What is the Weld RE-4 Universal Scholarship Application?

- This scholarship application offers Weld RE-4 seniors the opportunity to apply for up to thirteen different local scholarships.
- “Local” means that the scholarships that are listed are **ONLY FOR SENIORS WHO WILL GRADUATE FROM SEVERANCE HIGH SCHOOL OR WINDSOR HIGH SCHOOL IN THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR.** (Seniors who graduate in December 2025 may apply.)
- “Universal Scholarship Application” means that you are filling out ONE application for MULTIPLE scholarships. Each scholarship has different criteria and may have additional requirements.

Universal Scholarship Submission Tips:

- Access your transcript through your Campus Portal account. Go to “Documents”, then choose “Counselor Transcript Weighted”. This is the transcript that you will upload to your application.
- Student Number is found in the upper right hand corner, directly under your name.
- GPA and Class Rank are found in the top left corner of your transcript. Report the “Weighted GPA” on your application.
- Your SAT score can be found on your transcript under the heading “Standard Tests”
- READ REQUIREMENTS FOR EACH SCHOLARSHIP THOROUGHLY as you work through the application!
- There are two sections below. The [first section](#) shows scholarships that are available to seniors graduating from Severance High School *and* Windsor High School. The [second section](#) shows scholarships that are available *only* to students from Windsor High School.

- Upon successful submission, you will receive a copy of your responses. Responses may not be edited after submission. It is recommended that you have ALL responses and documentation ready to upload and submit in one session. - 4.0 GPA or higher
- Upload: Letter of recommendation that speaks specifically to your community service and is from a community member.

- Open to students from Windsor High School and Severance High School

H.J. Dudley Scholarship

During that time, he also coached many sports, and during the last years before his retirement, served as the Athletic Director. Following retirement, he continued to help with and/or attend numerous activities at WHS. The student must have a continuous, active commitment to community service and must be taking or have completed the highest level of coursework in three of the following areas:

- Mathematics (Calculus I, Calculus II, AP Calculus)
- Science (AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics)
- English (English Composition I, English Composition II, AP English Literature & Composition, AP Language & Composition)
- Social Studies (AP US Government and Politics, AP US History)

Brown-Ruff Vocational/Trades Scholarship

Description:

The Brown-Ruff Vocational/Trades Scholarship was established by Liesa Brown and Cydney & Chris Ruff, who are deeply committed to supporting students pursuing careers in the skilled trades.

Cydney and Chris are the proud parents, and Liesa is the proud aunt, of four Windsor High School graduates. They recently celebrated the graduation of a nephew from Windsor High School in 2025 and look forward to celebrating a niece's graduation in 2027.

This scholarship is intended to assist students who plan to attend vocational or trade schools and pursue certification in fields such as barbering, esthetics, auto/diesel mechanics, plumbing, electrical work, carpentry, HVAC, welding, and other skilled trades. The Brown-Ruff Vocational/Trades Scholarship will be awarded to one recipient annually, with a focus on providing opportunities for students who may not typically qualify for traditional college scholarships. To ensure inclusivity, the scholarship has a minimum GPA requirement of 2.5.

With two children who work in the trades, the Brown and Ruff family recognizes the importance of vocational education and the growing demand for skilled tradespeople. With the vast majority of scholarships focused on college-bound students, they hope this scholarship will help bridge the gap and support those pursuing essential careers in the trades.

Colberg Family Scholarship

Description:

This scholarship is established in memory of Craig S. Colberg, MD, by his wife, Denise, who taught at Windsor Middle School for 21 years and daughter, Callie, who taught at WMS for 16 years and moved to Ridgeline Middle School in 2025. As much as Craig loved his medical practice, he equally loved his role as an instructor for third-year medical students and family practice residents. He was extremely grateful for the many fine educators he had throughout his life who provided him with the education he needed to realize his goal of becoming a doctor.

This scholarship will be awarded to a student graduating from Windsor High School who intends to pursue a degree in either the teaching or health care field while attending a Colorado college or university. This is a merit-based scholarship meant to recognize a student of integrity who has demonstrated active involvement in their school.

- Windsor High School students only
- Minimum GPA 3.0
- Pursuing a degree in health care or education at a Colorado college or university
- Upload: Short essay outlining your goals and aspirations for the future including the name of the post-secondary institution selected, and intended area of study. 500 word maximum.
- Upload: Letter of Recommendation from a community member (not the student's teacher or coach), who knows the applicant.
- Upload: Letter of Recommendation from a WHS teacher/coach/counselor who knows the applicant.
- Students with involvement in their school community will be given preference

Dale valued his education and connections to the school district. The district valued Dale's commitment to his community. Focus on students interested in or have shown a strong interest in agricultural careers. These careers are not limited to farming and ranching. Careers may also involve many agricultural related businesses, service, and other career opportunities. Students interested in computer sciences may also be considered. If there are no qualified applicants in agriculture or computer science related fields, all students may be eligible to win this scholarship.

George Tozer Scholarship

Description:

George E. Tozer served Windsor schools for 44 years, from 1919 to 1963, first as principal and later as superintendent. In 1918, Windsor High School was constructed, with Mr. Tozer serving as its first principal. In recognition of his many years of dedication to education, Tozer Elementary School was built in 1961 and named in his honor. The scholarship recipient will be chosen based on very strong academic credentials, information contained in the essay outlining their goals and aspirations for the future, leadership qualities, and need.

James R. and Ethel Irene Ferguson Scholarship

Description:

The James R. and Ethel Irene Ferguson Scholarship is awarded in memory of James R. Ferguson, a 1937 graduate of Windsor High School. Dr. Ferguson received his BS in Animal Husbandry from Colorado A&M (Colorado State University). After serving in the Army in WWII, he managed a ranch in California and a farm in Virginia before attending Cornell University, where he received his M.S. and Ph.D. Dr. Ferguson was the first person named to the Maryland Livestock Hall of Fame and was an assistant professor in animal husbandry at the University of Maryland.

The award is based on the qualities of scholarship, leadership, need, personality, character, and promise of success. Although not limited to any college or course of study, preference may be given to applicants who plan to attend Colorado State University, Cornell University, or the University of Maryland, and/or those who plan to study animal science or agriculture.

Special Eligibility Requirements:

- Windsor High School students only
- 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher.
- Upload: Letter of recommendation from a teacher
- Upload: Letter of recommendation from community member, teacher, or coach
- Upload: Short essay outlining your goals and aspirations for the future, including the name of the post-secondary institution selected, and intended area of study. 500 word maximum.
- Upload: Financial statement
- Weighted Class Rank. Student must be in the top 50% of their class.

Award Notes:

- The initial \$1000 scholarship will be awarded for the first semester at a 4-year institution.
