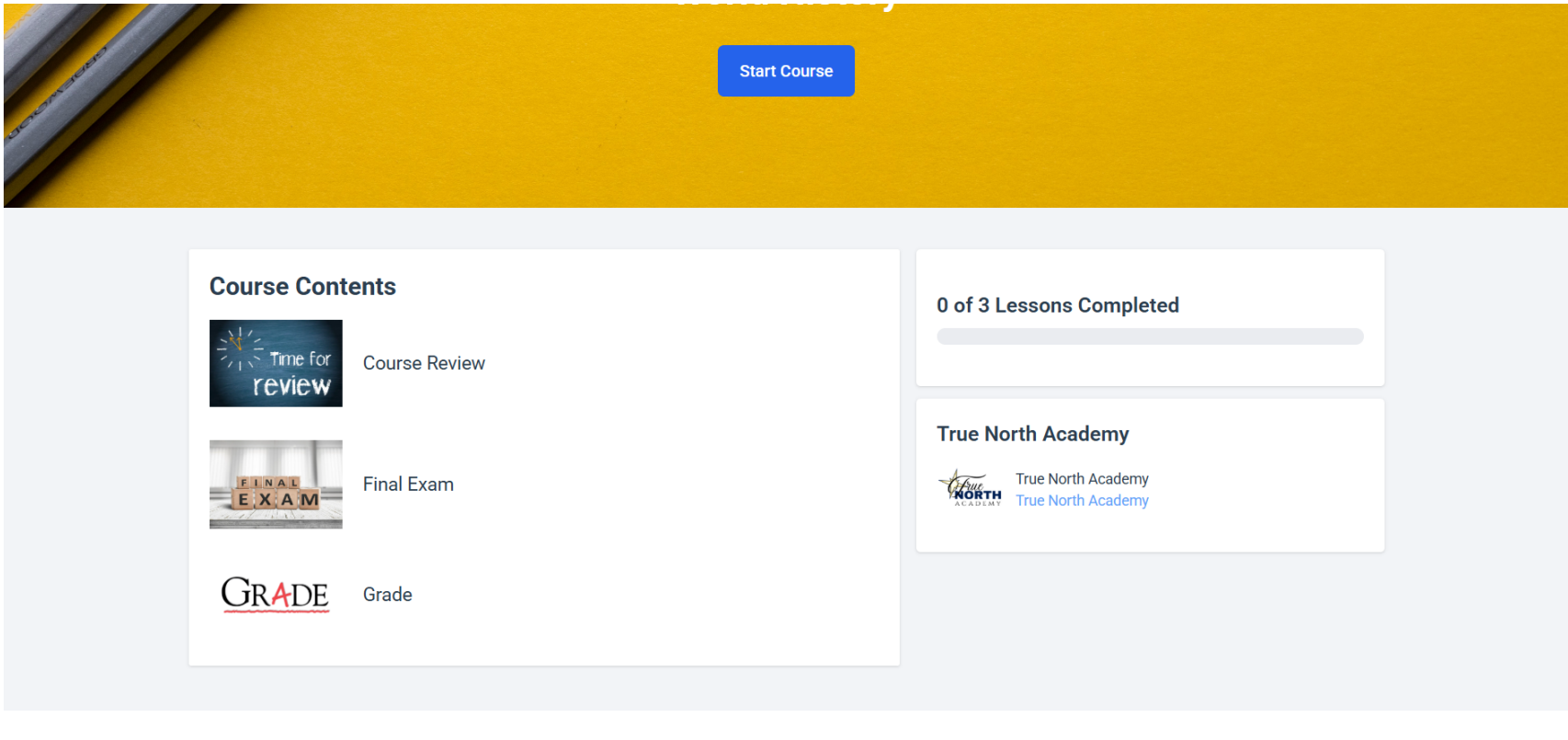
1. Click Login

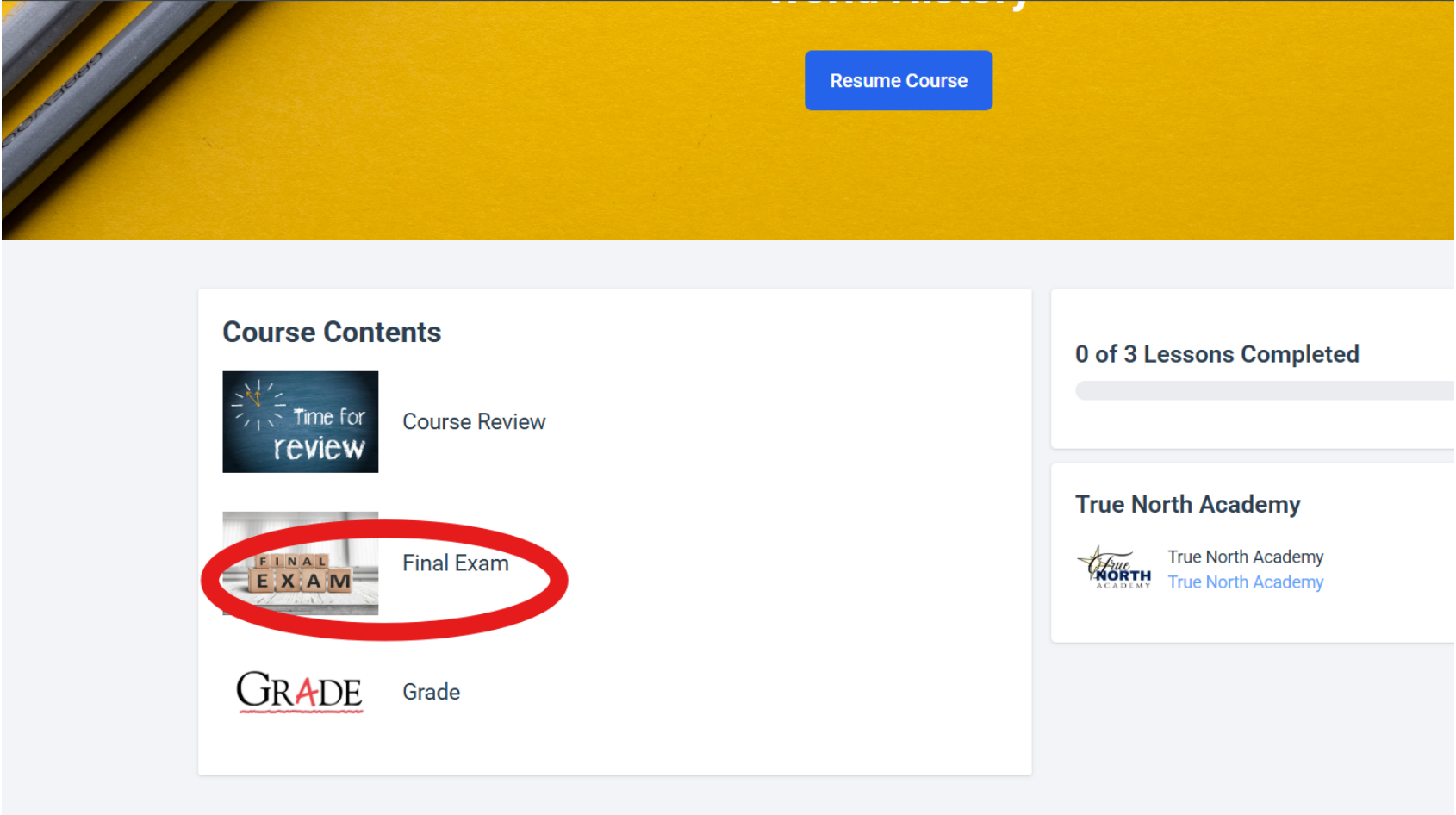

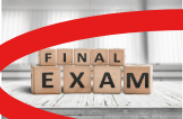

►► **Password.** Create a password.

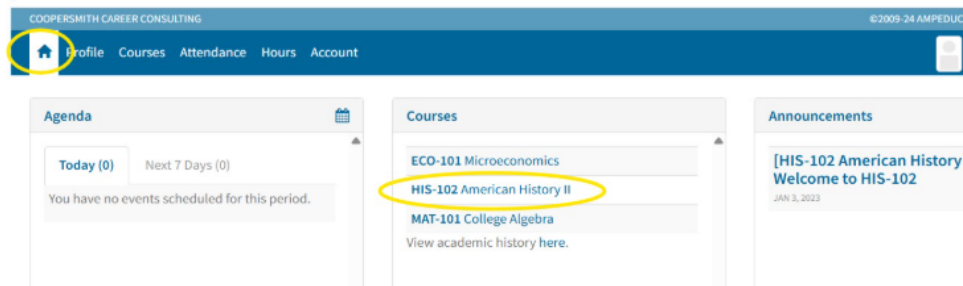
If you don’t have a Gmail account:

► **User Name.** This is your student email address.

