7th Grade Tracking Your Reading Rubrics

Each week, we will choose a way to track and reflect on our reading. You can either complete a traditional reading log with tracked moments as you read, or you can write a review of the reading you've done. The expectation for the amount you are reading is the same. The key difference is how you process and share that reading.

At least three times a week, I will prompt you to update your reading log on Biblionasium! Usually, our reading logs or reviews will be due on Mondays, so you will have a full 7 days of reading for each.



- Quotes that seemed important from the text
- A one-sentence summary ("In my reading today...")
- A one-sentence prediction ("I think that...")

- What did you think of the main character?
- What was interesting or unique about this book?
- Did this book remind you of any other books, movies, or shows?
- What is the general mood of the book?
