



June 11th Roadless Rule Flight Path Highlights

1. Trout Creek Inventoried Roadless Area (44,034 acres)
 - a. Contains Trout Creek and Jim's Mountain
 - b. Protects numerous clean water tributaries of the Shoshone River
2. Wapiti Valley North Inventoried Roadless Area (18,345 acres)
 - a. Provides wildlife habitat north of Highway 14
 - b. Protect numerous clean water tributaries of the Shohone River
3. Wapiti Valley South Inventoried Roadless Area (43,517)
 - a. Provides wildlife habitat south of Highway 14.
 - b. Protect numerous clean water tributaries of the Shohone River.
4. South Fork Inventoried Roadless Area (64,903 acres)
 - a. Protects numerous clean water tributaries of both the Shoshone and Grey Bull Rivers.
 - b. Contains Carter Mountain which is our next highlight.
5. Carter Mountain (10,485 feet)
 - a. It is protected within the South Fork Inventoried Roadless Area.
 - b. Provides unparalleled and celebrated ungulate habitat and migration routes.
 - c. It is the summer range of the Carter Mountain pronghorn herd, which has the largest migratory elevation change of any pronghorn herd in the state.
 - d. Protects clean water tributaries of the Grey Bull River.
6. Franc's Mountain Inventoried Roadless Area (68,561 acres)
 - a. Contains Franc's Peak (13,140 feet) one of Wyoming highest peaks.
 - b. Protects unique and critical Grizzly habitat for army cutworm moth forage.
 - c. Protects clean water tributaries of the Grey Bull River.

Note: All these areas protect water for millions of people that live in the communities downstream, as well as provide world renowned wildlife habitat that makes up large parts of the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, while also providing the vast spectrum of recreational opportunity that our state is known for. Roadless forests are central to the Wyoming way of life.
