Meeting Overview: ***Church Anew: Leading From the Emerging Future***

As a free, all-electronic gathering this year, we are offering a variety of events spaced out throughout the 6 days from Monday, June 7, through Saturday, June 12, 2021. Key events have been placed in the early evening time slot to offer all of your delegates the opportunity to attend.

Your Church Delegation

In addition to all ordained, commissioned, and licensed ministers, your church may send two or more lay delegates, according to the size of your church. The RMC Bylaws state:

“Every local church with standing in an association of the Conference shall be entitled to voting representatives in the Conference of two lay delegates, plus one additional lay delegate for each 200 members, or major fraction thereof above 200 members, provided that no church may thus be represented by more than seven lay delegates, of which one can be a youth (age 15-20 years.) The last annual Yearbook statistics will be the basis for computing the number of delegates.”

Alongside clergy and other lay delegates across the Conference, these delegates will comprise the voting body for our Annual Celebration and Business Meeting on Saturday, June 12, check in starting at 8:30AM. Visitors are also welcome at any of our events as long as they are registered in advance.

Delegation Pre-Work

Please also know, each delegate or visitor will need to have sufficient internet bandwidth and a device capable of holding a Zoom connection. We ask our church leaders to work with their delegates and visitors in advance of Annual Celebration to ensure your delegates are familiar with how to access Zoom. Although we will have technical support available throughout the Annual Celebration, we will not have the capacity to teach people how to access Zoom or use their device. Please work with your delegates and visitors ahead of time to ensure they have an exciting opportunity to connect into this Conference event.

A Call to Gather

While our business together is vital, in the Rocky Mountain Conference our Annual Celebration is also an opportunity to build relationships, laugh, worship, and experience Spirit with one another. We are striving to provide these same moments electronically, with optional contemplative spaces, casual get-togethers, and some educational moments sprinkled throughout the two weeks of gatherings. And, of course, we don't expect either you or your delegates to attend everything – but rather, partake of the banquet of opportunities the staff, the Board, and the Southeastern Association has prepared for you.

Keynote Speaker

Our keynote will be presented by **Valarie Kaur**, a civil rights activist, lawyer, award-winning filmmaker, founder of the Revolutionary Love Project, author of *See No Stranger: A Memoir and Manifesto of Revolutionary Love*, and Sikh American voice. We highly recommend reading *See No Stranger* prior to the keynote session.

All-Conference Worship

Worship opportunities will take place in a variety of ways this year. We will host 5 “Sanctuary Sessions” from 8:30-9:00AM, Monday through Friday. We will also ground our Saturday Business Meeting in worshipful practice and conclude with communion. We will offer some prerecorded materials that RMC churches may use on Sunday June 13.

Meeting Materials – 2021 Consent Agenda

An Educational Moment

Roberts' Rules of Order provides for the use of a Consent Agenda for the approval of routine items (which do not need discussion or debate) with one vote, thereby eliminating the need for individual motions and votes for each item.

At the beginning of the meeting where a consent agenda is used, the moderator will ask if there are items which the body wants removed from the consent agenda so they can be discussed individually. If any member requests that an item be removed from the consent agenda, it will be placed on the general agenda to be discussed individually.

When there are no more items to be removed, the moderator reads out the remaining consent items. Then the moderator states: "If there is no objection, these items will be adopted." After pausing for any objections, the moderator states "As there are no objections, these items are adopted." It is not necessary to ask for a show of hands.

The Rocky Mountain Conference Board of Directors proposes the following Consent Agenda for its 2021 Annual Meeting:

1. **Standing Rules** for the 2021 Annual Meeting (posted on website since March 1, 2021)
2. **2020 Annual Meeting Minutes** (posted on website since May 11, 2021)
3. **Grant Voice with Vote to new church starts:** Community Spirit UCC, Montrose, CO and OMO House, Denver, CO, Juniper Foundation Denver, CO
4. **Grant Voice without Vote to all guests**
5. **Approve RMC Bylaws changes that do not change the meaning** of how we share our ministries together: blue-highlighted changes (formatting) and green highlighted changes (grammar and consistency). The yellow-highlighted changes that change how we share our ministries together will be discussed and voted on during the meeting (posted on website since May 11, 2021)
6. Appointment of Tracey Dawson as **Parliamentarian**
7. Appointment of Mark Dutell as **Time Keeper**

Meeting Materials – Standing Rules

1. "Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised" shall be followed, unless otherwise ordered by the Conference Annual Celebration Business Meeting.
2. Matters deemed by the Moderator to be merely format, routine, and non-controversial may be disposed of by common consent. However, if there is objection, the chair will await a formal motion and submit the question to debate and vote.

