Accessibility plan - Carcroft School

At Carcroft School we aim to ensure that school is a welcoming place that understands and responds effectively to children and adults with disabilities. It is our intention to remove, as far as we can, any barriers which make it hard for some children and adults to take part in the day to day life of our school. Our number one priority is to provide a stimulating learning environment where children and adults feel welcome, safe and valued.

The following adaptations are available to meet the needs of individuals where required:

- Wheelchair access
- Wide doors and hallways which are in line with building regulations
- Disabled toilets for staff, pupils and visitors
- Disabled parking spaces in the staff and visitors car park
- Clear visual signage in and around the school buildings and grounds
- Audio visual equipment in the main school hall and a sound system to support the hearing impaired.
- A physical environment which is safe, welcoming and stimulating
