# Help Yousef escape Gaza and treat his cancer (GoFundMe)

• I'm Youseff Abu Saeed, a photojournalist from Gaza. I'm suffering from Cancer and began treatment with chemotherapy doses just one month before the war. My house was bombed and my dreams were destroyed. I started running alone

from one place to another, with nothing left. I'm now fighting a disease without a cure. The only hospital that provides treatment for cancer patients in Gaza has been bombed. I have not received treatment for more than 100 days. I'm so tired. I can't keep pretending to be strong. My recovery rate would have been 95% if I continued the treatment, and now, after more than 100 days without treatment, I can't imagine that if the recovery rate is still high or not and the response to treatment will be like before the war. I want to live a healthy and a normal life like you.

# Gaza: Help my family afford emergency surgeries (GoFundMe)

- My name is Nouran, but you might know me online as Noury. Before the war, my twitter account, @Noony\_Boony, was a quiet corner of my life where I could talk about and make fanart for my favourite anime with friends online. Things have changed... to call the last four months of my life in Gaza a nightmare would be putting it far too lightly. My family and I have been stripped of every basic human right imaginable... we have watched our dreams, our health, our futures, and our lives wither away as we hear a constant barrage of rockets raining around us, not knowing if each one will be our last.
- - My brother lost his right eye and ear, and suffered a skull fracture. Shrapnel has destroyed his right ear canal, and he's completely deaf on that side. After nearly a month, he underwent eye enucleation surgery (where the eyeball is removed) to prevent further damage and infection.
- I lost my right eye as well, and last week I got the same surgery as my brother. I also suffered major soft tissue trauma to my forehead and scalp. Twenty days after we arrived to the hospital, I was finally able to get X-rays done (posted above) which revealed fractures to my clavicle, my left hand (meaning I can no longer draw), and shrapnel/debris in my nasal cavity (which has recently thankfully been surgically removed). The bones have begun to heal in the wrong places due to delayed treatment and thus need more intensive surgeries to be fixed. My right thumb has been paralyzed and needs physical therapy, meaning I can't really use either of my hands. Finally, I was left with a large open wound on my cheek for weeks which meant that I couldn't drink water without some of it spilling out through the hole.
- - My dad has completely lost his right calf muscle and can no longer walk without support. He can't get surgery to transplant tissue from

- other parts of his body to his calf right now because there are no doctors here that know how to give epidural anaesthesia.
- - My mom has an untreated broken jaw and can no longer eat solid food. In the time since she was injured, she has lost over 14kg.

# Save Abdulaziz: Urgent Surgery Fund for Child (GoFundme)

# <u>Ahmed Fundraiser by Husham Hantoush : Help Sudan Tarada</u> <u>Initiative (25p) مبادرة طرادة (GoFundMe)</u>

- My name is Husham Hantoush, I'm a Sudanese living in Canada, Milton. I'm helping my people back home who fled the war and now sheltering in Sinnar (a city south Khartoum), where 14 schools are turned into shelters to host displaced people.
- They lost everything and the are in dire need for any little thing.
- We are helping with basic needs, food and basic medicine. some of them had to walk for days and many died in the way.
- My aim is to deliver emergency basic needs, food and medicine.
- Funds will be transferred directly to local charities and organisations who are managing those shelters to make sure that the funds are well received and are spent on the needs specified.

# <u>Urgent Appeal for Humanitarian Aid: A Gazan Child</u> (GoFundme)

- Hi everyone, my name is Salah El-Din, a 22-year-old medical student in Egypt .Today, I will open the door to the story of my youngest brother, Adam, a tale I shall weave with brevity.
- Adham Abdel Rahim Saleh, or "Adhoom" to his loved ones, was a child who had not yet turned ten. Despite his young age, he had already faced more challenges than most adults. He witnessed three wars, and twice narrowly escaped death. Despite these hardships, Adhoom never lost hope. He remained a resilient and optimistic child, proving to everyone around him that life is stronger than bullets and that hope can persevere even in the face of the fiercest storms.
- Adhoom was born in Jabalia refugee camp in 2014, amidst a fierce war that lasted 52 days, a war that took away his grandmother and uncles, leaving a deep scar on the family's soul. On August 7, 2022, his birthday, Adhoom faced his tragic fate. He suffered a severe head injury during a new war, a war that almost took his life, but miraculously he survived. His skull was damaged and fractured, leading him to spend a whole month in the hospital, away from school desks and childhood

- dreams. Afterward, he embarked on a long and arduous journey of treatment.
- saga of pain did not cease at this juncture; rather, it intensified during the latest war. On October 10, the family home was directly targeted while they were inside, resulting in the martyrdom of his elder brother, "Mohammed," and severe injuries to the rest of the family members. Among them, Adhoom sustained a new, more severe head injury than before. His left eye was critically damaged, and he suffered fractures to the skull, as well as injuries to the liver and abdomen, leaving a fresh scar on his tender body.
- Despite enduring such harrowing experiences, Adhoom did not lose faith in life nor did he abandon his dreams. He still enjoys playing with his friends and aspires to become a doctor when he grows up. Adhoom's story epitomizes resilience and defiance, the tale of a child who defied death twice and confronted harsh circumstances, proving to the world that hope never fades and that life prevails over everything else.
- The tragedy did not only befall Adhoom, but also extended to his fourteen-year-old sister, Fatima. She suffered a severe leg fracture, necessitating a surgical procedure involving the use of plates. While the operation was successful, Fatima's mental state deteriorated day by day after the injury and the loss of her brother, Mohammed, not to mention the total destruction that befell their home. The war didn't just affect her physically; it left deep scars on her soul..
- In summary, this is the story of my siblings, Adhoom and Fatima, whose plight reflects the reality of most children in the Gaza Strip. I have decided that enough is enough; my siblings have endured enough tragedies and dangers. It is time for them to escape with their lives.
- se prison, I am resolute in overcoming the formidable challenges imposed by this war to ensure their safety, but Over the past 135 days, we have exhausted our meager savings in a desperate bid to survive amidst the war's relentless grip. With no work or income, and the cost of living skyrocketing due to shortages of essential goods in Gaza, So I decided to launch this donation campaign to evacuat my siblings and to provide for travel, transportation, accommodation, and surgical expenses Nevertheless, I cannot undertake this endeavor alone. Your generous support is instrumental in realizing this mission. Though the task may appear insurmountable, I am determined to give my all and fiercely

  terms of martyrs, blood, and dead bodies.
- Our beloved 3-year-old daughter, Intisar, learned to speak amidst the war. Sadly, her first words were related to the war:(.
- Having narrowly escaped imminent death with my kids, I came to the stark realization that there is no sanctuary in the Gaza Strip. Enduring displacement multiple times, I experienced the harsh reality of lacking essentials like water, food, and medicine, unable to even perform basic activities such as showering, eating, or having access to clean water. The confinement of staying indoors was compounded by the constant fear instilled in my children due to the ominous sounds of warplanes and falling bombs. Faced with these challenges, I resolved to ensure the safety of my children, no matter how formidable the task.
- We've lost everything our home, our jobs, our dreams. My greatest worry is for Mohammed and Intisar, their future uncertain. Where will they live, study, and grow up? Gaza offers little hope now, as life's essentials are destroyed. My children's future appears bleak, overshadowed by uncertainty. My husband and I once dreamed of a simple, peaceful life, a bright future for our children. We yearned for Mohammed and Intisar to thrive, like children everywhere. They deserve a childhood free from fear, a future filled with possibilities. Every child has the right to safety, to basic necessities like food, clean water, clothing, and education. Let's ensure Mohammed and Intisar have these essentials for a chance at a normal life.
- Today, I am asking for your help. I am asking you to support me and my children to recover from the traumas of the war we have lived in. To have a new warm home for my family, to help my children attend school and get a decent education, and help us start our lives from the beginning again.

# Hope and support for rebuilding My Family's Life (GoFundme)

- Four months ago, I decided to move to Germany with my husband (Ahmed Dalloul), leaving all my family members in Gaza. I'm here to share our story and seek help during these challenging times in Gaza and for my family.
- My beloved family, still in Gaza, continues to endure the harsh effects of the
  relentless war, suffering on all human and spiritual levels. When the war
  began, circumstances forced my entire family to leave our home and its
  surroundings. In that heartbreaking moment of evacuation, my family's tears
  flowed like rain. They bid farewell to every corner of the house that held
  memories of our joys and sorrows, including their beloved project "Sabara Plant
  Nursery."
- This project was a source of life for us, and as my mother bid it farewell with tears, it was almost as if the plants were nourished by her tears. It was a painful collapse of their spirit and shattered dreams. Our all family the loved

- ones left the house, leaving behind shattered dreams, exhausted hopes, and simple belongings.
- There is no news about our beautiful home, and all we have is uncertainty. Has everything been destroyed? Is our plant nursery and our plants still alive? The confusion around these questions wraps itself like darkness, and no one knows.
- My family members were forced to leave their home in Jabalia in northern Gaza strip, the heartbeat of their home, towards the Sheikh Radwan area in Gaza City, carrying their remaining hopes. However, after a few days, they were displaced south to the Deir al-Balah area, finding themselves facing a station of despair, surrounded by the unknown and mystery.
- Hours passed like years on the street until they managed to find shelter in a house in Deir al-Balah.
- But after a few days, this place turned into a crowded house with displaced families, searching amidst the rubble for a straw of safety. The difficult and tragic circumstances are not easily understood, as communication and transportation were cut off, making obtaining food, water, and electricity a scarce endeavor. Basic necessities became incredibly rare, a bitter mix of suffering and despair enveloping their daily lives.
- With repeated communication interruptions with my family, feelings of helplessness and fear crept into my heart for continuous days. Every bad feeling increased the worry, and the fear of losing my family accelerated. When I finally manage to contact them, even if for a few minutes, happiness fills me, and the worry subsides for moments. At the same time, the emotions of sadness and fear intertwine to create a complex mix of emotional conflict.
- Upon hearing my mother's voice, tears of longing and fear welled up in my eyes, and I was overcome by intense crying. But one day, after a long period of contact silence, her voice came back, crying with pain and agony.
- That moment was a whisper of deep pain and a message confirming the bitter truth. At that time, I wished I were dead instead of witnessing my mother suffer so painfully. I tried to console her, but she revealed to me a harsh reality: our area in Jabalia was subjected to destruction and bombardment, where we lost our home, our nursery plant project, my brother's house, and the homes of family members, leaving them without a shelter to return to.
- That house and our Sabara Plant Nursery, founded on the basis of love, with walls that bore memories filled with nostalgia and dreams colored with hope, was completely destroyed this time. It's not the only time our home and nursery witnessed this destruction; it went through many trials in recent years and was damaged repeatedly. Despite all those times, we tried to repair it as much as we could, but this time it seems that hope went down with its ruins, and our hearts bleed deep sorrow for losing that corner that sheltered our dreams and deep feelings.