3. Resolutions deemed not merely formal and non-controversial may be submitted by any voting delegate, congregation, association, commission, or committee of the Conference for action by the Annual Celebration Business Meeting. A resolution addresses the mission and/or teaching ministry of the Conference and its related bodies. As it relates to the Church's mission, the resolution should empower the Conference to act in new areas of responsibility. Further, it shall address the congregations, the denomination, or other bodies, regarding issues of nurture and justice from our Christian perspective. As it relates to the teaching ministry, the resolution should enhance members' knowledge of the Christian faith, improve the life of persons living in community, and help us make decisions as Christians in a secular world.
4. Resolution forms are available to the churches sixty (60) days prior to the Annual Celebration Business Meeting, at which time the due date is indicated. The Business Committee will receive resolutions and approve those to be circulated to the churches thirty (30) days prior to the Annual Celebration Business Meeting. A resolution similar to the one addressed at an Annual Celebration Business Meeting in the past five years may be referred to an appropriate committee and not considered by the Annual Celebration Business Meeting.
5. Each resolution submitted must contain the following wording: "THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the delegates of the 47th Annual Celebration of the Rocky Mountain Conference, June 7-13, 2021, online. Summary information accompanying a resolution shall address the following in addition to its titles: Purpose of proposed action, to whom it is addressed, expected results, who will implement or follow up, when and by whom is report back expected, anticipated costs and source of funds, and how this resolution impacts the Conference's mission and/or teaching ministry.
6. Resolutions received after the deadline may be referred to the Annual meeting if the Business Committee deems them to be of a significant and timely nature.
7. Procedure for resolutions will be the following: The presenter will have two (2) minutes to introduce a resolution. Six (6) persons will have one (1) minute each to speak alternating pro and con, at which time a vote will be taken to extend discussion or to vote on the resolution.
8. In considering a resolution, action is taken on the "Therefore, be it resolved..." section. Amendments may be made the "Therefore, be it resolved..." section of a resolution. (The "whereas" section is background information.)
9. Amendments must be presented in writing to the chair after they have been presented and seconded. Not more than one amendment will be considered at the same time. One wishing to offer an additional amendment should announce the intention to offer the further amendment after action is completed on the pending amendment.
10. To close debate, the proper motion is "I move the previous question" or "I move to close debate." The mover must gain recognition and the motion must be seconded. The motion

cannot be amended and requires a two-thirds vote for adoption. It will not suffice merely to call "Question" if there are still delegates who wish to speak.

11. Delegates shall state their names when they are recognized to speak. No speaker shall speak on the same issue more than once, except to answer question addressed to him/her from the floor. Except when rising to a point of order, or to second a motion, delegates may be requested to speak from a microphone.
12. The Moderator, with the assistance of the Parliamentarian, is charged with the duty of providing orderly disposition to the business of the Rocky Mountain Conference. Any ruling may be appealed by a delegate. The appeal requires a second. The majority vote by the delegates upon the appeal will prevail

Meeting Materials – Voting Membership

ARTICLE III VOTING MEMBERSHIP – RMC BYLAWS (Amended May 19, 1996)

Section 1: Every local church which is a certified member in an association of the Conference shall be entitled to voting representatives in the Conference by two lay delegates, plus one additional lay delegate for each 200 members, or major fraction thereof above 200 members, provided that no church may thus be represented by more than seven lay delegates of which one can be a youth (age 15-20 years). The last annual Year Book statistics will be the basis for computing the number of delegates. Delegates shall be elected or appointed by each church and, unless otherwise ordered by the church, shall serve for a term of one year or until their successors have been elected, except that a delegate's term of office shall terminate upon removal from membership in the local church. Each church may appoint or elect alternates which shall be designated by the church as voting delegates in the event any one or more of the regular delegates cannot be in attendance at the annual or special meetings. The recommendation is that no delegate be self-succeeding for more than three successive years and that, so far as possible, delegates should be representative of the church and reflective of the diversity of people within the organization.

Section 2: All persons holding ordained ministerial standing in an association of the Conference, and commissioned ministers, and licensed ministers who have been authorized for ministry by an association of the Conference shall be voting members at the annual or special meetings of the Conference.

