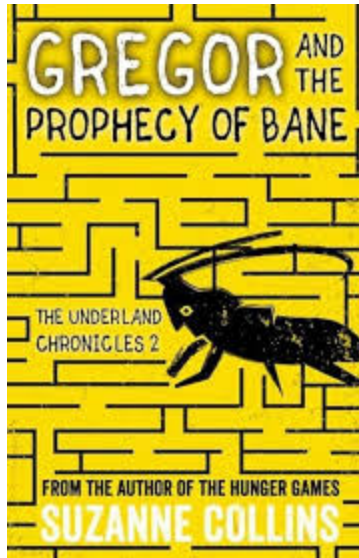




Book two