- All our memories passed like embers, and the strong shock possessed all my
  feelings. I couldn't console my mother; sorrow dominated my heart. But I tried
  to encourage her, saying, "We will rebuild the nursery and restore it."
  However, my mother exploded again, saying with deep sadness, "Everything is
  destroyed, our dreams scattered, and nothing is left at all."
- My mother continued, saying, "Our home and the source of our livelihood are gone. There is nothing left. **Even us, when, how, we don't know."** Her words reflected a state of despair and loss, showing the extent of the harsh blow their dreams and shattered hopes suffered.
- In the face of my mother's words, I failed to bear the impact of her words. It has only been a few months since the departure of my dear father, and until now, it remains impossible for anyone to understand the difficulty of life without him.
- I feel much weaker than being able to bear the loss of my family or any member of it again, and helplessness dominates every aspect of my life. I am helpless to change this harsh and painful reality.
- I find comfort in communicating here; it's the only thing I can do and stand by my family's side. We are trying with all our might to help them get out of the grip of this war, and our goal is to move them to a safer place outside of Gaza, away from the danger threatening them. We look forward to rebuilding their lives and reviving their hopes, dreams, and projects anew.
- Although these circumstances at this time have increased the cost of leaving, and financial resources pose a challenge, they find themselves compelled to bear the cost of departure. They are asked to pay amounts reaching around \$7000 per person, making a difficult matter, with challenges increasing day by day.
- In addition, I hope to have the ability to support my dear sister, Omayma, in her educational journey and the realization of her dreams and aspirations. Omayma, the outstanding student at the Faculty of Arts, majoring in French language, holds great ambitions in her heart.
- She dreamed of completing her university studies and then obtaining a scholarship to pursue a master's degree in France. However, the difficult circumstances in Gaza made this dream evaporate, as her university and the French Institute were destroyed.
- Amima's collapsed future carries great pain, and her golden dreams seem to be slowly fading away. I hope here to find the necessary support to revive those dreams and for Amima to continue her studies and achieve her dream of obtaining a master's degree, opening a new chapter of excellence and hopes for her.
- Your support represents the spirit of solidarity and the sea of mercy in the face
  of these harsh storms. It's not just financial assistance; it's a beacon that lights

Jehad lived in Minnesota with the Wenkers, the kindest and most amazing family. During his year abroad, they showed Jehad how life is outside of the siege of Gaza, and Jehad saw freedom for 10 months. When he returned back to Gaza in June 2023, he was so motivated to finish high school and study abroad to become a doctor. He hoped that one day he would be able to see his host family again. He finds himself fleeing with his family from their destroyed home to an unknown place, searching for a safe haven that protects them from danger
- Eight years of attempts and treatments for pregnancy were a difficult and exhausting journey. Each pregnancy was an attempt to revive hope for the future, but the war made it more complicated and painful. The final moments of my pregnancy were heavier than ever, with nothing but a fragile tent to shield me from the harsh nights and the ongoing bombings.
- But when my little daughter was born, I saw in her eyes a light reflecting the strength of life and humanity's determination to survive. Our journey

through war and destruction is not just a story of sadness, but a story of the strength of a mother and resilience in the face of all hardships. I feel pride and gratitude because I possess this inner strength that has helped me confront all these challenges.

- Despite everything, I still dream of a better day for my children, a day when they can live in peace and safety, far away from the echo of cannons and the clamor of wars. I extend my heartfelt thanks to everyone who has supported and helped us, for they are the ones who have given us hope to sustain humanity and the spirit of solidarity in a world full of challenges and difficulties.
- I invite you all, sincerely and earnestly, to extend a helping hand in building a safe and bright future for my children. They are currently living in harsh conditions that do not befit their innocence, yet we hold great hope in our hearts that a day will come when they can live in peace and tranquility.

# Help my family survive famine and have secure life (GoFundme)

- Dear friends, family, and compassionate supporters,
- My name is Eman Zaqout, from Occupied Gaza, Palestine. I am contacting you at a really desperate and urgent moment.
- I am seeking your assistance to raise funds for saving our lives and facing the starvation in Gaza.
- I'm a wife and mother of two little kids. My husband Mahmoud Zaqout 39 years old, my son Rakan 12 years old and my doughter Seba 10 years old. I am also an employee working in a medical field and at the same time a scientific researcher conducting different research inside and outside Gaza as well.
- I am just like any motivated and loving life woman, who loves her family, job and warm house. Since October 7th, my life changed dramatically when Israeli military launched a sweeping war against Gaza. My home and our neighborhood in the North have been destroyed early in this crisis. I and my family have experienced disastrous and unforgettable moments in that day when Israeli warplanes started a violent attack with heavy missiles and white phosphorus in our region. Ambulances and the Palestinian Red Cross evacuated us from the targeted place, so we went to my father's home. My job and my

- husband's job are gone. Israel forced us later to evacuate again from the north Gaza to the south where they claimed it would be the safe zone but it is not at all. Our sweet home and neighborhood have been destroyed along with our belongings and precious memories. Even if the war ends, it's literally unlivable.
- Forced to flee with nothing but the clothes on our backs, now we are staying near a new displacement camp in the south, lacking access to sanitation, medical supplies, food and drinkable water. Over time, the situation here has become more dire and unbearable, without a source of income, without electricity, just destruction, bombing, starvation, and extermination that does not stop day and night. I am writing while feeling helpless and ashamed. I have never imagined that one day I would collect donations to get out of this crisis, to save myself and my family from death.
- As you know, the war in Gaza has extended for five continuous months and the
  holy month of Ramadan is about to come. How could we live and hold up in
  Ramadan while we are struggling for staying safe, fighting hunger and
  protecting ourselves against bombs??
- Israel limits the humanitarian aids for Gazans including foods, drinks, medicine and everything necessary for basic life, which leads to real and painful famine. Even flour is not often available and if found, it is sold at too expensive prices like other types of little offered foods and drinks. The price of one flour bag jumbed from 14\$ to 280\$. These basic goods become unaffordable so, we spent most of the money we have been saving before, and now filled with terror, with uncertainty about our ability to survive. It gets to the point just to survive is a challenge now, if you're not gonna die from the bombs, you're gonna die from the starvation.

# Help a family from Gaza (Gofundme)

- Hello, I am Ibtisam Al-Habil.
- My suffering began in 2014 when my husband was martyred, and I was left alone with my seven children and my daughter, Nour, who suffers a Congenital Heart Disease, without a provider or any helped. I faced life's difficulties in all its forms alone. When my children grew up, Omar studied at Al-Azhar University in the Faculty of Nursing. With a "son of martyr" grant he was able to study for his medical degree and become a doctor. He worked at Al-Shifa Hospital temporarily and was unable to get a job. He helped me and we built a house from scratch. We supported each other to provide the necessities of life for my children and provide treatment for my young daughter, Nour.

- Nour is a heart patient and had open-heart surgery when she was seven months old. She suffers from brain atrophy and delayed growth, and Omar became Nour's doctor. He used to give her growth hormone injections on a daily basis.
- Noha joined the College of Pharmacy, and in 2023, my children, Muhammad and Abeer, became in their orientation year. During this period, our lives were like an ideal, and joy entered our lives and Omar got married.
- On October 7, something happened that we did not expect. The disastrous war began. I left my house from the first day, forced. Because of the brutal Israeli occupation, without anything, just my hands in the hands of my children, we were displaced to the shelter schools after our house and neighborhood were completely destroyed, and we spent the most difficult days of our lives. Then the occupation bombed the school, and we miraculously survived and went to Al-Shifa Hospital under the bombing. We slept on the sand without a cover, and we only had the clothes wear. Then we were forced to flee on the morning of the fourteenth of November to the safe area in the south of the Gaza Strip in Rafah.
- On the morning of the sixteenth of November, the tragedy of my life occurred and my heart was broken by the martyrdom of Omar, who was like a father to his brothers... he was the breadwinner for me, his brothers, and his wife!
- He went to get firewood to cook food when the place was bombed. His little brother was injured and had more than a hundred stitches. His eardrum was punctured, and the tendons in his foot and hand were cut, and his body was filled with shrapnel. I and my children were left without support and without shelter. We currently live in a school. Because of my inability to provide a tent or anything else.
- The shelter school is an unsuitable environment for living, and it is full of diseases and hepatitis. Nour suffers every day due to diseases. She's immunocompromised, and I must take her to the hospital every day.

- I hope for help to save my remaining children from this war and for my daughter to complete her university studies, as she was a senior pharmaceutical student before the war, to complete her studies and help me build our lives again, from scratch.
- This fund will be handed through my friend Yaser
- Update: Unfortunately today Ibtisam's son Mohammad (17 years old) got shot in the leg by the IDF while trying to get some of the aids dropped by the airplanes on Rafah in Gaza Strip. With no medicine or functioning hospitals, the family are suffering trying to take care of the injured while looking sustenance. It can't get any worse! My Allah be with them in their hardship!

I write this letter after more than four months of bombing, destruction, starvation, and genocide to which we are subjected. I took the first steps in realising my dream after I finished high school and obtained a 99.6 % and ranked second in my country after struggling and studying in order to obtain a scholarship because my family isn't able to afford my medical school costs. I registered at the Al-Azhar University majored in medicine through the scholarship of His Excellency the President, and I had started studying in September. 2023, and I had only completed approximately two weeks on my dream path before this war began and the occupation bombarded my university and demolished it, as it did in all the universities of the Gaza Strip, and my dream has vanished along with it. The financial burden on my father has become unbearable, especially in light of the bad conditions caused by the war and the destruction of my house. My father may need many years to rebuild it and put everything he owns in it. At the end, I aspire to be an extraordinary doctor in my field, in order to help the people of my city, Gaza, who are suffering from various physical disabilities, such as amputations and others, and health problems caused by the war and the killing of many, many medical teams while performing their duties in hospitals, clinics and medical facilities, which led to the collapse if the health system in the Gaza Strip, so I hope to continue my dream of studying this specialty as soon as possible.
- This gofundme has been created and managed by Darina Bishop, a trusted friend to Bashar Inshasi's older brother. I live in Australia and while in close communication with Bashar's family, I am a vocal advocate for Palestine. The target donation amount of this gofundme is

\$65k Australian dollars equalling to around \$42k US dollars. To enter Egypt from Rafah, it will cost \$10k US dollars alone. \$25k will be allocated to tuition fees at Bashar's new university. The remaining approximate \$7k will go towards housing and food for Bashar. Once our goal has been met, the funds will be transferred directly to Bashar. ## Help Randa's Family flee war in Sudan (GoFundMe)