Section 3: The members of the Board of Directors shall be voting members of the Conference during their terms of office.

Churches are welcome to send as many non-voting members as they like.

The membership figure reported to us as of December 31, 2020, will be used for the 2021 Annual Celebration Business Meeting.

For each church that did not submit a Yearbook report, the latest recorded membership figure will be used.

Conference Reports – Associate Conference Minister Report

JUNE 2020 – JUNE 2021

During the last year the Conference staff has been going through a major record retention project, sorting through all the boxes and files stored in the conference office and determining what needs to be saved, what can be recycled and what should be sent to an official archive. One of my tasks was to sort through old Association files. During one of my afternoons I came across a file containing the history of the merger between the Intermountain Conference and the Colorado Conference. At one point Montana and Southwest Conferences were involved in the conversation as well. There were notes of meetings outlining concerns and benefits, potential staffing structures, and associations boundaries, challenges of urban and rural areas, and the growing diversity of needs among congregations. These notes were taken in 1968. The Rocky Mountain Conference came into being 6 years later in 1974.

Two things struck me as I went through this file. One, it reminded me that change is constant. I tend to think of this current moment as one of “great change” and yet these kinds of historical documents remind me that the church has been and always will be shaping and reshaping itself with each new generation. Two, I was surprised by the similarity of the questions being asked between then and now. It made me wonder how often the changes we make are just rearranging the furniture. Yes its change, but to what end? Do we really end up with something new or are we just reconfigured?

14 months into a global pandemic and I find myself wondering if this moment will in fact reshape us anew or if we will carry on as we have been, just reconfigured to fit the online world. This is not to downplay the importance of going virtual. For the last year I have accompanied search committees, moderators, church councils, pastors, youth leaders, Committees on Ministry and colleagues in other conferences as we’ve figured out how to do ministry online, and I am awed by the capacity we’ve all shown to adapt to this technology. And most certainly our move online cannot be seen as just a temporary solution that got us through this particular time. It is part of the fabric now. But it is also cannot be seen as the ending point. The same realities that existed pre-COVID exist post-COVID. 30-40% of our churches are predicted to close in the next 15-20 years.

The churches and ministries that are thriving are not just using new technology, they are being deeply intentional about their why: Why do we exist? What are we here to do and be? What is the good that God is seeking to do in the world through us? They are asking what is the deepest need people have right now and what in our faith tradition can meet that need? And then they muster

up the bravery to *go do that new thing*.

I have seen pastors travel across the country to a new call sight unseen because they trusted the call of God in their lives.

I have seen our Associations wrestle faithfully and intentionally as they consider the possibility of joining together across Associations to carry out the work of authorization, oversight and accountability in an experimental Conference Wide COM.

I have seen our Board of Directors eagerly commit financial and human resources to help us dismantle racism within ourselves as individuals, churches, associations, and conference, as well create a process of supporting and funding new and innovative ministries across our conference.

I have seen bravery in every corner of our conference. It is my prayer that we continue to build this bravery muscle, that we heed Jesus's words, "Do not be afraid", that we let this moment continue to shape us into who God needs us to become, so together we can build more just world for all.

Conference Reports - Financial Associate's Report

My work as Financial Associate during the last year has been relatively routine. I continue to work with our consulting bookkeepers at Ellis Bottom Line Bookkeeping. The firm is a tremendous asset in our work. Just recently, I have assumed the responsibility for data entry into QuickBooks with Ellis performing monthly review of our accounting.

With approval via a vote at the Business Meeting of the Annual Celebration, RMC will have a new fiscal year: July 1st – June 30th, replacing the calendar year. One of the chief benefits of this change is that the budgeting process will occur much more closely to the period for which we are budgeting and will improve accuracy. The Church giving calendar, including 5 for 5, will still be on the calendar year since that is the time frame used by national UCC.

The Payroll Protection Program loan the Conference received in April 2020 is currently in the forgiveness approval process, and we feel confident that it will qualify for forgiveness. This loan helped ease the bumps on a rough road last year and shore up the RMC's financial position.

RMC churches are generous in their donations to the Conference. Two offerings which directly support the RMC are OCWM (Our Church's Wider Mission) and Per Capita (dues). In 2020, the

Conference retained 82% of OCWM, or \$287,561. Per Capita funds stay 100% in the Conference, \$98,108 last year.

Thanks to you all for allowing me to be a part of the RMC.
