Targeted Social Emotional Skills Support

OVERVIEW & OBJECTIVES

School wide positive behavior supports (SWPBS) officers are responsible for helping on duty teacher staff and/or Student Activity Supervisors to recognize and reward students who are demonstrating positive behaviors on the school campus. Officers should be assigned a “shift” to work (e.g.; once a week before school, two days a week at lunch, every day after school, etc.), be given some sort of identification to wear (e.g.; safety vest, lanyard, etc.), and have school wide positive behavior tokens/tickets to pass out. This intervention is particularly helpful for students who have difficulty following expectations during the “shift” they are given. Giving students a role during that time should help provide them an additional level of structure during a less structured time, reinforce expectations for appropriate behavior, and incentivize on task behavior.

RESOURCES NEEDED

1. **Intervention Leader:** Assigns officers to shifts, trains officers, supervises, organizes, facilitates, and supports the officers. Maintains group records. Trains other adults (SAS staff/on duty teachers) as needed.
2. **Schedule:** A set schedule of officers and shifts that on duty and SAS staff have access to.

PROCEDURES

1. Assign leader and officers, and create officer's schedule
2. Train on duty and SAS staff and provide them with fidelity logs
3. Provide training to officers
4. Maintain the officer's log