- Hello, everyone! My name is Randa, and my friends organised this fundraiser to help and support my family in finding their way to a peaceful place, hopefully joining me in Rwanda.
- Six members of my family are trapped in Sudan, including two with disabilities and chronic illness. My father, who is 70 years old, retired a long time ago due to his medical condition (completely blind with both eyes). He is also diabetic. Our youngest sister had been diagnosed with Erb's palsy since birth. My father and three sisters are now stranded and stuck without first aid treatment, water, food and shelter in Sennar State and my two brothers are trapped in Khartoum in our house where our neighbourhood is under RSF control!
- On April 15th, a war broke out in Sudan between the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) and Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF).they were stuck in Khartoum for 3 months under the air strikes and gun shots, lack of water and electricity for weeks.
- As a result of this tragedy, our neighbourhood was occupied by the RSF, and they have been forced to move to a village in Sennar state, seeking safety.
- A weeks ago, the war expanded to Al jazeera states. Currently, they are stuck in Sennar, fighting to survive with limited resources (electricity, food, water, network, medicine) as we've lost all our income sources.
- We read in the news that RSF has entered Sennar State and with them fighting in Sennar and the high risk of facing sexual abuse and rape of my three sisters, as they use this strategy to terrify people, every hour counts! It increased my stress and made me worry. Therefore, I 'm asking for your support to airlift to Rwanda through Uganda or South Sudan from this situation.
- All our properties have been looted, destroyed and lost with the crisis. With the current situation, me and my family have nothing left.
- This is the only hope for me to save the lives and re-unite of my family. To make this possible, I need your financial support to be able to evacuate them from the war zone to Rwanda.
- Kindly find the budget breakdown below.
- 250 USD per person to travel to Port Sudan = 1500 USD
- 800 USD flights ticket to Uganda from Port Sudan per person = 4800 USD

- 25 USD per person times six people to board a bus from Uganda to Rwanda = 150 USD.
- 2500 USD for rental arrangements for the first three months.
- 140 USD for residency permit per person = 840 USD

• My name is Dr. Abd Alrahman I am a fresh graduate who returned to Gaza 9 months ago. Returning to Gaza after being away for 8 years after completing my post-graduate was very difficult for me as I did not see my family while I was away completing Medical School. Now my family and I are trapped in the gut-wrenching mess of the Gaza war. Currently, I've dedicated my full time as a Doctor, giving an extra helping hand without expecting anything in return, all for the sake of those injured by the harshness of the war. Meanwhile, my own family lost everything including our home and memories, are all gone. We need an out, a chance at safety.

# Help Hasan and his family to be safe (GoFundMe)

• My name is Hasan, I am a 27 year old biology teacher in Gaza. My family and I were asked to evacuate our home in the middle of Gaza and to flee to the south of Gaza since October 7th. We fled to unknown circumstances, desperately trying to help ourselves to stay safe. We evacuated to more than seven places which are not made for human use. There is no water, no bathrooms, no food, and no safe place to sleep. We left everything behind us. My only wish is not to lose anyone of my family, as I lost some relatives and friends. it breaks my heart to see and I am asking for your help in saving us from this genocide.

My mom needs proper medicine and we need urgent support in saving her state of health. My brother and I wish to continue our studies, funds will be spent on securing safe travel to egypt for 3 refugees. Please share and donate!!!!!! Hasan mahdi rajab Jamela saleh rajab Nedal mahdi rajab.

• A few days later, we were ordered to evacuate the building where my childhood home once stood and so we had to quickly collect a few belongings and leave my parents house. Nour, my husband and his family, myself and my parents moved to my sister's house which was in a quieter neighborhood and a smaller building. That was our second displacement. Shelling equally followed us to that area, so this time along with my sister, her husband and his family and all of us had to move again. We had to split to 3 different places due to available places to shelter and thus with our 3rd displacement, the incessant bombing, lack of water, food, electricity and multiple communications blackouts we also had to endure the separation and the inability to communicate inside Gaza as well as being cut out from the outside world.

- There's no place safe in Gaza, we can be bombed at any time and anywhere across the strip. Displacement is hard on adults, so it's unimaginably harsh on children who are not able to comprehend why they have to move from one place to the other, the reason there are some basic day-to-day things that keep changing, such as water to shower, food, water, being enclosed without going out and of course the noises of the war planes and raining bombs. For Nour, the fact that she rarely sees her father is another new reality she had to get used to. I stayed with my parents at some relative's house and my husband had to stay at his work due to the continuous emergency need. Amid all of these horrors, we received the news that my parents house, that place we used to call home where we lived our childhood, as teenagers and adults, that neighborhood where we lived with our friends and neighbors for years was simply reduced to rubble. All 4 buildings and surroundings were wiped up from the neighborhood. In a few minutes, a lifetime was lost. Home, savings, friends, neighbors, memories, all vanished in a blink.
- My greatest concern is Nour, her future, where she will live, study and grow up. There's nothing left in Gaza, all life sustaining means are now destroyed. Nour's future became blurry and dark. We had dreams, me and my husband, for us and for Nour. We dreamt of a simple, peaceful and bright life and a successful future for Nour. We all have the right to have a normal life and Nour deserves a normal childhood and a bright future like other children worldwide. We should be able to provide our daughter with the essentials for a normal life, such as safety first of all and material needs such as food, clean water and clothing and also education. These are the minimum rights of a child.

- For the future and dreams of unknown fate.

- We are suffering from death in northern Gaza many times over from various aspects of life.... There is no need for water at all and no need for flour to eat, so we are learning anything and trying to grind it to satisfy our hunger, such as wheat, barley, corn, and wheat !!! They will not die from bombing or killing. We will die from hunger and thirst. Therefore, we are all crossing the Rafah border between Gaza and Egypt and ensuring the safety of our family.
- We urgently need to be included in the crossing list, which requires a lot of wages to be paid. However, the coordinators in Egypt collectively charge between \$7,000 and \$8,000 individually for this permit, and insist on proof of funds before adding our names.
- As a member of the judiciary, his responsibilities are heavy on a large number because I and I chose to help as much as we can and he cannot bear the thought of doing anything to them while I stand helpless to help them. Your support is our lifeline. I appreciate any donation, no matter how small, as it will greatly impact our plight. - My youngest brother, Adam, who suffers from cerebral palsy (we face difficulty in obtaining his chronic medications in Gaza), sustained minor injuries.
- We were transferred to Al-Shifa Hospital and stayed there for a month before evacuating to Khan Yunis and later to Rafah in search of a safe place.
- Our family is in pursuit of stability, striving to rebuild a new life amidst
  the ruins. The destruction has also impacted our family's means of
  livelihood, which gave us no other choice but to evacuate from Gaza.
  Your assistance is sincerely appreciated as we want to stay save and save
  our lives.
- Why do we need this money and how will it be used:

- Passing Rafah Border: 5000 for each person to pass Rafah border, which we will pay them for Ya Hala company: 10x5000= 50000

In the middle of the night on October 20, 2023, and in the midst of the chaos of war, bombs rained down on the two houses, and they simply turned into rubble. My family and I have been homeless since that time, and we only have the clothes we wear. Our cherished memories, our hopes for the future, were all snatched from us in an instant, leaving behind nothing but the echo of loss, frustration, fear, and little of what was to come.

- Since October 20, 2023, we have been in a state of displacement from tent to tent and from place to place inside Gaza, which is being bombarded and exterminated throughout the day. My family and I still escape certain death every time, and I still reject all attempts to displace us through siege at times and starvation and bombing at other times. Just imagine for a moment what you would do if a tank stood in front of where you were for 15 days, sniping at every mover, while you were inside without food and water!! What difficult days, we lost the ability to continue. But I was feeding on the prayers of my mother, whom the occupier lost one of her eyes due to her injury, and caused her, my children, and my wife constant terror, destitute mental health, and exhausted bodies, and I do not know when we will recover from all of this, while the cruelty of our oppressors continues to follow us. Now, we find ourselves in a shelter, a grim reminder of the fragility of life and the harsh realities of conflict.
- Dear and free people everywhere, we are now facing the stark reality of being abandoned and left to fend for ourselves in a world that has turned its back on our suffering and losses that are accumulating day after day.
- I turn to you, loyal people, to help us build our home. I do not have anything to keep me going while I want to stay in my country, Gaza. Everyone is asking for financial help to leave Gaza, while we are asking for help so that we can rebuild what the occupation destroyed, and build hope and the future with your help and the help of sincere people around the world.
- I am grateful to everyone who wants to help us overcome what we are in. I cannot imagine what we will do and how we will manage our affairs without shelter. Please help us ......

### Evacuate Tasneem from Gaza to Egypt for Operation (Gofundme)

- Tasneem Nabil Musa was injured when her home in Gaza was destroyed by bombs on November 27th. This 14-year-old girl suffered a skull fracture and fractured her hip and hand. She is now living in a refugee tent in southern Gaza. She needs further treatment for injuries, but the facilities she needs don't exist in Gaza.
- It's hard to get out of Gaza even for medical treatment. Tasneem's brother, Osama, is in Egypt and can get her a referral to a hospital there, but this requires payment for the needed operation. Tasneem's skull fracture is still bleeding and requires a cranial bone transplant and she needs an ablative operation on her leg. This operation costs \$5,000-\$6,000 (USD), plus additional costs for follow-up and medication.
- When the bombs destroyed the family home on November 27th, the seven family members who were home were all injured. Tasneem's parents, sister, and brother's injuries have stabilized, but her injuries were more severe. The hospitals in Gaza do not have the equipment needed for the operation due to the ongoing war.
- After their home was destroyed, Tasneem and her family evacuated to Rafah in southern Gaza. They are now staying in harsh conditions in a tent amongst flood waters from the recent rains.
- I met Tasneem's brother Osama in October when traveling through the Middle East. I am organizing this fundraiser in Minnesota. I will transfer all the funds raised here to Osama using Western Union so that he can arrange his sister's referral in Egypt.
- Update 03/3/24: Thank you to everyone who has donated for your generosity. Tasneem is fairly stable but still needs treatment in Egypt for her skull fracture. The Rafah border is closed and they have raised the price for crossing. Tasneem and her brothers who are also injured are struggling to find shelter in Rafah. The funds donated so far have all been sent to the family in Gaza and are helping to keep them alive.

  a fourth year student of laboratory medicine. I'm part of a 7 person family

  happily in the comfort of our house in Sheikh Radwan in the north, devoting
  our lives to education and work.
- Shortly after the war started, our house was bombed, and we've since been displaced more than three times and lost all of our money. The seven of us now share a tent in Rafah. Our only hope of restoring some semblance of normal life is to evacuate. For over 150 days, we've lacked basic necessities. Among other things, we lack access to clean water, medicine, healthcare, and gas for cooking. Our evacuation is particularly urgent because my father can't access the treatment he needs his high blood pressure and heart disease. As I write you, the Israeli army's planned invasion of Rafah grows ever closer. We have lost everything we'd worked so hard to earn and build, and now have no place to go. Your support and solidarity will give us a fighting chance of surviving and building our lives anew.

