Title I Information For SVE Families

What is the Title I?

Title I of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA/ESEA) is a federal funding program designed to close achievement gaps and ensure that all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education. Part A, the largest part of the program, allocated funding to districts and other local agencies (LEAs) according to a formula based on numbers/percentages of children from low-income families.

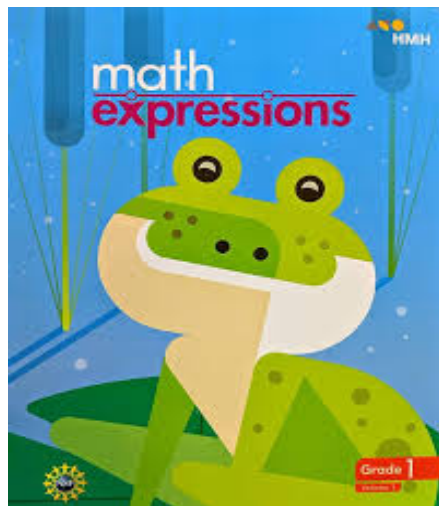
Many schools receiving Part A funding operate **Schoolwide Programs**, implementing overall school improvements to ensure that systems, practices, and programs are effectively aligned to reduce gaps and support every student's achievement. **Spring Valley Elementary School (5K-5)** is Schoolwide Title I.

Core Requirements for Schoolwide Programs

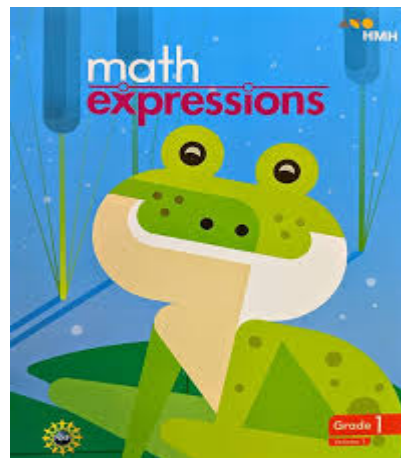
- A comprehensive needs assessment that identifies the school's strengths and challenges in key areas affecting student achievement.
- A comprehensive plan for long-term improvement, created with stakeholders and designed to address identified needs.

- Regular evaluation of the program and updating of the plan as necessary.
- Appropriately licensed teachers and qualified professionals.