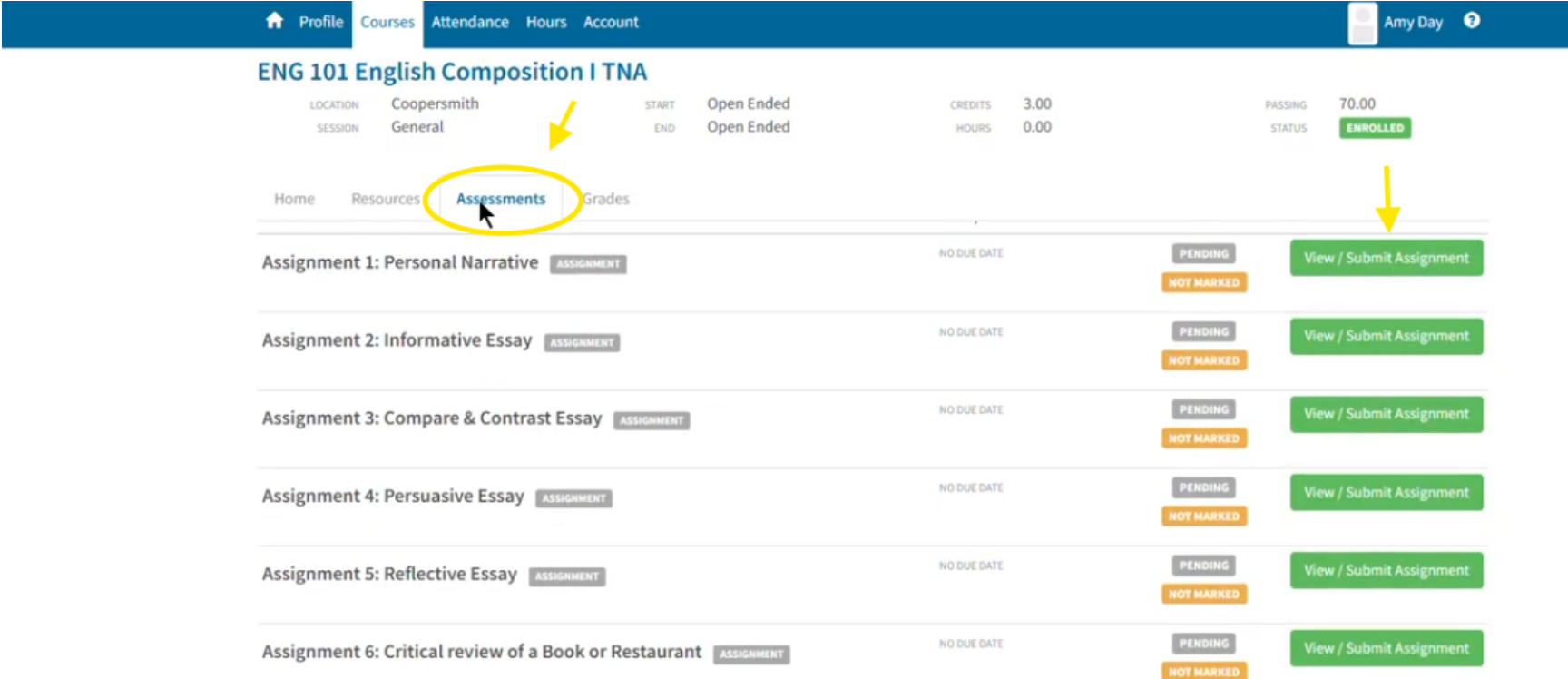

