The Generosity Factor: Let's Excel
21 February 2021

Opening Prayer & Check-in

Sunday Morning

Scripture Text: 2 Corinthians 8:1-7

Sermon Preamble: Our message this Sunday morning, we are talking about our treasures. Those of you seasoned enough to remember, there was a marketing campaign for a pair of sneakers that promised to make you run faster and jump higher. Long before Air Jordan's <u>P.F. Flyers</u> were the shoes that many of us begged our parents for. These and similar promises made by marketers are counterfeit. Nevertheless, we all want to do better, be better, and to excel in that which we do; in fact, our visions are unlimited. Having a vision of what it is that we want to accomplish is a good thing. However, the vision we are talking about here is not about fame or fortune, but about catching a glimpse of what God wants to do in this world. We are talking about God-sized visions, God-sized dreams in the area of excelling in the gracious act of giving.

Looking at **2 Corinthians 8:1-7**, Paul is not pitting the two churches against each other. Nor is he trying to guilt them; for guilt is a poor motivator in that actions taken out of guilt lack staying power. Instead, the Apostle is stoking a vision for them to excel in the gracious act of giving. Paul's commitment to take up this collection for the poor in Jerusalem was an effort which extended many years. Adding to that, if you read **1 Cor 16:2**, you will see that it introduces the model of giving as an act of worship

Biblical Giving Is:

- An Act of Worship
- A Spiritual Service
- A Ministry of Love

We see in <u>Romans 15:30-31</u>, Paul was so committed to collecting these offerings for the poor, that he was willing to risk his life in order to do so.

- The church at Corinth was the first to give
- Paul encouraged them to finish what they'd started; this was not a demand but instead, a heart test

This is not unlike us today, while many of us give with good intentions, the world with its problems tempts us away. Not to mention that the everyday life experiences which happen and takes away our fiscal focus. You see, every financial decision is a spiritual decision.

Macedonian Generosity

- Gave despite hard circumstances; persecution and poverty
- Gave out of overflowing, abundant joy (of which they were rich in)
- Gave sacrificially
- Gave of their own free will
- Regarded giving is a privilege

2 Corinthians 8:5

- They gave of themselves first and everything else flowed from this
- They caught God's vision for the poor
- Their inside out giving came from a fire in their bones
- A warm glow of satisfaction (a real thing) was a byproduct of the generosity of God towards them

2 Corinthians 8:19

- Jesus made and is the ultimate sacrifice thus, we can emulate His generosity
- Like us, the Corinthians were not materially rich but instead, rich in the blessings of God
- We should not be lacking in zeal when it comes to being generous nor take for granted the Source of our being able to give, He is worthy of our praise

Worthy of Worship

- We need fo fill our praise meters to overflow
- Individually, we want to excel in response to God's generosity towards us
- Collectively, we as a church must excel to be more and to do more in terms of God's generosity
- It is never about us, it is about what God is doing and what we are doing to make His name great

The Generosity Two-Step

- Step I, Reflect on God's Goodness in Gratitude
 - o The Tim Ambrose Gratitude Stack
 - A Gratitude First 50
 - Our God is generous; He's just that good
- Step II
 - Become a First-Time giver; to the church or an agency aligned to God's calling on your life;
 see <u>Luke 6:38</u>
 - Become a Constant Giver, try this for a few months and share how God responds
 - Become a Tither; 10 percent is the goal but, start where you are and proceed with intention so you progress to that point; for our giving does not go unnoticed by God
 - Become an Extravagant Giver; allow generosity to flow as this makes for crazy joy

One more thing...

If we each do our part individually imagine how the collective church (SBCC) becomes an even greater tool in the hands of God
