Now that most of your college applications are in, it is now time to begin (or continue) the next chapter of your college planning process. Here are a few tips to help you along.

- 1. Remember to fill out the FAFSA at <a href="www.fafsa.ed.gov">www.fafsa.ed.gov</a> as soon as possible. This is a free service. The FAFSA will determine how much money you are eligible for during your first year of college. Money can come in three forms: grants, scholarships, and work study. The FAFSA may influence your decision on which college you will attend. Some sites claim that you must pay to fill out the FAFSA...THIS IS NOT TRUE! Make sure to visit the government website.
- 2. There are many new scholarships listed in this bulletin, and I am often posting scholarships on your class of 2021 Google page. Highlight those you qualify for and are most interested in. Pay attention to due dates. Make sure to ask for letters of recommendation well in advance. Most importantly, work smarter, not harder! Refer to your senior essay and other written pieces that you can incorporate in these applications, altering them to fit the specific topic. Come see your counselors with questions you may have about scholarships. Also, make sure you are looking into scholarship opportunities at the university you may attend next year.
- 3. Continue to bring in or email us your college acceptances and scholarship offers! Mrs. Lettich, Ms. Triplet, and I love sharing your great news in this bulletin! Please see us with any questions you may have.

Keep up the good work, seniors! If you feel like you need extra help with anything at all, please reach out to your counselor. If you are experiencing any special circumstances due to the pandemic that may be impacting your postsecondary plans, please let us know so we can help you make a plan.
