What is the Kennedy Choir Booster Club?

The Kennedy Choir Booster Club (KCBI) is a parent-run organization serving two major functions:

- Take place the 2nd Thursday of the month starting in September and last about 1 hour.
- Attendance is not required but strongly encouraged.
- We need help throughout the year with events and fundraising opportunities.

Infinite Campus (Show Choir Fees for the District)

Kennedy Choir fees are billed and paid through Infinite Campus. During the first half of July, a charge of \$975.00 will be placed in your student's account. Please pay this fee in full by February 1st, 2026. You may pay online in Infinite Campus or by delivering cash or check to Lori Esser in the Kennedy Activities Office.

Student Account

Every student has a *Presto Assistant* account set up by the choir's administrative assistant, Jenny Taffe, to help record payments that are made. The only charges that will be made in *Presto Assistant* will be the required fundraisers for the booster club. After a fundraiser occurs (Car Wash, Pancake Breakfast, Preview Show Tickets, etc.), your student's account will reflect the money raised based on their participation.

If a student *does not* turn in ticket money by the deadline, a charge for the full amount will be put into the student's *Presto Assistant* account.

OPTIONAL FUNDRAISER MONEY stored in *Presto Assistant*

Your student's *Presto Assistant* account will also hold all optional fundraising money. When the Boosters receive proceeds from an optional fundraiser (concessions, Droolin' Moose, etc.), you or your student can request to move those funds to Infinite Campus to pay toward the \$975 Show Choir Fee by emailing Gayle Erickson to facilitate the transfer. Gayle's email is gerickson1@isd271.org.

Why two systems for payment?

We need to keep the show choir fee separate from the booster fundraisers, as the money is used for different purposes in the program.

Costs include: costumes, jackets, musical arrangements, competition fees, hotel, transportation, Directors' fees, choreography, etc.

Costs DON'T include: personal undergarments, make-up, and hair products. Also, participants must purchase their own food at competitions and outside food is often not allowed (unless there are dietary restrictions). Host schools make money through concessions.

Scholarship Requests: Questions regarding scholarships or setting up alternative payment schedules should be sent to the choir director. Scholarship requests require the completion of an application that is available from the choir director. Scholarships are need-based and available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Bloomington Kennedy Activities Foundation (BKAF) Scholarships: Families who are experiencing current or anticipated financial difficulties in covering the cost of an activity or sport are encouraged to apply for a BKAF scholarship. Information can be found at bkafmn.org.





Fundraising

We have 2 different kinds of fundraising opportunities: Group and Individual.

- Group fundraising opportunities benefit all members of the Show Choir.
- Individual fundraising benefits the individual show choir student.

We offer these fundraisers to help lower the out-of-pocket cost for participating in Show Choir. Look for emails/communications with important dates and opportunities.

There are 5 REQUIRED Fundraiser events:

Parents' Guide to Show Choir

What is Show Choir?

Show choir is a competitive form of entertainment combining song, dance, bands and creativity. Kennedy will have one auditioned show choir for the 2025-2026 season: *Rhythm in Gold is a Varsity choir of mixed voices from grades 9-12. Auditions take place in May.*

The Band

The show choir is backed by its own student band. The band rehearses, travels, and performs along with the choir. Each show choir competition has a separate award for Best Band and Kennedy bands have consistently been top-rated and will compete, when eligible.

The Crew

The show choir also has a crew that assists with the costumes and ensures that props are ready. Crew members travel to all competitions. Awards are also given to the Best Crew for working behind the scenes, which Kennedy has won. The Crew is an integral part of the performance.

The Season

The show choir competition season runs from January through late March or early April but the work for a show choir occurs all year.

Choreography Retreats: Our choreographer, Kevin Chase, lives in Iowa so rehearsals with him usually involve 3-5 days of intense and demanding work. Attendance at these rehearsals is *mandatory* and students are expected to make EVERY EFFORT to attend. Any conflict must be discussed with a director in advance. Students must bring a water bottle to retreats along with a healthy snack. The Booster Club usually provides a meal for the kids during retreat weekends. What to wear during retreats: Students should wear comfortable workout clothes and sneakers.

Rehearsals: Rehearsals involve vocal singing, dancing and breathing practices. They are intense, invigorating, and fun.

Preseason: Mondays 5:30-7:30 pm

In-Season: Mondays 3-5:00 pm, Tuesdays 3-5:00 pm, Thursdays 3-6:00 pm Mandatory

Concerts:

Holiday Show: RIG and Band will perform a fun holiday set with choreography. RIG Annual: Soloists, small-group numbers, and full choirs will perform. RIG will also do their competition set for the final time. It's an emotional performance for our seniors.

Costumes

The cost of your student's costumes is included in the show choir fees. Costume measurements are taken in early June to allow for custom costume ordering. Costumes are selected by the directors, the costume designers, and the choreographer. Students are responsible for maintaining their costumes. Students must make sure they have all required pieces before and after a competition. All costume items will be returned and checked-in after RIG Annual.

Notify Mrs. Jordan and Mama Bryan immediately if any sewing or repairs are needed. This is not uncommon. DO NOT cut loose threads on sequined or beaded dresses without asking Mama Bryan.

Parents' Guide to Show Choir, Continued

Hair and Make-up

Stage presence is very important in show choir and that includes makeup and hair. In coordination with Kevin Chase, Ms. Jordan will determine what make-up pallet will be worn. This may include lipstick, blush, eye shadow, lip liner and eyeliner. These items will be purchased prior to the first competition. The hairstyle is selected as the group attempts to achieve an overall look and how to curl (or straighten) their hair.

Competition Etiquette

Competitions generally start between 8-9 am, with choirs performing every 30 minutes. Doors open to spectators only between the choir sets. Competition times CAN change so come early! RIG, band, and crew travel together. The days are long but oh so much fun!

Smaller schools and unisex/prep/junior varsity groups will perform earlier and larger schools and mixed/varsity groups perform later. The results from the preliminary performances will be announced before the dinner break. The top choirs will then perform THE SAME SET in the evening Finals competition. The top 6 performers in the evening finals competition are generally varsity groups, but some competitions allow the highest ranking JV group to compete in the finals.

The first 3 rows of seats in the auditorium are reserved for parents and fans of the choir on stage. Clapping and cheering are strongly encouraged during the performance, except during ballads when appreciation is demonstrated by "jazz hands." At the end of your school's set, you are expected to vacate these rows for the next school's fans.

ALWAYS be polite and respectful to the other choirs while in the audience, while walking around, or wherever you are. Kennedy students and families have good rapport with other groups, and we want to continue that tradition.

Food and snacks are available at all competitions. Students should plan to purchase food there since outside food is typically not allowed (unless someone has dietary restrictions).
