## What is School Site Council (SSC)?

The school site council develops the School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA).

## What is School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)?

The SPSA is a strategic plan that outlines specific and measurable goals at the school site with the intention of increasing student achievement. The SPSA should align with the local educational agency's (LEA's) Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) process as they both help support continuous cycles of action, reflection, and improvement. The SPSA must include funds based on projected allocations from federal funds, and may also include other state or local funds allocated to the school to support student achievement. The SPSA must adhere to all applicable state and federal laws and regulations.

## Who participates in School Site Council?

- Principal or designee
- At least 1 classroom teacher, selected by the teachers
- 1 other school staff member, selected by the school staff members
- At least 3 parents (combination of elementary and secondary parents) or community members, selected by the parents
- At least 1 secondary student, selected by the students

#### What are the meeting requirements?

SSC meetings must follow the Greene Act requirements which include:

- Posting a notice of the meeting at the school site or other appropriate place accessible to the public.
- Being open to the public for the purpose of addressing SSC or any matter under the jurisdiction of the SSC.
- Allowing for questions or brief statements at a meeting that does not have a significant effect on students or employees in the school or school district.
- Providing upon request any meeting materials to any member of the public.

There will be 8 monthly meetings per year, August through April.
