Junior Planning Checklist

Spring

- Meet with your counselor during registration. Make sure you review graduation requirements/credits. Ask about Early Graduation if interested!
- Take the SAT/ACT (Dates listed below). The ACT will be administered to all juniors for free.
 - o SAT March 8th, May 3rd, June 7th
 - o ACT dates February 8th, April 5th, June 14th, July 12th
 - **o** Students are eligible for SAT/ACT fee waivers if they are on free/reduced lunch and/or meet economic guidelines. See your counselor for more information.
- Research colleges (<u>www.cfnc.org/www.collegeboard.org</u>)
 - Visit college campuses Juniors get one educational leave day for college visits.
- Develop a resume and fill out bragsheet. Templates for both found here:

 - **o** Make a list of teachers to ask for recommendations you can ask them to write the letters at the end of your junior year. Send your resume and bragsheet to teachers and counselor by the end of this year.

- Start college applications Applications typically open around beginning of August.
- Complete Residency Determination https://ncresidency.cfnc.org/residencyInfo/
- Start researching financial aid and scholarships (www.cfnc.org, www.collegeboard.org)

Fall

- Ask teachers and counselors for college recommendation letters and send bragsheet/resume
- Complete college applications (Early deadlines are mid-October)
- Re-take SAT or ACT if necessary
- Fill out the FAFSA starting December 1, 2025

Brag Sheet and Resume

These are two important aspects to the college application process. It is the way that your teachers/counselors will be able to write strong recommendations for you.