### Help Omar and his family survive the genocide. (GoFundme)

- Hi, my name is Marilyn, I'm starting this campaign to help my friend Osama and his family survive the genocide in Gaza.
- My name is Osama F. M. Abdelrahman. I live with my family in northern Gaza, in the Safatawi neighborhood. Our home, where we've lived since 1997, was a place of cherished memories spanning three generations. It was a five-floor residential building, with each floor housing separate apartments.
- Our family occupied three of these apartments: one for my stepmother Ola Yassin, along with my younger siblings Omar and Shahd; another for my sister Najlaa and myself; and the last one for my brother Mohammed and his small family.
- Despite enduring uprisings, wars, and multiple invasions, we never left our home. However, last year, on October 13th, we were forced to evacuate due to orders issued by the Israeli army. Prior to our departure, our neighborhood was bombed, and incendiary belts were launched nearby.
- Tragically, our house was one of those targeted. It suffered extensive damage from artillery shelling and was ultimately burned down by the occupation forces. The loss of our home has left us without shelter in Gaza.
- The destruction not only took our home and belongings but also impacted my brother Omar, who has spina bifida, and my sister Shahd, who suffers from speech difficulties. Accessing medical care for them is nearly impossible amidst the ongoing genocide.
- My younger brother Omar, who is seven and a half years old, has been suffering from a congenital deformity in his spine (spina bifida) since birth, which hinders his ability to walk or control his bowel movements, and the lower part of his body's growth. Omar needs intensive physical therapy sessions to maintain the muscles of his lower limbs, but none of these sessions have been conducted for over five months. My sister Shahd, his twin, suffers from speech difficulties. She also stopped attending speech therapy sessions at Hamad Hospital, which was destroyed by the occupation tanks at the beginning of the ground military operation in western Gaza.
- The dire situation is compounded by the ongoing conflict, which has made it even more challenging to access medical care or resources for Omar's treatment. We desperately need assistance to travel to Egypt. Egypt has completely closed the Rafah crossing and prohibits passage except after paying very high crossing fees, reaching up to \$5000 per person. The amount we need to pay amounts to approximately \$45,000 to get my family members out of Gaza to safety and secure their livelihoods in Egypt for some time before we can return to Gaza after the situation calms down.

• Now, we face the challenge of leaving Gaza due to the closed Rafah crossing, which demands exorbitant fees. To secure our family's safety and livelihoods in Egypt, we require \$45,000. Any assistance would be deeply appreciated.

### Help child with Cerebral Palsy evacuate (GoFundme)

- Update as of March 20th: The situation in the north is dire. The child is suffering from skin ulcers and physical weakness due to malnutrition and lack of vitamins, and has been given a cannula. He is now experiencing vomiting and diarrhea, and the mother fears he may become severely malnourished and dehydrated. The child's dental health is also critical; he needs dental implants, but the surgery cannot be performed on him at this time. Consequently, painful boils have developed on his gums, as described by the mother. They are using the last box of antibiotics to control these boils, and since very limited aid has been allowed in the North, they will soon run out of antibiotics. Failure to treat his dental condition could have severe consequences. The father attempted to retrieve aid from the little that was allowed in but was unsuccessful. Furthermore, the father's brother was injured while attempting to retrieve aid a few days ago. Please consider donating and sharing widely; this family urgently requires evacuation.
- A mother in Northern Gaza needs urgent funds to evacuate her family out of Gaza to help treat her disabled son. Her five-year-old child has cerebral Palsy and suffers from a heart condition, rendering him with the cognitive and motor abilities of a 2-year-old, and urgently requires evacuation for medical treatment. The ongoing genocide has worsened his condition— because of the lack of food, medicine, and other amenities. He currently suffers from malnutrition and frequent diarrhea, resulting in painful rashes.
- Before the genocide, the family went to the occupied 48 territories to conduct some tests for a valve transplant. However, their appointment has been canceled due to the ongoing genocide. The child requires immediate treatment that is possible outside of Gaza. The family has lost almost everything to the genocide and is struggling to afford basic necessities such as food, diapers, and medical care.
- With your support, we can help this family escape the horrors they have endured, and help this child receive the vital treatment he requires. The

- cost to evacuate through Egypt is \$7,000 a person. The donations we raise will go towards covering expenses including food, evacuation, and treatment for this child in desperate need.

### Help a Small Family Leave Gaza - Traumatic War (GoFundme)

- I am Rana Abu Ahmed, a Palestinian currently residing in Canada. It is with a heavy heart that I reach out to you today, as my circumstances have compelled me to seek assistance for the well-being of my aunt's family in Gaza, particularly in regards to their safety and peace.
- My aunt, Eman Harara, aged 35, along with her four young children her eldest daughter Rose (ورد) Harara, aged 12, a son (Karam Harara), aged 8, the youngest daughter Lana, aged 5, and the new born girl named yaseem, aged 2 have been severely affected by the ongoing destructive war in Gaza.
- They have lost their homes and were forced to seek refuge in Rafah, hoping to find a safe place amidst the chaos.
- They were living in a small garage, devoid of essential resources such as water, electricity, and other basic needs. In her desperate attempts to convey the dire situation to my mother, my aunt shared the struggles they face.
- **CURRENT SITUATION:** The house beside the garage they were living in got bombed and destroyed
- Four months before the war began, my father (Ahmed, aged 50) had bought an apartment which costed around \$70,000 CAD and before he had a chance to enjoy it, it was destroyed due to the war and put him in depth financially.
- We hope through this campaign, we can raise enough to help everyone recover from this horrible situation.

#### • THE EVACUATION:

- To better the circumstances, the Egyptian border authorities are demanding exorbitant fees of \$10,000 per adult and \$10,000 for all the children to grant them passage for exists. Therefore, I have created this GoFundMe campaign in the hopes that we can join forces as a united community and extend our support to my aunt in these extremely arduous times.
- The funds raised will be allocated towards the following purposes:
- \$10,000 for one adult and \$10,000 for the children, totalling to cover the compulsory border fees.
- Providing basic necessities such as baby formula, diapers, and winter coats.

- Securing suitable accommodation for my aunt and her family in Egypt which would cost \$15,000
- Coming to Canada, around \$15,000
- Of course this does not include the transaction fees + gofundme takes 2.9% of donations!
- I appreciate every single one of you on the behalf of my aunt and cousins.
- ANY EXTRA donations will go towards creating care boxes to help other families living in tents around my aunt!!
- This is an extremely rough situation for everyone living in Rafah, so I want to make sure all your donations go toward the people of Gaza.
- This is an incredible community, I couldn't thank you guys enough.

### Protect an open source engineer and his family (GoFundme)

- Mohammed Abu Matar is a young father of four. As an engineer, he is trained to solve problems with technology. He founded Gaza's first 3D printing company, starting with one device that he then used to print many others. He is one of the most generous persons I have ever met.
- "I started thinking about leaving Gaza and starting a new life in a new place until things completely stabilize in the Gaza Strip. I think it will take years to recover. The conditions are getting worse day by day and the humanitarian aid that has begun to enter the north is very limited and not sufficient for its purpose. Gaza is no longer livable at all. The war has exhausted all the cash I have and I will not be able to work in these circumstances. Within weeks I lost close friends. They were struggling to survive and I was exchanging ideas and plans with them. I have no one left to lean on now. My company was destroyed twice, in 2021 and 2023. The goal of the campaign is to leave Gaza with my family to a safe place and then establish a new business, rebuilding in Europe or Canada."
- I am Lorax Horne, a Canadian journalist who met Mohammed and his wife Ahlam in 2016, when I visited Gaza to attend a conference about the use of free software and hardware in healthcare. Mohammed helped organize this conference, as well as arranging my visa in the country. Ahlam cooked maklouba for me while I was a guest in their city, and Mohammed introduced me to the doctors, engineers, journalists, and English students who would become my guides and interpreters those weeks. We stayed in touch over the years, and now it is my privilege to

try to extend some hospitality back to this family. I am collecting money in my personal account in Canada, and sending it via Western Union or Moneygram directly to my friends who are in need. If necessary, I will fly to Cairo with funds raised here to help to broker the evacuation with the Egyptian side.

- The funds raised here will be used to:
- Meet the basic needs of the Abu Matar family like food, water, blankets, or tents
- Evacuate the Abu Matar family safely to Egypt. It will cost at least USD \$5000 per adult and \$2500 per child to cross the border
- Pay for transportation from the border to Cairo and exit visas for Mohammed Abu Matar (37), his wife Ahlam (33), and their four children Hala (14), Yousef (12), Joury (7), and little Lilia (3).
- Any extra funds raised will be used to cover their living expenses in Egypt, and their plane tickets to their final destination after Egypt.
- More about Mohammed and Tashkeel 3D
- For years Mohammed was collaborating with others to produce high quality medical devices, and distributing supplies to paramedics and emergency room doctors. Their prototype of a low cost 3D-printed stethoscope has been used by the local Ministry of Health as well as governments in other countries to deliver working medical technology at a <u>fraction of the cost</u> of commercial devices. They saved lives by inventing low-cost tourniquets that were used during the Great March of Return.
- During the start of the COVID pandemic, his workshop began to produce <u>PPE</u>. His company innovatively used 3D printers, beating the blockade by using new technology and supplying hospitals and primary care providers, as well as Doctors Without Borders.

I am hopeful for Said and his band Sol Band; they will again be back on the stage together and touring the world, fulfilling their dreams.
- This is a Call to Action for you to help make a difference and make this a reality!
- The Egyptian government is asking for 8,000 per person in exchange for granting access to Egypt. Said has six family members, which include his little brother, his mother, and his father. Your contribution can allow them to rebuild their lives, fulfill their basic needs, and begin taking the critical steps in preparing for their departure into Egypt.
- Everything counts, and Said is grateful for those who have already donated (\$725!) before the creation of this GoFundMe. Initially, I was raising funds for Said via my accounts, and he was receiving them via Wise through his sister-in-law, Bushra. Bushra tells me she can't believe how the tables have turned and how they (and Gaza's entire population) are now asking for the help of others with the hope of surviving this nightmare.

