Established by State Statute 16-331, the Cable TV Advisory Council of Eastern Connecticut is the Cable TV Advisory Council for the cable tv franchise area that includes East Lyme, Griswold, Killingly, Montville, New London, Plainfield, Putnam, Sterling, Waterford. The advisory council meets six times per year with Breezeline to provide advice on customer service issues and Community Access TV procedures. The council is seeking new members. Members are appointed by each town's chief elected official and by each Board of Education.
