Rule 21 – *All*, written alone, has two *l*'s, but when it is written with another syllable, only one *l* is written (*al so*, *al most*). (always)

Rule 20 – The letter *s* almost never follows *x*. The phonogram *x* includes an *s* sound (*ks*). (expect)

Rule 29 – Words are usually divided between double consonants within a base word. (dollar)

e Job 2 – The silent final *e* must be there because English words do not end in *v*. (live)

e Job 5 – The silent final *e* does not have a job. (something)

e Job 1 – The silent final *e* makes the vowel say its second sound. (fare)

e Job 1 – The silent final *e* makes the vowel say its second sound. (broke)

e Job 1 – The silent final *e* makes the vowel say its second sound. (sure)