# Help Belal and His Family Escape the War in Gaza (GoFundme)

- My name is Belal Azmi Msallam, and I am a 25-year-old Palestinian from Gaza. I live with my family of 14, including my parents, siblings, and their children. We are desperate to leave Gaza and seek safety and peace in Egypt, but we need your help to make it happen.
- Gaza has been under siege and attack by the Israeli occupation for decades, but the situation has worsened since October 7, 2023, when we were subjected to a brutal genocide by Israeli occupation. Since then, we have witnessed unimaginable atrocities and violence, with thousands of innocent civilians killed, injured, or displaced.
- We have lived through many wars, but this one is different. It is a
  genocide. There is no safe place to hide, no shelter, no water, no food,
  no electricity, no internet, no medical care. Death is everywhere, and
  destruction is all we see.
- My family and I have been displaced multiple times, moving from one area to another, hoping to find some security. We have lost our home, our belongings, our friends, and our dignity. We have been living in a small tent in Rafah, south of Gaza, for 150 days, enduring the harsh winter and the constant fear of bombing.
- My sister and her children are stuck in the northern part of Gaza, where the situation is even worse. They lost their mother-in-law and their home in an airstrike, and one of them was injured. I have not been able to contact them for weeks, and I don't know if they are alive or dead.
- My father, who is 75 years old and suffers from heart problems, diabetes, and high blood pressure, was wounded in his left leg during the war and needs medical treatment. My mother, who is 63 years old, is traumatized and depressed by the loss of our relatives and the horrors we have witnessed.
- We are living in a nightmare, and we don't know how long we can survive. Leaving Gaza is not easy. It is expensive and complicated. We need a lot of money to pay for the permits, the crossing fees, the transportation, the accommodation, the food, the health care, and the other basic needs. We also need to pay for the medical treatment for my father's foot.
- We have no income, no savings, no assets, no support. We have nothing but our hope and our faith.

- That's why we are reaching out to you, kind people of the world, to help us make our dream come true.
- We need \$100,000 USD, equivalent to \$160,000 AUD, to cover the costs of leaving Gaza and starting a new life in Egypt. This amount will be divided as follows:
- \$12,600 for basic needs in Egypt, covering accommodation, food, health, and other essentials (equals \$900 per month).
- \$74,200 to cover permits and crossing fees at Rafah, Egypt-Gaza border, broken down to \$5,300 per person.
- The remaining goes to the hospital for my father's foot treatment and medicines.
- We know this is a lot of money, but we have no other choice. We are risking our lives every day in Gaza, and we don't know if we will see tomorrow. We are begging you to help us escape this hell and find some peace and happiness.

### <u>Urgent Rescue Mission for the Mortaja Family</u> (GoFundme)

• We, Hani in Belgium and Ahmed in Gaza, are reaching out for urgent assistance to rescue our family from the dire situation in Gaza. Our

campaign aims to secure their safe passage to Egypt as a first step, with the ultimate goal of bringing our parents to Belgium for proper medical care, and obtaining scholarships for our siblings to continue their disrupted education. The war has taken a heavy toll on us, resulting in the loss of our ancestral home, significant damage to our current residence, loved ones lost, and dreams shattered. Every contribution helps us cover evacuation costs, legal fees for visas, and educational opportunities, therefore ensuring our family's safety and future prospects. Your support means the world to us in these trying times, offering hope and a chance for a new beginning.

- My name is Hani, and I am reaching out from Belgium, where I am safe but my family in Gaza is not. My heart remains with them, alongside my brother Ahmed, who is enduring the crisis with our family. We never imagined a day would come when we would need to seek your support through this GoFundMe campaign to bring our family to safety and provide them with an opportunity for a better future. However, the harsh and dangerous living conditions in Gaza have forced us into this situation, surpassing all expectations. The funds raised will be crucial for covering the costs of crossing borders, coordination fees, transportation, and ensuring a semblance of stability in Egypt for the initial months.
- Five months into the war, I've come to realise that we need more than just one heart to bear all this devastation and more than one set of eyes to cry and mourn without restraint. Since the war began, disasters have continuously befallen us without respite.
- We (my parents, myself, my brothers Mohammed, Salah and Mahdi, my sisters Shimaa and Walaa, my niece Mariam and my nephews Mahdi and Mohammed) have been displaced over thirteen times if my memory serves me right in recounting these instances. But my memory is even more adept at recalling the nights filled with cold and fear, fleeing from death, and emerging from the rubble with my family over and over again.
- And each time that we miraculously survived, we lost a part of us, a piece of our hearts.
- My mother, who lost her sister, nephews, and nieces, experienced a shocking blow. On the same day, she lost more than forty martyrs from her brothers' children and their offspring.

- The latest loss was my cousin, an esteemed teacher and mentor to many.
   Amid the severe crisis and famine here in the north, he went in search
   of flour to feed his children and family but never returned, meeting his
   demise instead.
- All of these losses didn't give us a chance to grieve properly or look at everything with a hopeful eye.
- My father's health was already deteriorating due to chronic illnesses and recurrent strokes before the war. During the conflict, his condition worsened, having memory loss more often, and I suspect he has suffered another stroke (though we can't diagnose it due to the lack of medical staff in Gaza and overall lack of proper healthcare services). In war, cases are evaluated based on the priority of preserving life, without considering that the case being evaluated is a father with children who have big dreams.
- My sister Shimaa, who has two little moons in the form of children, and a third born amid the war in harsh conditions that are beyond imagination, named Mohammad, symbolising our relatives and friends. This third child was born displaced from his home, in the biting cold, and now, two and a half months later, he still hasn't received the appropriate vaccinations like normal children do.
- Those speaking to you now were not born as superheroes; they are ordinary humans. We go to our jobs, others go to learn, and we gather in the evening to talk about what the ordinary days bring us.
- During the war, the universities where my siblings study and my father works were destroyed, and the jobs of my other siblings, who work in information technology, vanished into thin air.
- All these events have had a physical and psychological impact on the family. My mother lost weight alongside losing more than eighty people from her family, her sisters. My father lost his health and his sanity, overwhelmed by grief.
- My brothers and sisters lost what they lost, alongside surviving various incidents during the war, and others from the starving predators on the streets.
- Therefore, it takes more than one heart and mind to comprehend and endure what transpired during the war.
- Our immediate goal is to secure the safety and well-being of our family in Egypt. For our parents, we plan to navigate the complex process of

- securing visas for them to come to Belgium, where I can provide the care and support they desperately need. I am tirelessly working to secure visas and the necessary support to ensure they can receive the medical care they desperately need.
- For my siblings, once they are settled in Egypt, our goal is to secure scholarships that will allow them to continue their education and rebuild their futures. We are also committed to ensuring that my sister and her children are safe and sound in Egypt, away from the dangers they currently face.

## Save my family from the war in Gaza (GoFundme)

- I am reaching out to you for your help in saving the lives of my family from the horrors of the war in Gaza and helping evacuate them from it. It's been five months of death, destruction, and displacement that have left everyone burdened with pain.
- My name is Hussam from Gaza, currently living in Belgium with my only son, Omar. I left Gaza five years ago in search of a better life and a brighter future for my son. I am uncertain whether I will ever see my family again and especially my son, who constantly asks me about his grandparents with one question: "Papa: Are my grandparents still alive?"
- With the onset of the war, the first news I heard was the loss of my aunt, her husband, her children, and grandchildren—a whole family of 18 people, the first of my relatives to be lost. Subsequent news followed of the loss of more relatives, dearest friends, childhood and school friends during a war that the mind cannot comprehend.
- My family consists of:
- My father (Azzam), my mother (Noha).
- My twin brother (Hazem) and his wife (Ola), and their two children (Azzam) and (Dina).
- My sister (Alaa), her husband (Muhannad), and their two daughters (Alma) and (Lyn).
- My youngest sister (Ghaydaa), her husband (Murid), her daughter (May), and her son (Izz Al-Din).
- They are all currently in shelters between Rafah and Al-Zawaida.
- On Tuesday, February 15th, my sister Ghaydaa gave birth to her second child (Izz al-Din), who joined our family amidst tragic circumstances and a difficult birth under the sounds of bombing and shelling.

- The support needed is to enable my family to evacuate from Gaza to Egypt through the only available crossing, which is the Rafah crossing Border. Unfortunately, the cost of evacuating each person ranges from €8.000 to €12.000 per person. Last step is to be reunited with them here in Belgium.
- In the past months, my family was forced to evacuate our home and move to central and southern Gaza to multiple locations, after we received news that our house was partially destroyed. We do not know its current condition and it's impossible to reach, as we live near Al-Shifa Hospital, which was part of the largest military operation during the war.
- My family is under constant psychological pressure, fear, confusion, and waiting in difficult living and health conditions. Access to appropriate food has become everyone's dream, especially breastfeeding milk for my newborn nephew.
- My brother Hazem, his wife, and children were able to reach Egypt safely on Friday the 23rd of February with family in law assistance, but unfortunately, we no longer have solutions to evacuate the rest of the family.
- €4300 to cover the expenses of transferring to GoFundMe at a rate of 2.9% and 30 cents per transfer.
- €90.000 is allocated to obtain exit permits from Gaza and cover crossing fees through the Rafah land crossing.
- €2.000 for travel and transportation expenses from Gaza to Egypt.
- €30.000 for living expenses for 10 people, including rent and daily living necessities, for a period of between 6 months up to a year.
- The next step is to reunite my family in Belgium, where my son Omar and I reside, by submitting the necessary documents to the Belgian embassy in Egypt, which will require some time and costs as well, as follows:
- €1.700 to create reunification files.
- €9.000 for flight and transportation tickets.
- €15.000 to rent a house for 3 months 4 months in Belgium including daily living necessities.

## Help Mai and her family (GoFundme)

• "I am Mai Rajab from Gaza . We were living a quiet and stable life until the war came and the Israeli occupation displaced us from our homes in Gaza City (Alwehda street) on October 13, 2023. We went to Khan Younis in the south of the Gaza Strip and took only the necessary papers. We were sleeping in the street without shelter, and we could not find a single blanket to keep us warm. We could not find any bread to satisfy our hunger. After that, we received help from some people, and we took refuge in my aunt's house. After that, the place

was bombed, and we took refuge in Rafah with the same story. We did not find shelter and we were cold, since we could not take winter clothes to help keep us warm. We are now in a small room with strangers who could not bear to see us like this in the street: crying and dying of cold. I lost many members of my family and friends. I lost part of my house, and my father's workplace was also destroyed. I have many dreams, I need to be safe! During the war in 2021, I was pulled from under the rubble! Can you imagine! Finally, I'm a human and not a number. Wish me a good life. Thank you."

- My name is Mera Yassin. I hail from Safed, Palestine. My family and I have traversed countries to settle in the United States. The recent events involving Mai and her family deeply affected me. Despite my efforts to contact Gaia Thomas, I was unsuccessful. I am committed to preventing such incidents from occurring again. I will ensure that the donations reach Mai and her family promptly, aiding their departure from Gaza. Your support and trust are greatly appreciated.

Our best hope is to cross the border; to leave the terror of this war and escape to Egypt. We wish this was easy and possible for us, but the reality is that this journed is fraught with risks and financial burdens they we simply cannot afford.

- Tickets from Rafah to Egypt currently cost \$5000 per adult, and \$2500 per child. You can read more about the costs and logistics of this journey here.

