## Tasks:

Please comment on a slide with a <u>different topic</u> than your own slide. How to comment? Right click on the slide you want to comment on, or go to the "insert" menu at the top of the slideshow.

## **Criteria for Success:**

- Your topic is one of the specific mental disorders (DSM diagnoses) that are encountered in the criminal justice system, which we have learned about in Chapter 2 of the text.
- I have assigned **groups of disorders** by **last name**; you should choose one of the **specific diagnoses** discussed in the text or my lecture in your assigned
