First Semester Completion Checklist - College Items

FAFSA: ☐ Student has submitted their FAFSA application & received their Student Aid Report with an Expected Family Contribution (log into FAFSA.gov to check for the Student Aid Report if you're unsure. Expected Family Contribution can be 00000 but should have a number, if left blank that indicates there is an error in the FAFSA that needs to be resolved). ☐ Student has loaded in their college list to the FAFSA; there is space for 10 schools and schools can be added/removed if student has already been receiving rejection/acceptance letters. Prioritize schools on the FAFSA first as accepted, then as waiting to hear, and remove any schools to which the student has been rejected.
A note about EFC: If the EFC has an asterisk next to the number (EFC=00000*), the student is being <i>verified</i> . This is not a bad thing, but means the student will need to submit extra paperwork at <i>every</i> school where they've been accepted before the school will send their financial aid award letter. Have the student check the online portal at colleges and/or call the financial aid department to get insight on how to download and submit the verification paperwork.
Applications ☐ Student has submitted applications to all schools on their list. ☐ Suggestion: Apply to 1-2 Safety Schools (will more than likely be accepted, student's GPA and ACT fall above average range for school), 3-4 Match Schools (60-70% chance of acceptance, student's GPA and ACT falls within average range for school), and 1-2 Reach Schools (smaller chance of getting in, student's GPA and ACT fall slightly below average range for school).
 Application Follow-Up: Student has checked the online portal for all schools to which they've applied to check for application status (are there any missing items?). Student has checked the online portal for all school to which they've been accepted to check for financial aid status and any missing items – are they being verified? Is there extra paperwork they need to submit? Has the school received their FAFSA?
 Scholarships: □ Develop a list of scholarships to apply for, their requirements, and the deadlines. □ Suggestion: Before the end of senior year, students should apply to a <i>minimum</i> of 5-10 scholarships - the more you apply for, the better your chances of making your dream school affordable!