# EMERGENCY: HELP ME EVACUATE MY FAMILY FROM GAZA (GoFundme)

- Dear everyone who cares about humanity,
- I am writing this to you in a time of urgent and necessary need. My family of fourteen is currently in Gaza, facing unimaginable circumstances. My family and I are desperately seeking your support to help them evacuate to safety.
- Currently living far from my family, I find myself thousands of miles away, feeling helpless as my family endures the hardships of the ongoing crisis in Gaza. The situation has become increasingly bad, and I fear for their safety daily. Since October 7th, my family has been evacuated inside Gaza countless times, back and forth, witnessed death countless times, and yet miraculously made it through. For the past 32 hours, my family has been trapped in Khan Yunis. They miraculously managed to escape to Rafah, leaving everything behind, saving only their lives. Some of my cousins were taken hostage, others

were executed, and my cousins are still trapped in shelter centers and cannot move due to the siege. I am in dire need of evacuating those who escaped from them, and they are now in the streets of Rafah, without a tent or a safe place to stay, and every second they are in... Gazans are seconds close to death.

- I started this GoFundMe campaign as a desperate plea to raise \$200,000 to facilitate my family's evacuation to Egypt. Below is a breakdown of the funds:
- \$140,000 is solely to coordinate permits and crossing fees: The bulk of the funds, \$140,000, are needed to cover expenses associated with obtaining permits to leave Gaza and the crossing fees required at the Egypt-Gaza border in Rafah. This amount amounts to \$10,000 per person. We will prioritize children first.
- Breakdown of Costs:
- 1- Exit coordination for each person:  $$10,000 \times 14 = 140,000$
- The 60,000\$ leftover will cover:
- 2- Immigration lawyer fees
- 3- Residence in Cairo for 3-4 weeks while awaiting papers:
- 4- Airline tickets for 14 people
- 5-Settlement expenses (for the first two months until finding a job) include (rent, furniture, winter equipment to
- adapt to the weather, health coverage, living costs)
- 6- Accommodation costs

- My name is Amal Abu Shammala, I am a licensed Palestinian architect based in Berlin and a permanent resident in Germany. I am reaching out to you in a time of immense distress as my family, currently in Gaza, faces the devastating consequences of the ongoing war. Having survived five previous war aggressions on Gaza, they now find themselves in a perilous situation.
- Since 2021, I have been separated from my family due to the war, unable to return. My father, mother, two sisters, as well as my aunt, uncle, and their children are all in Gaza, confronting insurmountable danger.
- After October 7th, my family was compelled to evacuate to the south, leaving behind our home in Northern Gaza with just a single backpack each as the area became increasingly unsafe. Forced to walk for miles in search of refuge, we left not only our physical residence but also cherished memories and possessions. The fate of our house remains unknown, as our area was bombed multiple times, compelling us to flee for our lives repeatedly. Tragically, we also lost our shops at the beginning of the conflict on 15-07-2023.
- Each passing day sees the situation growing more grave and dangerous. Deprived of basic necessities such as water, food, clothing, bedding, and medicine, my family faces the harsh reality of Israel's cut-off of electricity and water, along with frequent bombings targeting vital food sources like bakeries. Communication is a luxury, with no internet connection or ways to charge a cell phone. The inability to reach them for days or even weeks leaves me devastated, affecting my work and sleep here in Berlin. Everyday I feel paralyzed by fear and anxiety, tirelessly attempting to ensure their safety in the dire and constant danger they face, 24/7.
- In the past month, their last refuge in Khan-Yunis was besieged, with sniper fire and tank attacks endangering their lives. Their shelter was bombed while they were inside, narrowly escaping. Running for about an hour, they found a tent at first, only to have it collapse in the rain, leaving them with soaked bedding and clothes. Currently, they have no shelter, no refuge, and lack the essentials for survival. With winter setting in, the situation becomes increasingly dire, and each day is marked by terror. The trauma they endure on an hourly basis is excruciating, making the need for assistance to get my family out of Gaza as soon as possible more urgent than ever.

- I am initiating this fundraising campaign to evacuate my family through the Rafah/Egypt crossing, providing them with the means to escape the life-threatening conditions they are enduring. The urgency of their situation is critical, and your support can make a significant difference.
- They are all stuck in Gaza and require financial support to evacuate the Gaza Strip immediately.

- I am Qasim Al-Kafarneh
- I write this to you in a time of urgent need. My family of 12 is currently in Gaza, I have 11 of my brothers' children, and is facing unimaginable circumstances. My family and I are desperately seeking your support to help them evacuate to safety My mom Lily, my sisters Warda and Fida, my brothers (lyad, Muhammad, Youssef, Abdullah, Ibrahim, Zakaria, Yahya, Issa, Musa)

Iyad was released three weeks later, but Ibrahim is still missing. We didn't hear anything about him The Israeli army killed my father and brother Shehadeh in 2006. I don't want to lose any more of my family members, I want to get my family out of Gaza and start a new life away from wars ..

#### Help Bring Ahmed Masoud's to Safety! (Gofundme)

- Hello world! This is Ahmed speaking in front of your courteous presence, and this is a Gazan "me" as an epic story.
- Once upon an October, a time when once turned to be forever, there was a very particular moment when I believed my life, our lives, would never be the same again. Little did I know that every single coming second would bear anything but joy and peace.
- Here, in Rafah, from our fifth displacement, we barely have the luxury to choose which of those five displacements was less cruel, nor could we dare to whisper this word: home.
- Five months ago, the narrative could have been so different. This graduation photograph below must tell a lot about that. The best about it is that it truly defines me in just three words: cheerful, ambitious, and a dreamer. Yet, war always has its way of stealing your light with a trice.
- Luckily, I still remember my name: Ahmed Masoud (Instagram) and 23 years of being a Gazan. A term which used to be a perfect synonym for siege, aggression, war, massacre, loss, pain, agony as well as death. The "death" that life here forces you look to in the eye.
- I can also recall my profession, a law graduate and a dedicated human rights activist who is fed up with all these ridiculous lectures about humanity and has a million terrifying thoughts spinning in his mind.

- As October approached, the catastrophic chapters of this story dramatically unfolded. It fills my heart with darkness every moment I open my phone gallery scrolling up to that promising life where I no longer belong. I used to work at Oxford, one of the leading English and training centers in Gaza, mixing commitment with pleasure to dream of a better future. Pursuing my education through a decent scholarship was always the ultimate goal I believed Oxford would secure. I started my "IELTS" preparation when the war knocked on my door with a massive "Hello"! Once Oxford was a target, my work as well as my dreams were shattered, leaving me without a heart and soul.
- Yet, I can't deny that I still consider myself lucky when I bear in mind my older brother's tragic loss. From the very beginning of the war, particularly on October 8th at 1:00 am, we were forced to leave, with empty hearts, our first displacement as Tarek's apartment was harshly annihilated. I can never forget his tears of bitter and deep grief especially when I lately figured out how much it meant to him. He told me that, regardless of his household goods, there was a special room left as a warehouse where he practically had lost his all investment as a newly respected merchant.
- This war didn't forget to show her ugly face to the rest of my family as the latest horrible news and photos arrived. After its military operation in Al-Remal, Israel has completely burned out two apartments: one is the family home, while the second belongs to another brother, Mohammed.
- The war has stolen much more than walls and doors, it has also deprived us of that sacred sense of being safe and peaceful. It left us with a pathetic feeling of loss and despair. During our exhaustive journeys between places that look like anything but home, we ended up with a poor tent where experiencing any simple daily life routine is a challenge. It takes hours to make bread and dozens of kilometers to find drinkable water. In simple words, life here is unbearable hell.
- This campaign is only meant to secure a temporary departure to Egypt to seek safety that since October the 7th and under all these relentless bombings, turned out to be a myth in Gaza.

Our home has been destroyed and my husband's workplace has been bombed. We have nothing left in Gaza. I don't know how we will start from scratch again. There are no words to describe this deep pain. Our house was not just a house, it was for an entire family, consisting of 5 floors. We worked very hard to build it. In one moment, the effort of years vanished and its memories faded. Everything became ashes! Your generosity will help us stand on our feet again. This is a picture of our house before and after.

- My husband and his family have been displaced several times and survived from died miraculously. Now he and 45 members of his family are on land (an open place) in Khan Yunis. They have built several tents in it made of nylon, but unfortunately they do not protect them from the extreme cold. This is a picture showing the place they are
- There are many children with them. They have been infected with epidemics such as smallpox, lice, mosquitoes, and diarrhea due to the lack of hygiene in the place. You can imagine all this large number in one small bathroom. Each person waits for the other until it is his turn to enter the bathroom. There is no shower for bathing. They suffer from high and crazy prices of necessities and foodstuffs, there is no electricity, no clean water, no gas for cooking, and no internet.
- Whoever gets sick cannot find medicine for him. Life in Gaza has become unbearable and very difficult without a husband. Everything is beyond my ability, even my husband and his family are able to leave Gaza through the Rafah crossing they have to pay \$10,000 per person. We will also need a lot of money to rebuild what was destroyed by the occupation. I hope you will help me by donating or publishing according to your ability.

Especially since they can't afford to buy medicine to treat their conditions. My elderly mother was found laying unconscious in the street several times due to her heart conditions, while searching for medicine, water or food. My 12 year old nephew, Taim, was hit by shrapnel from an explosive while searching for food and water. The shrapnel is lodged in his skull and he is in need of surgery, one he cannot obtain at the remaining overcrowded hospitals due to a shortage of supplies and staff. Taim is currently suffering from fainting episodes and frequent headaches from his injuries.
- My other nieces and nephews are not only physically sick due to the contaminated drinking water, they are also emotionally exhausted from the horrors they have witnessed. They can barely afford to eat a single meal a day and are slowly starving to death. The money I am currently able to send them is barely keeping them alive since the war has caused the cost of goods to become hyper inflated.
- We will use your kind donations to send them funds for food, clothing, sheltering supplies, and medicine and evacuate them out of Gaza. In the event that this war ends soon, or they are lucky enough to be evacuated, any funds remaining from this page will go towards helping them rebuild a new life.

- Symptoms (Numbness or weakness--Lack of coordination-inability to walk-Partial or complete loss of vision-Prolonged double vision-Blurry vision-Vertigo-Problems with sexual, bowel and bladder function)
- She always needs treatment and painkillers, but there is no kind of medicine like her in Gaza, and she needs constant follow-up, as the seizures are caused by cold, nervousness, malnutrition, stress and fear, The situation, as you know, is very difficult. There is no food, drink, or warm cover.
- My family lives in tents and depends on the simple aid that is distributed sometimes, and there is no other source for them
- My family had their homes completely bombed and destroyed and They were completely burned, and the basic pillars of the building were destroyed (making them unfit for habitation).
- My nieces work to sell some cake to secure food.

