Background & Context

Palm oil cooperatives in Indonesia play a critical role in securing smallholder livelihoods and sustaining upstream supply, yet many continue to face structural challenges in accessing stable markets, securing competitive prices, and meeting evolving sustainability requirements. In Central Kalimantan, smallholder-based cooperatives such as Koperasi Produsen Sawit Mandiri Jaya (KSMJ) operate within a highly competitive environment where Fresh Fruit Bunch (FFB) supply is contested by multiple mills and traders, while downstream buyers increasingly demand reliability, traceability, and compliance with RSPO and ISPO standards. These conditions place pressure on cooperatives to strengthen their market positioning and improve their readiness for downstream integration.

Under the PalmStep Project, Agriterra is supporting KSMJ to enhance its capacity to access and maintain markets through improved value chain integration, including the development of a cooperative-owned Crude Palm Oil (CPO) mill in Kotawaringin Barat. To ensure the technical, financial, and operational viability of this investment, a comprehensive market and value chain assessment has been designed to analyse FFB supply availability and farmer loyalty, mill competition, pricing and logistics structures, CPO buyer requirements, and sustainability expectations at both district and provincial levels. The assessment is intended to generate evidence-based insights that will inform strategic decision-making by KSMJ, Agriterra, and potential partners.

Currently, Agriterra is finalizing the market and value chain assessment design. Given the importance of this assessment, Agriterra intends to engage an experienced consultant to coordinate the data collection phase, including surveys, in-depth interviews, and focus group discussions, and to ensure proper data management and readiness for analysis.

Objectives of the assignment

The experienced consultant is intended to coordinate and oversee the data collection phase of the market and value chain assessment. This includes supervising his/her team as enumerators and field researchers to conduct surveys, in-depth interviews, and focus group discussions; ensuring adherence to data collection protocols and data quality standards; and managing and organizing the collected data to ensure readiness for analysis.

Scope of work and key tasks

The consultant will be responsible for coordinating and overseeing the implementation of the following data collection activities:

Data Collection Scope

- Quantitative survey: approximately 430 respondents (Farmers member of Cooperative and Farmer non member)
- In-depth interviews: approximately 40 interviews
- Focus group discussion (FGD): 3 session

Key Tasks

1. Recruit and contract enumerators for quantitative surveys and field researchers/interviewers for qualitative data collection.
2. Train enumerators and field researchers on data collection tools, protocols, ethical considerations, and quality standards.
3. Coordinate and supervise the implementation of surveys, in-depth interviews, and the focus group discussion.
4. Ensure timely data entry for survey data and accurate transcription of qualitative interviews and FGD discussions.
5. Conduct data cleaning and quality checks to ensure datasets are complete and ready for analysis.

 - **Context:**
 - PALMSTEP will be implemented to ensure that the palm oil value chain in Kotawaringin Barat District, Central Kalimantan, Indonesia is sustainable and traceable.
 - The project aims to improve the environmental, social, and economic sustainability and the traceability of palm oil production which plays a significant role in Indonesia's economy. This is crucial to ensure that it will not contribute to deforestation, is produced in a responsible manner, and provides a stable livelihood to smallholder farmers.