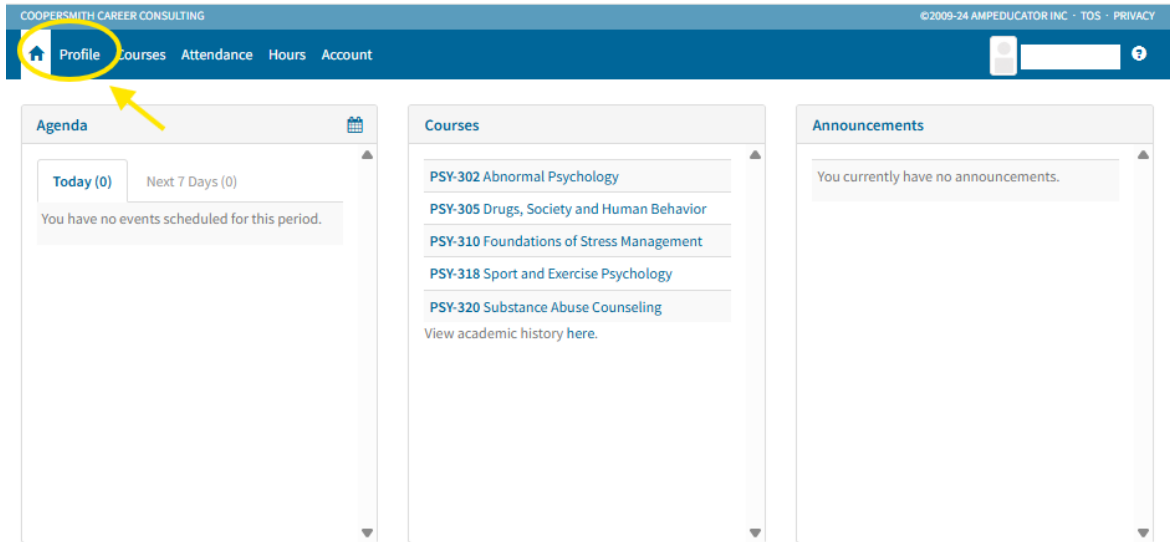

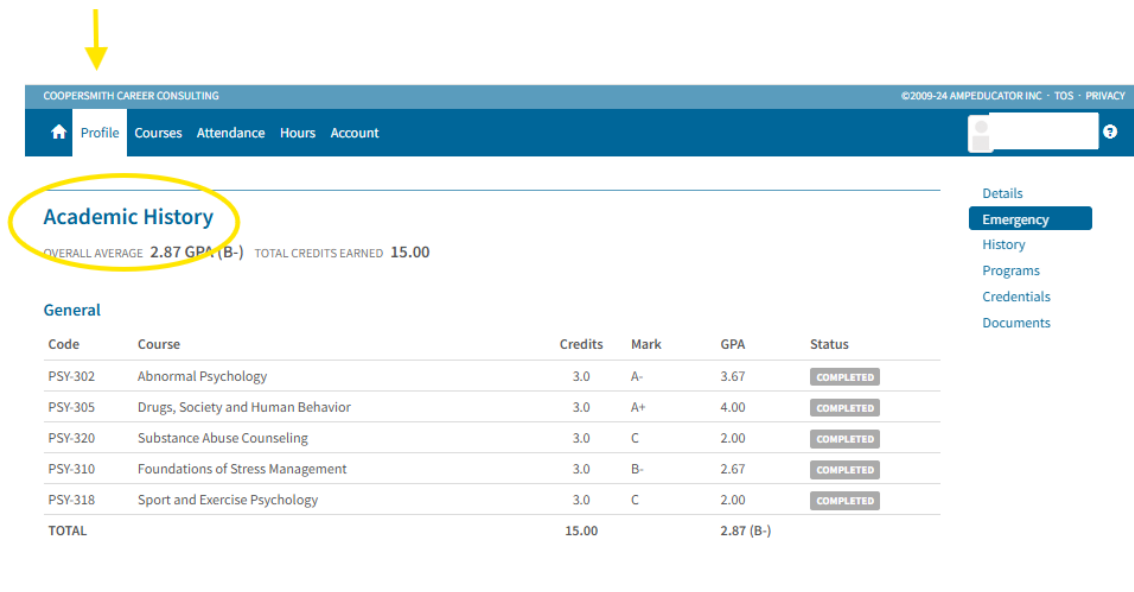