## Emergency: Help Evacuate My Family from Gaza (GoFundme)

- My name is Mahmoud Algharabli and I am creating this campaign to raise funds to evacuate my family in Gaza.
- On December 24th, I arrived back to the USA from Egypt full of disappointment and dismay because I'm coming back alone and my mother is not with me. My mother Somaya Algharabli and my family are in Gaza and because I'm a US citizen I have been trying to get them out to Egypt. I arrived in Egypt optimistic because my mother had an immigration interview with the American Embassy in November; I didn't have any doubts that she would be able to leave Gaza. That wasn't the case. She wasn't approved to be added to the list of people leaving Gaza or any of my family members through the American authorities in the borders.
- Today, after trying everything here in the USA and in Egypt, I'm reaching out to you for your support and generosity. I need your help to have my family cross to Egypt. While I have been supporting them in Gaza, I'm not able to cover the amount of money needed to have them cross to Egypt.
- The coordinates and authorities on the borders are asking for at least 7000 dollars EACH PERSON to cross and in addition to the other spending money needed for transportation and other fees.
- My family and I are from Alturkman neighborhood in Alshujayia east of Gaza City. Once the aggression started on Gaza they evacuated and had to move at least three times. They are currently in Rafah, living in a tent on the street. They use public bathrooms in a hospital. Along with my mother, there is my brother, 2 sisters and their kids. They first evacuated to Alrimal neighborhood in Gaza city and about ten days later the building next door was bombed. They evacuated again to Deir Albalah where they shared a small home with other families. At some point, there was at least sixty people in one room, but they didn't mind. They said we're at least safe. About a month later, the families in the area woke up in the middle of the night to heavy bombardment surrounding them. My family left everything behind (which wasn't much). Thirty minutes

later the building they left was bombed (people who stayed behind reported). Finally, they arrived to Rafah but with no destination in mind. On an empty street corner, they built a tent from wood and plastic which cost them \$420. From before sunrise, my family begin their day with starting the fire to keep them warm and use it to cook whatever is available or whatever they find. My nieces and nephews have been sick and without medical attention. I need to feel they are safe and the only way for that is to have them cross to Egypt.

- Somaya Algharabli is a 58 years old math teacher. She has high blood pressure, arrhythmia, asthma and currently the flu. She is running out of medicine and she doesn't have access to any medical care.
- For the past year, my family here in the USA and I talked about what our life would look like when my mother comes to stay with us after we applied for immigration for her. We arranged for her own room. My wife has filled the room's closet with things for my mother like blankets, towels, and even hair clips "for when khalti (my mother in law) comes" she said. When we found out that the embassy sent an appointment for my mother, we felt these plans were finally going to happen. The USA authorities have failed us. For that, we're going a different route and we need your help with it.
- I have lost many family members during this war. I don't want to experience anymore loss. With your help, we will arrange for the money to be sent to my uncle in Egypt and he will take care of arranging for my mother, siblings (1 brother and 2 sisters) and their kids to be added to the list of people leaving Gaza.

- Here is their story.
- "Hello, my name is Muhammad Osama Alzaq.
- Before the war, I was a Taxi Driver, delivering general household goods to families in Gaza.
- I am married and I have a family consisting of my wife Israa, 25 years old, myself, 29 years old and three children. My oldest daughter, Tala, is 4 years old, my middle daughter, Rahaf, is two and a half years old, and my little daughter, Hala, is just 8 months old.
- We used to live in northern Gaza in a warm house, but because of the war, we were displaced under bombardment to southern Gaza, in the Rafah area.
- We now live in tents and it is very cold here.
- We suffer from some diseases because of the cold, and living in tents and poor conditions. We are also suffering from malnutrition.
- My children need diapers, milk, and good food, warm clothes, and we cannot buy the food supplies we need due to very, very high prices.
- I do not have any work or any income during this war, which we have been suffering from for more than 5 months.
- We travel very long distances just to try to obtain water. This is always very dangerous for us, because of the bombardments and the killings.
- I hope that you will stand with us and help us in light of this criminal war.
- I cannot buy for my family because of the high prices, we are especially desperate for support with this.
- Life is very hard and unbearable everyday. We fear for our lives from the bombing and from cold and hunger.
- Everyday there is a new massacre, which is very distressing and traumatic, especially for my children, as they do not understand what is happening here.
- Please help us to leave Gaza and cross the Egyptian border.
- We are to raise €75000
- We need to raise funds for the five of us to cross and fees to do this are very high.
- €10000 per adult person and €5000 for children, just to pass through, which will amount to €35,000.
- The extra €45,000 will be to support us to be able to pay for food, shelter, either through starting to rebuild a new home, if a permanent ceasefire will come, if not it will be used for temporary accommodation after crossing the border, which will enable us to get on our feet and cover the cost of living essentials needed to survive, whilst we must stay here, as we may have to

- remain here for many months. Although, the prices are so high to live here daily. A simple bag of flour alone costs 460 sheqals (£100.00/€128.57)
- Right now, I haven't been able to plan anything past keeping my family safe and us crossing the Egyptian border, where we will be safe from the bombs and the shootings.
- This is our first point of call.
- At the moment we are stuck here, between life and death.
- I beg you, as a father to three beautiful children, please help us.
- All donations big and small will be highly appreciated and will contribute one step closer towards our safety and freedom.
- I thank you very much for your compassion and empathy in advance.
- Your kindness will forever be remembered.
- God bless all of you who are trying to help us during these very difficult times"

# Escape From War Nightmare: Support Gazan Family (GoFundme)

- Hello, my name is Mohammad Wishah (22). With a heavy heart, I'm reaching out from the heart of Gaza to plea for urgent assistance with our dire situation (my family and I). I share with you our story of suffering during over 160 days of war, fleeing several times, losing our house, being displaced, (losing our income, our education, our work), lack of water, food scarcity, constant threats to our safety and losing our lives.
- It's a plea to help us evacuate to Egypt for safety and rebuild our lives.
- Your support gives us hope for a new beginning amidst the chaos and uncertainty of war.
- We had a home and a family: my father Ashraf (47), my kind and caring mother Samiera (43), Mohammad "me" (22), my dear sister Menna (17), my two young brothers Ramez (14) and Abdullah (12), my cousin Asem (22), and our beautiful cat (2).
- I'm 22, an IT student, and a developer. For the past 4 years, I have been trying to challenge the harsh reality and life's obstacles in Al-Bureij refugee camp in the Gaza Strip. At the end of 2019, I started studying IT at the university and self-learning to improve my skills and, as small steps, to seek a better future for myself and my family. By the end of 2020, I got my first job at a local company, which was an outstanding achievement. I've worked hard and diligently while balancing the burden of my university study and life's difficulties. In May 2023, I got a promising opportunity, which was a big step for me. I was on the verge of more significant things I aspired for.

- But everything changed ...
- The War turned everything upside down and our lives into a nightmare.
- <u>Urgent Appeal To All Vegans Around The World</u>
- October 7th and beyond
- Bombings everywhere and in every direction, direct targeting and killing of civilians, children, and women, targeting homes, residential buildings, infrastructure and economic infrastructure, and destruction of all aspects of life in the Gaza Strip.

#### • Our House and Neighborhood

- Our neighborhood is stormed and destroyed. Dozens of houses near our house have been bombed from all sides until our house is badly damaged. Our area has no infrastructure, electricity poles or connections, landlines, internet, cell towers, water, or sewage, and all lands and roads have been bulldozed. Even the UNRWA clinic that serves the people of the camp was targeted. The camp is uninhabitable.
- Over 160 days of war and displacement
- Since October 7, we have been forced to leave our house 4 times, most recently on October 12, and have been displaced to my aunt's house in Rafah till today, where it currently houses 3 other displaced families.
- I remember when we all ran out in a panic after a sudden warning that a neighboring house was going to be bombed. I remember staying in the house until the last moment, gathering what I could, carrying my laptop bag on my back, a bag of clothes in one hand, and the bag in which I had put our cat in the other. I didn't know how to carry all my things, my souvenirs, my books, my clothes, every piece in my room meant something to me, I didn't know what to take and what to leave, hoping to return to it later. We ran down the street, not knowing what to do or where to go.
- My Mother (Samira, 43) has hyperthyroidism and needs necessary surgery.
- The local company I worked at was destroyed, along with the entire building where it is located, as well as 12 floors of other local companies, media agencies, and workplaces.
- In recent months, my family and I have lost our source of income.
- In the few months before the war, I saved part of my salary for many plans, such as buying a new laptop so that I could work without

- hindrance. Unfortunately, due to displacement and war, our savings had been spent on securing our basic needs, such as water and food.
- My university, Al-Aqsa University, the Khan Yunis branch, which was the largest campus in the Gaza Strip, and the Gaza Branch were both destroyed; it's almost impossible to complete the educational process under such conditions.
- Before October 7th
- A look at the ruins
- My family and I were struggling under life's conditions in the Gaza Strip, going about our lives as much as we could.
- I used to spend most of my days immersed in the work. I've tried to develop my skills, keep up with the latest updates in my field, and build my career one step at a time.
- I have been vegan since 28 March 2020. These days mark the fourth anniversary of my going vegan.
- 4 years of veganism have changed my life and taught me empathy, even in the darkest moments.
- Before the war, I used to make many vegan foods with love and enjoy them.
- But Now, food itself is scarce. There is a Lack of resources and daily living needs!
- Even in the face of war, hunger, genocide and the silence of the world, I won't give up my veganism.
- I used to photograph the sky and sunsets with much passion.
- My mother, Samira (43 years old), is a chef, a member of the Palestinian Chefs Club, and a cooking instructor.
- Despite the difficulties of her hearing impairment, it didn't prevent her from practising her passion for cooking. She competed in competitions in the Gaza Strip and reached the finals. She has many followers on her Instagram page, where she has been posting her recipes and sharing what she made with love. Despite all her obstacles, she established her business at home, where she received orders for baking pastry and preparing desserts. She dreamed of becoming an international professional chef and appearing on world cooking shows and channels.
- My sister Menna (17) is a high school student, and my brothers Ramez (14) and Abdullah (12) are middle school students, they dreamed of nothing more than a normal, safe life.

• My cousin Asem (22 years old), a multimedia student and UI/UX designer, was making his way into his field and freelancing. He had been trying to establish his start-up agency and was about to launch it in early October, days before the war.

