TEST DETAILS

Fast Bridge aMath & aReading (local choice test)

FastBridge aReading and aMath assessments combine Computer-Adaptive Tests for universal screening to measure student achievement and highly sensitive Curriculum-Based Measures for progress monitoring to quickly deliver accurate, actionable data and reports to inform instruction and guide interventions.

MCA (state-required test)

The Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs) are the state tests that help districts measure student progress toward Minnesota's academic standards and meet the requirements of ESSA. The reading and mathematics tests are used to determine whether schools and districts have made adequate yearly progress (AYP) toward all students being proficient. Reading and mathematics tests are given in grades 3-8, 10 and 11. Science tests are given in grades 5 and 8 and once in high school, depending on when students complete their life sciences curriculum.

ACT (federal choice test)

The ACT is a test published and administered by the American College Testing Service. It measures a student's aptitude in English, math, reading, and scientific reasoning plus writing. We recommend students who plan to enroll in a four-year college take the ACT at the end of their junior year. The ACT is offered on campus as part of the legislation. Juniors can register and take the test at Wolf Creek, free of charge if they have completed an Educational Benefits form.
