DOG RING 1 entries taken from 10am, class P1 will start at 10.30am Dog Ring 1.

PEDIGREE SECTION Judge : Mrs Tina Ruston, Leeds

Recognised pedigree/ONE pure breed but need not be KC registered. Full list of breeds and their groups available on KC website. No cross breeds in these classes please.

P1 Any variety Gundog or Hound groups

P2 Any variety Utility, Pastoral or Working groups

P3 Any variety Toy or Terrier groups. The Alistair Abrahams Memorial Cup 1994 for the Best Terrier (highest placed) in this class.

P4 Any variety Veteran. 9yrs and over. The Veteran Terrier Cup in memory of Alistair Abraham awarded to the Best Veteran Terrier (highest placed) in this class to be held for one year

P5 Puppy 6-12 months.

P6 Junior 12-24 months

PEDIGREE SECTION CHAMPIONSHIP

1st prize winners from classes 1-6. **The Willow Memorial Trophy** to the Champion Pedigree dog to be held for one year, presented by The Duker family in memory of Willow the German Shepherd (2002 -2017).

COMPANION DOG SECTION in DOG RING 2 Entries for these classes taken at the Dog Ring from 10.30am with class P7 starting when class P4 starts to stop clashing of classes.

P7 JOLLY JUNIOR, 18 months to 3 years

P8 MIDDLE AGE MADNESS, 4 years to 9 years

P9 VIBRANT VETERAN, 10 years and over. The **Henry Jenkins Memorial Trophy** kindly donated by the Graham family to the class winner to be held for one year

P10 **PERFECT PUPPY**, up to 18 months

P11 **BEST “ Designer” BRED**, for dogs where you know what breeds were crossed to get your dog. For example Cockerpoo, Labradoodle, Cavapoo, Springador, Cavachon, etc. any age. Should not enter class 12.

P12 **BEST CROSS BRED**, where the breeding is unknown (Heinz 57), any age. Should not enter class 11.

COMPANION DOG CHAMPIONSHIP

1st prize winners from classes 7-12. **The Princess Phoebe Angelica and Sabrina Furchild Trophy** to the Champion Companion Dog to be held for one year, presented by the Duker family in memory of the twin CKCS's Sabrina (2008-2015) and Phoebe (2008- 2018) to be held for one year.

FUN CLASSES entries taken from 11.30 class P13 will start after class 12 but NOT BEFORE 12 noon

P13 **YOUNG HANDLER**, set of standard tasks (sit, stay, walk to heel on a lead, etc) for handler up to 16 years old (no adult help)

Judges: Classes 14 – 22 Mr Dan Webb & Mr Steve Peyton, Harrogate

P14 **LOVELIEST LASS**, female dogs only

P15 **GORGEOUS GUY**, male dogs only

P16 **BEST SIX LEGS**—human and dog **The McCormick Trophy** awarded to the class winners

P17 **YORKSHIRE'S GOT TALENT** – best freestyle trick or biscuit/sausage catcher (provide own biscuits/sausages)

P18 **BEST RESCUED / REHOMED / FOSTER dog**

P19 **WAGGIEST TAIL**

P20 **FASTEST SIT** (when the music stops)

P21 **PAMPERED POOCH**, fancy dress and/or accessories

P22 **ANY DOG who has NOT won a rosette today (1st- 4th)**

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at Kennel Club licensed events.

- When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route, and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- If your vehicle is not air-conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea.
- The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible, and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade, for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated.
- Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated, and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

Warning: if your dog is found to be at risk, forcible entry to your vehicle may be necessary without liability for any damage caused. Anyone whose dog is at an event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not put a dog's health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Your dog is vulnerable and AT RISK if left in a vehicle in high temperatures and even on days considered as slightly warm. Please take care of your dog.