#### • The situation in Rafah:

- It's a massively overcrowded area, with over 1.5 million people crammed into 50 km<sup>2</sup> and a very worn-out health and medical situation, as there is no hospital in Rafah to provide medical care.
- A fertile environment for spreading diseases and epidemics, a complete lack of medical services and medicines, contaminated drinking water, lack of water, and streets flooded with dirt and sewage.
- Unfortunately, every day, we hear continuous threats that a military ground operation in Rafah is about to begin. Every day, we feel that the threat is getting closer and greater, especially with the increasing pace of war in Rafah in recent weeks; this makes us feel anxious and concerned about our survival and fate if these threats come true.
- A Desperate Plea for Help. Your Support and Donations can save our lives.
- This Campaign is our last chance and last hope to survive this war. It will help us escape from the war in Gaza and evacuate to Egypt.
- We have patiently waited for the war to end and things to improve. But with no end in sight, we have made this difficult decision.
- 50,000 USD, the cost of coordinating the exit through the Rafah Crossing and Speeding up the process as soon as possible, is about 7,000 USD per person, and there are 7 of us and our cat.
- 4,200 USD to secure temporary housing for the family after arrival.

- 8,000 USD to support Mohamed's university education.
- 4,000 USD to help Menna, Ramez, and Abdullah to complete their school education.

- Also My cat, Simba, grow up in my house. She got used to security, peace and tranquility. She was a symbol of strength with her grey fur. A source of life with her warm feeling. I could not provide food for her because of the war and despite that she did not lose her sense of mercy. She sometimes appeared in quiet moments to provide some warmth and comfort to children who lost their mothers, fathers and homes. This war has mercy on neither animals nor humans.

- All we need is help to leave here and start a new life in a safe place, where I need 5000\$ per person to pay to travel from the Gaza Strip to Egypt and other needs to buy, then I will transfer the travel to a safe place and settle down, my family and I were looking for work.
- I hope you will give what needs to be given to be in a safe place.
- Updated after traveling to Egypt
- My brother in Canada is evacuating us there and will require us after the travel costs:
- Direct financial support in Gaza: this part will go towards providing immediate assistance to my family in Gaza now, due to the high cost of living, which makes it difficult to obtain basic.
- Permit fees and transit fees: required transit expenses and fees at the Egypt-Gaza border in Rafah.
- Temporary residence in Egypt: will cover their basic needs of accommodation, food and other needs during the transitional period in Cairo the time of our stay will depend on the processing times of the Canadian embassy.
- Aviation fund: the funds will be used to purchase air tickets, cover a flight from Cairo to Edmonton.
- Settlement: the funds raised will help settle the family in Edmonton, covering basic expenses such as rent, food, clothes and furniture for the first 6 months.

We suffer from malnutrition, relying on one meal a day, with lack of food and contaminated water. We have miraculously survived death several times, and now we are on the brink of disease and famine. - I'm Sarah and the war is my story
- I'm 23 years old, I have congenital defects in my bones and joints, I had open heart surgery before the war, I was suffering a lot because my movement is limited, but after the war life became very difficult and I couldn't bear it. Everything is difficult to move and sleep. My dream before the war was to go for treatment and see Dr. Hani Abdel Gawad. My father used to pay for my treatment, but everything was destroyed because of the war, my dream was destroyed because of the war, everything that would have made me better was destroyed, please help me.
- My childhood was difficult because I underwent more than 10 orthopedic surgeries and open heart surgery. My pain during the war increases. I cannot live my normal life. Please help me
- When the war started on October 8, the occupation contacted us and the residents of our neighborhood. We who live in the al-Maqusi neighborhood were asked to evacuate immediately, so we fled without thinking. Minutes later, a genocide took place in our neighborhood. We miraculously survived, but our neighborhood was destroyed, and we no longer have a house, it was partially destroyed, and these are pictures of the neighborhood I grew up in, it's a pile of stones.
- The current situation is very difficult, I was displaced with my family three times, once to my uncle, once to my brother's friend, and the last time to Rafah City in a 4×4 room for rent, 8 people sleep in that room, when I sleep I think about whether we will wake up, die, or become pieces and no one will know us. I'm very scared and I don't want to lose any of my family members.
- Despite all this, I'm trying to save my parents from the war in Gaza, that's why I'm currently running a fundraising campaign to raise money

to help them get out of Gaza as soon as possible, I'm trying to save my mom and dad, my older brother and younger sister, my older brother had a newborn baby named Rami and now he is struggling to find milk for him due to the lack of materials in Rafah City, it's up to me to do everything I can to get them out of there and try to move them to the nearest safe haven and this will only happen with your help. I want to leave Gaza City and go to Egypt, knowing that the cost of going to Egypt per person ranges from 5,000 to 7,000 dollars, and my family consists of a large number of 8 people

- We are 8 members every person of us had his life and dreams, each of us dreamed of being safe and stable. Now we don't feel safe and we don't find it anywhere in the Gaza Strip. My father and mother dreamed of seeing us successful, living happily and safely and fulfilling all our dreams
- My older brother got married and has a son whom he wants to protect even with his soul.
- My middle brother recently graduated in September, days before the war, he dreamed and longed to find a job.
- My little sister, in her first year at university, she only went to university for two weeks and her dreams of becoming an accountant were completely destroyed.
- As for me, I had already started my journey of finding myself, so I started a new job and started developing myself in the field of voiceover (cartoon dubbing) specifically.
- All our dreams are on hold, we don't know whether we will be able to complete them or we will continue to suffer from the horrors of war here.
- We were exhausted waiting for the war to end, our house was completely destroyed and burned down.
- We lost all our belongings and personal papers, even our clothes, there was nothing left of the house except rubble.
- We want your help to get out of Gaza please
- We can no longer provide medicine for my mom and dad because they suffer from chronic diseases such as hypertension and diabetes and dad is a heart patient and I, too, my small body can no longer tolerate extreme cold and no longer sleep on the floor due to my condition

## Helping a Family Get Out Of Gaza (GoFundme)

- Hello, I hope you all are doing well!
- My name is Mohamed Monir Ahmad Mahmoud, I'm a hemophilia patient from Gaza. I decided to start this campaign with all the hope that you could support me in evacuating Gaza to do surgery for me and my daughter and start a fresh life with my 5 kids out of the ongoing genocide in Gaza.
- I'm 37 years old and I have been suffering due to the lack of Factor IX in Gaza for years, but since the recent escalation started in Gaza, I didn't have any access to medication or medical care due to the huge number of wounded at the hospital and the destruction of the hospitals that I used to get medicine from (TIKKA Hospital and AlRantisisi Hospital). Besides, I was forced to leave my apartment in Khan Younis due to the bombardment and the Israeli evacuating orders and now I live in a tent in Rafah Streets.
- I was supposed to go out at the end of 2023 to have surgery on my knees but since 7 October, I had no chance due to the procedures on Rafah crossing, the gate of Gazans to the world. Now, my knees and elbows are bleeding with no access to any type of care and if things stand as they are in Gaza, I won't be able to walk or make any effort because of the bleeding (currently I am barely able to set up a small fire in front of the tent to prepare food for my kids).
- The big issue is not me to be honest, it is my elder daughter Sana'a (11 years old), who needs to have surgery on her thigh. She had to do it as soon as

possible because it affects the way she walks. The issue with Sana'a didn't start recently as she was born with it. She went to Jordan, Egypt, and Jerusalem to do surgeries, but it wasn't possible because she needed an advanced medical center that could do surgeries for people who carry the hemophilia gene which she inherited from me.

- I had 4 other kids; 1 girl called Eman 10 years old, and 3 boys; Monir 7 years old, Jameel 5 Years old and Odai 2 years old.
- What I ask is 60,000, for travel costs because each one would need to pay 5,000-8,000\$ to be allowed to leave Gaza through Rafah crossing and we need around 3000\$ more in Egypt for our stay and to obtain visas. We will be heading to Brazil where my brother Diaa lives and there is a huge chance to do the surgeries and access health care as the health care for Hemophilia patients in Brazil is one of the most advanced in the world.
- When we go there, my brother will take care of our stay and our expenses. He also took care of the passports, but since the evacuating costs from Gaza are very high for the whole family, we need your support.

- Lamis is currently pregnant and is expected to give birth in four months. Given the ongoing conflict, the childbirth process poses a significant risk to her life due to the absence of anesthesia, limited medical equipment, and the lack of available hospital facilities.

- I and Lamis dream of our child entering the world and living a normal life with us, experiencing a childhood like any other child worldwide.
- I'm also trying to take care after my parents and sisters.
- My father Nizar (63) Mother Majda (58) and my 2 sisters Saba (24) and Haya (20).. all of them are currently taking refuge in the south of Gaza after losing the family home.
- but leaving isn't a cheap solution. The coordination of the exit from the Rafah crossing to Egypt cost around \$6000 per person, in addition to the initial costs until we can settle down and live, and the taxes extracted by this site and paypal
- We created this campaign to help them leave Gaza to search for opportunities to live and work
- Every single dollar raised will contribute to enabling us to start a new, secure life, where they can raise their child in safety and peace.

#### Help My Two Daughters Escape from GAZA WAR (GoFundme)

- Hello everyone..
- I am Hadeel Mikki from Gaza, Palestine and this is my husband Waseem Mikki, my daughters Mira and Nadia, My mother Tahani Mikki, and my two brothers.
- Here is our story Ever since the morning of the 7th of October, none of our lives have been the same. Everything in our lives has been disrupted. The first night since the beginning of the war, our home got partially destroyed because of a very close Israeli strike.
- Despite the damage, we stayed home for another two weeks until suddenly and without preparation, we were told to evacuate our homes and we'd be in danger. From this moment our endless journey of suffering and pain began.
- Throughout this journey, we later Knew that our home of three floors where my family and my uncle-in-law family live. My uncle family of 5 members did not leave our home and it has got bombed directly and completely destroyed and all of them were martyred.
- My father-in-law his heart could not bear all this pain and all this grief; so he got sick. He found himself living the darkest of realities and through the scarcity of medicine and lack of medical resources in the hospitals, he passed away.
- My husband, Waseem, was very sad, and my daughters missed their grandfather, who used to play with them and bring them toys.
- The situation was very difficult for my children, and my eldest daughter, Mira, kept crying and wanted to go and see her grandfather, and she did not realize that he had gone and would never return.
- So we moved in with my husband, children, and I, full of great sadness, with my mother and two brothers, who are the only survivors of my family; They are all that I have left, and I hope that we will all escape with our lives outside of war and destruction, and that my children will survive. We do not want to lose them.
- Our future has become unknown, our present is unbearable, unlivable by human standards. We're stuck in a harsh reality each moment. We live in a constant state of sounds of explosions, bullets raining down on us, artillery shells, and warplanes dropping destructive missiles on us every day.

- In addition to our ongoing suffering to this day: lack of resources, humanitarian aid, medicine, and food. We can barely find food for my girls, as they eat one meal during the day and spend the rest of the day crying.
- This is my daughters enjoying a life before 7th October.
- But now my princess Mira stay alone all the time remember her previous life, her school, her friends, our beautiful life, and all places we were visited with Mira and Nadia as a beautiful family and still cry I need my school, I need my friends, I need my toys.
- This is the cry of a mother and father. We hope that our children will be given the opportunity to live in peace and security and have access to food and a safe life like the rest of the children of the world everywhere.
