# 2022 80,000 Hours user survey results — summary of results relevant to CEA

# Summary

## Impact of 80k, CEA, and other EA resources on respondents' career plans

- EA programmes (besides 80k) that ALSO influenced people's careers: 59% of respondents said (in addition to 80k) CEA had influenced their career plans. See the full list <a href="here">here</a>.
- EA/EA-related resources that were MOST influential on respondents' careers: 61% said 80k was most influential, and 7% said CEA was most influential.
- CEA programmes/resources that were influential: 64% of respondents said the EA Forum had been influential, 44% said EAG had been influential, 37% said the EA newsletter had been influential, 35% said GWWC had been influential, and 2% said EA Funds had been influential.
- CEA programmes/resources that were MOST influential: 48% of respondents said the EA Global was most influential, 25% said the EA Forum was most influential, 8% said the EA newsletter was most influential, 5% said GWWC was most influential, and 8% said EA Funds had been influential. [small sample sizes]

#### **Demographics**

- **Gender:** 66% of respondents were men, 32% of respondents were women, 3% identified as something besides man or woman
- Age: 47% of respondents were between the ages of 25 and 34, 22% were between 35 and 44, 18% were between 18 and 24, 12% were between 45 and 64, and the rest were under 18 or over 65
- Race/ethnicity: 72% of respondents were White, 12% were Asian, 7% identified as mixed race, 3% were hispanic, and the rest were spread across other categories
- **Highest level of education:** 37% of respondents have a college degree, 34% have a Masters, 17% have a PhD, 5% have a professional degree, and 5% have only completed high school.

#### Learning about 80k and EA

- **Learning about 80k:** 12% heard about it from an EA-related blog or website. 8% heard about it from a local EA group. *Note that the sample size for this question ended up being very small because of a glitch with our survey software.*
- Learning about EA: 61% of respondents had already heard about EA when they encountered 80k. 5% learned about it through a local or university EA group, 4% learned about it through LessWrong. 14% learned about it through "Other." I've only skimmed the "Other" responses, but it looks like the most common "Other" sources were: 80k sponsorship (YouTube mention / newsletters from e.g.: Ali

Abdaal, Tim Ferriss, Tom Scott), Newspaper article (Economist, Guardian, Washington Post, BBC), Making Sense/Waking Up, Peter Singer.

#### Engagement with EA

- Level of engagement with EA: 15% of respondents have a high level of engagement with EA, 23% have considerable engagement, 34% have moderate Engagement, 24% have mild engagement, and 4% had no engagement.
- Cause prioritisation: 59% of respondents think AI safety and AI policy are among the world's most pressing problems. 57% said X-Risk, 49% said climate change, 47% said poverty and health, 46% said biorisk reduction, 42% said longtermism, 37% said building EA, and 36% said nuclear weapons.



#### EA-related resources people report as influential on their careers/plans



#### The bulk of respondents rated 80,000 Hours as most influential on their careers/planning



## CEA resources people report as influential on their careers/plans






## Gender of respondents


## Age of respondents

## Racial/ethnic identification of respondents



Highest completed education of respondents





How did you first hear of 80,000 Hours?<sup>1</sup>


## How did people hear of 80k?





## How did people hear of EA depending on Engagement?



At the point when 80,000 Hours played its role in your involvement in effective altruism, which of the following applied to you? (Check all that apply)


# What situation were people in regarding EA when they encountered 80k?

#### Do respondents broadly agree with EA?




## Level of engagement with EA

- No engagement: I've heard of effective altruism, but do not engage with effective altruism content or
  ideas.
- Mild engagement: I've engaged with a few articles, videos, podcasts, discussions, or events on effective altruism (e.g. reading Doing Good Better or spending ~5 hours on the 80,000 Hours website).
- Moderate engagement: I've engaged with multiple articles, videos, podcasts, discussions, or events on effective altruism (e.g. subscribing to The 80,000 Hours Podcast or attending regular events at a local group). I sometimes consider principles of effective altruism when I make decisions about my career or charitable donations.
- Considerable engagement: I've engaged extensively with effective altruism content (e.g. attending an EA Global conference, applying for career coaching, or organising an EA meetup). I often consider the principles of effective altruism when I make decisions about my career or charitable donations.
- **High engagement:** I am heavily involved in the effective altruism community, perhaps helping to lead an EA group or working at an EA-aligned organisation. I make heavy use of the principles of effective altruism when I make decisions about my career or charitable donations.
