## • Approval of the March Minutes

#### • PTA Board Nominations Committee

Corita notes that the committee is looking for candidates for next year's Board of Directors and she notes that the terms are only 1 year. There are two Board members returning, which will leave three slots open. The Committee is especially interested in parents of younger children, which will mean they can remain involved for longer and offer continuity of services.

# • Principal's Report

Joel Nelson, Principal

- o Principal Nelson thanks the PTA for all of its support and confirms it would be nice to have continuity
- There has been several field trips, including to the Greenbelt Theatre and to a local farm. Mr. Nelson hopes that the school can get back up to a full regular schedule of field trips next year.
- o The MCAP testing has begun for 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> graders. The schools' full focus is on that right now. In early to mid-May an email notification will go our about end-of-the-year celebrations that are being planned.
- Recorded presentation from Mr. Nelson about the results of the Maryland Schools Report Card for the 2021-2022 school year.

Q: Alex Barnes: Can you talk more about the enrichment programs being offered at the school?

A: There are after-school enrichment programs of all types, Mr. Nelson notes. Testing coordinator Ms. Jasmine Giddings states that there are specialized strategies being implemented for TAG students. Ms. Abuelito states that special interest projects are offered to the children to help them refine research skills.

Q: Alex Barnes: But how do these help improve the Report Card scores?

As: Kristen Hodge-Clark talks about programs her child has benefitted from, including Book Nook tutoring, which was advertised through teacher newsletters. She says she has also gained support for extra help by reaching out to teachers directly. Ms. Giddings also states that TAG students are supported in preparing for state testing.

Q/C: Brooke Kenny encourages all parents to look up the school's report card scores and consider the results. Some of the most concerning statistics are that only 20 percent of GES students are proficient in math and when you break that down further, only 12 percent of black or African American students are proficient in mathematics. It seems concerning and that there are a few options available for students to get help, but she would like to know more about whether the school is concerned about this or has a plan to address it.

A: Ms. Giddings states that the school has been intentional about skill building and about identifying where weaknesses are. The low test scores are also a district-wide issue, not just a GES issue. Mr. Nelson points out that it's important to put this all in perspective. He states that the school has work to do but that it has made a lot of progress this year and that it is excited to show its growth.
