Local Awards for Graduation

A. Automatic Awards

You do not need to apply for these awards. Awards are given at the Awards Ceremony.

1. Academic Proficiency Awards for 30-Level Subjects

- \$250.00 each
- Given in Math, History, English, Physics, Biology, Chemistry, and Work Experience (2)
- Must have been a student at CRVS for at least two years
- Must have taken the subject at each level available in Division IV
- Must have the current highest average in the subject

2. Carrot River Young Women's Club Scholarship

- \$500.00
- Presented to the female graduate with the highest graduation average
- Must be going on to post-secondary education

3. Dean Anderson Memorial Lions Club Scholarship

- \$500.00
- Presented to the male graduate with the highest graduation average
- Must be going on to post-secondary education

4. Town of Carrot River Citizenship Scholarship - **This scholarship was discontinued by the Town in 2022.**

- \$500.00
- Must have taken their entire Gr. 12 year at CRVS
- Must have made a meaningful contribution to the school (Student government, yearbook, drama, volunteer work, etc.)
- Must have participated in some school or community event.
- Must be courteous, sportsmanlike, and receptive to discipline.
- Must enjoy a sound reputation with classmates, teachers, and community.
- Must be in the top 60% of their class, academically.
- The selection Committee shall be composed of the Administrators of CRVS and the Guidance Counselor, in consultation with the Div. IV Staff.

5. Frecon Future Educator Award

- \$500.00
- Students must go on to pursue a career in the Teaching Field
- Names will be put forward to the Frecon's for the final selection.

6. Bertha Gowen Memorial Performing Arts Scholarship - Not applicable 2025

- \$200.00
- Criteria: Student must have an 80 % average in core subjects, participated in all aspects of Team Drama: Acting, stage management, and set design. The recipient must show a strong commitment to the performing arts and Team Drama. Acceptance in a post-secondary institution is a requirement.
- Recipients will be chosen at the discretion of the Principal/Artistic Director.
- This award will be given out at Graduation.
- Must be going on to post-secondary.

7. Scholarship in Honour of Carter Stevenson

- \$500 sponsored by Norman and Shelley Enns
- Recipient will possess a “never give up” attitude and will be viewed as a kind, thoughtful individual.
- Most great achievements are unknown to others - private overcoming and silent attempts at belief. The real path of a champion lies within - the transforming of suffering into expansion, the building of a healthy self-concept without tools. The greatest achievers have found a way to believe in something good. No matter what else they accomplish in their lives, they are already champions. As Carter stated, “stuff happens, but no matter what, you just got to deal with it”.

8. Allan and Sherry Gerwing Community Leadership Award (created June 2022)

- The children of Allan and Sherry Gerwing have created this \$500 award in recognition of the vast impact their parents have had in the communities of Arborfield, Zenon Park and Carrot River, and to encourage community involvement, athletic achievement, and academic excellence.
- Criteria:
 - Any graduating student at Carrot River Valley School may be eligible to receive this scholarship if they meet the following criteria and are attending post-secondary in the fall. The scholarship will only be placed in trust if the reason for a gap year(s) is related to sport, such as SJHL involvement.
 - Academics: Must maintain a grade 12 average of over 85%.
 - Athletics: Must currently (grade 12 year) represent their community in 3 or more organized sports/activities. This includes non-school sports/activities like hockey, baseball, lacrosse, gymnastics, dance, etc. Graduates do not need to play in their local communities to represent their communities, as we encourage student athletes to pursue more competitive/practical opportunities.
 - Community Involvement: Must give back to their school/community in a substantial way. This includes, but is not limited to a significant role on SRC/Student Council (or less formal leadership role in the school), helping coach youth sport, volunteering at community events or helping organize community events such as hockey/ball tournaments, football games, church/youth nights, after school programs, Pasquia Park Clean-Up, etc.
 - Selection Process: Selection by Principal/Athletic Director of Carrot River Valley School. An emphasis should be placed on who is the highest achieving student, athlete, and leader in the school/community, as defined by how they respond to coaching and direction, compared to natural academic or athletic ability.

Please Note: To claim this scholarship, the recipient must provide verification of enrolment to their post-secondary school of choice, to the Carrot River Valley School administration. CRVS will then forward the necessary information to the North East School Division accounting department to process and forward the award money directly to the scholarship recipient’s current mailing address at that time.
