In case you might be wondering, the Feeder Festival is a singing celebration and performance of all the elementary schools that feed Mountain Vista along with both the MRMS and MVHS choirs.

Each school is partnered up with two others and together, they each sing two songs. This year those songs are called "Redbird" and "Firework." There is also the grand finale called "Sisi No Moja" that everyone sings together (which should be around 300 singers).

After you drop your kids off around 9:45, they group up and practice for a little while with their partner schools (in our case, that means Heritage and Copper Mesa Elementaries).

Pretty soon a group of high school mentors come to take them away and eat pizza and play games with them. This is usually the best part of the day:)

The kids receive a t-shirt to wear that day that I'll give that week before the event.

There is a \$10/singer registration fee that is covered in the choir fee that was paid when you signed your student up for choir.

After the kids eat, everyone gathers in the gym and all the kids perform for their parents and families. The concert starts at 12:00 and is over sometime between 1:15 and 1:30.

It is a rare opportunity that elementary age kids get to spend so much time with their middle and high school peers that it really adds a special community flavor to the event.
