Kindred efforts: toward a "network of networks"

There are a set of initiatives, institutions, and nascent networks emerging around the world that share a common set of principles: embracing the frame of emergence; prioritizing connection and relationships; connecting internal (personal), societal, and systems transformation; centering equity, contesting power and rejecting systems of domination and oppression; and co-creating powerful new alternative models (prefigurative world-building) for both *how* we work and *what* we do.

There is a need to support and nurture this growing ecosystem: to invest both in these individual emergent networks and in supporting our efforts to partner with and learn from each other. A rough typology of several networks/initiatives that I (Brian Stout) have identified as kindred spirits follows:
