A Resolution to Mandate Anti Indigeneity Trainings

WHEREAS, Indigenous students constitute one of the smallest racial groups within the UC and often lack the proper support mechanisms in order to sustain ourselves on our campuses.

WHEREAS, Indigeneity is about more than just ancestry, it is about cultural connection and belonging. In acknowledgment of how colonization has separated many of us from our Indigenous communities.

WHEREAS, Indigenous students face compounded levels of violence due to the nature of our intersectional identities. Native women and non-men are especially targeted for violence despite their role as mothers, nurturers, and leaders of our liberation movements.

WHEREAS, Indigenous people globally face oppression on the basis of identity and environmental conservation efforts.

WHEREAS, We as Indigenous people cannot be removed from our land, water, and sky. It is intrinsic to our being and humanity and must be recognized.

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the UCSA staff work with the relevant organizational allies to draft and enact an anti Indigeneity training,

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED that the UCSA work to increase awareness of how anti indigeneity manifests in our day-to-day political life through social and print media campaigns.



THEREFORE LET IT FINALLY BE RESOLVED that the incoming Board of Directors, President, and Board Chair shall make a consistent and intentional effort to remove all anti-Indigeneous language from the board space.
