Points discussed in another committee (brought up here by Jan Odijk) as being goals for CSC, copied for last year or so, to be made more specific/realistic:

- 1. Start migration from the current lists of standards to a new system, eventually the Standards Information System
- 2. Make an overview, by means of questionnaire, of areas of

specialization of CLARIN researchers, so as to provide help to CLARIN researchers in matters requiring expertise in standards

- 3. Implement a new facility for regulating the assignment of XML namespaces based on the clarin.eu domain and, if accepted, process the individual requests
- 4. Liaise with the Centre Committee on the implementation of the above points
- 5. Continue the individual members' involvement in standards bodies and report on that to the BoD and the NCF
- 6. Continue work on interoperability, e.g., the unification of MIME type use across centres
- 7. Reply to individual standards related queries from CLARIN researchers

CQP mentioned (by Jan Odijk) as highly relevant especially for federated search (but missing from some list of standards)

Making overviews of standards belongs to standards committee rather than interoperability committee (back and forth between Jan and Daan) [suppose Piotr's white paper on text standards is a good start]

(**Agenda point 7.2**) Interoperability committee -- two tasks:

- Prepare website containing recommendations for developers, centres, national coordinators on interoperability issues
- First special focus on parliamentary data (there will be a workshop; goal is to develop a proposed format for parliamentary texts which should be applied by projects working in this field)

Re "white paper" on text formats, distinction between "text as a format" and "text as a genre" needs made [I thought the paper is clearly about the latter but maybe not, then]

Piotr will set up the paper so that others can comment in Google docs (when logged in). Others please comment.

Discussion about calling some formats "deprecated" - not considered a successful label? What do we want to say instead? ("current", "outdated" are ok; "emerging" must not be "deprecated" - maybe "under assessment"?) (There was a separate category for "discouraged" so maybe there is no need to deprecate things in addition to that.) → categories should reflect the steps of the standards lifecycle

We should focus on getting this document into a public form. Do the work. Somehow. And find out which centers support different formats and <u>what tooling they can provide</u>. Maybe the latter task is for interoperability committee?

Further workflow:

- People comment on document
- Regular VCs to discuss comments → have regular meetings to keep the work going

Agenda point 5

Piotr and Hanna will take part in the CLARIN Bazaar with the topic of asking B centre representatives about what standards they use/accept/deliver → people should be naming the standards or contact persons to address with an e-mail asking for information on this; Standards Committee members are asked to support this initiative by coming by the stand themselves or sending a delegate
