### **Abstract ← 12pt, Arial, Bold**

The abstract should be clear, concise, and descriptive. This abstract should provide a brief introduction to the problem, objective of paper, followed by a statement regarding the methodology and a brief summary of results. The abstract should end with a comment on the significance of the results or a brief conclusion. Abstracts are written in 11pt Arial Narrow, about 150-200 words .

**Keywords:** 3-5 keywords separated by comma (,), crucial to the appropriate indexing of the papers, are to be given. e.g.: *Design Research, Thematic, Model Discovery Learning*

**How to Cite:** First, A., Second, A., & Third, A. (year). The title of the manuscript should not be longer than 14 words. *Jurnal Inovasi Sekolah Dasar*, Vol(Issue), first page-last page. <http://doi.org/10.36706/jisd.v8i2.xxxx>

All papers submitted to the journal must be written in good English. Authors whose native language is not English are encouraged to check their papers before submission for grammar and clarity. The official language of the manuscript to be published in Jurnal Inovasi Sekolah Dasar is Indonesian.

The manuscript is typed using word processing software (Microsoft Word or Open Office). The font used throughout the paper is Arial Narrow. The paper size is A4 (i.e., 210 x 297 mm), single column format with 2.5 cm margins on the top, 2.5 cm margins on the bottom, 2.5 cm margins on the left, and 2.5 cm margins on the right. Lines are spaced 1.15, justified. Using pronouns such as I, we, etc. should be avoided.

Manuscripts submitted to this journal must follow the headings below, except for review articles: Title; Author Names; Author Affiliations; Abstract; Keywords; Methods; Results and Discussion; Conclusion; Acknowledgements; and References.

### **INTRODUCTION ← 13pt, Arial, Bold, UPPERCASE**

The introduction section must contain (in sequence) a general background, a previous literature study (state-of-the-art) as a basis for the statement of the scientific novelty of the article, a statement of the scientific novelty of science, and a research problem or hypothesis. At the end of the introduction, the purpose of the article should be clearly written. In the scientific article format, it is not

permissible to review the literature as in the research report, but it is manifested in the form of a previous study review (state-of-the-art) to demonstrate the scientific novelty of the article.

## **METHOD ← 13pt, Arial, Bold, UPPERCASE**

The method section must contain research designs, research subjects, instruments, data collection procedures, and data analysis. It should be presented in the form of a paragraph. Charts and tables must be placed in the center (centered). Each table or figure must be positioned at the top or bottom of the page. The inclusion of the table or figure must be mentioned in the sentence.

### **Table**

Tables are numbered sequentially with a table title and number above the table. Tables should be centered in a column OR on the page. Tables should be followed by line spacing (11pt). Table elements should be single-spaced, but double-spacing may be used to indicate the grouping of data or to separate sections within a table. Table titles should be at 11pt. Tables are referred to in the text by the table number. Example: Table 1. Do not show vertical lines in tables. Only horizontal lines should be shown within tables.

### **Equation, Formula**

Equations should be numbered serially in brackets as shown in Equation (1). Equations should be prepared using MS Equation Editor (not in image format). Equation numbers should be placed on the far right side.

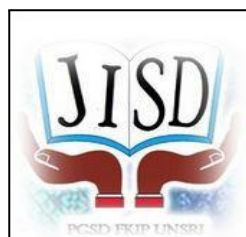


Figure 1. Jisd

## **RESULTS AND DISCUSSION ← 13pt, Arial, Bold, UPPERCASE**

The results contain research findings obtained from the research data and hypotheses. The results and discussion section can be divided into several sub-sections.

### **Sub-section**

Results should be clear and concise. They should summarize (scientific) findings rather than provide detailed data. Please highlight differences between your results or findings and previous publications by other researchers.

The discussion should explore the significance of the work, not repeat it. A combined Results and Discussion section is often appropriate. Avoid extensive citations and discussions of published literature.

In the discussion, this is the most important part of your paper. Here you have the opportunity to sell your data. Make the discussion relevant to the results, but do not repeat the results. It should often begin with a summary of the main scientific findings (not the experimental results). The following components should be addressed in the discussion: How do your results relate to the original question or aim outlined in the Introduction (what)? Do you provide a scientific interpretation for each of your results or findings presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what other researchers have reported (what else)? Or are there any discrepancies?

## **CONCLUSION ← 13pt, Arial, Bold, UPPERCASE**

The Conclusion should address the purpose of the study. Tell how your work advances the field from the current state of knowledge. Without a clear Conclusion, reviewers and readers will have difficulty assessing the work, and whether it is worthy of publication in a journal. Do not repeat the Abstract, or simply list the results of an experiment. Provide a clear scientific justification for your work and indicate possible applications and extensions. You should also suggest future experiments and/or indicate ongoing experiments.

## **Acknowledgment ← 12pt, Arial, Bold**

Recognize those who helped in the research, especially those who funded your research support. Include people who have helped you in your study: Advisors, Financial Supporters, or perhaps other supporters i.e. Proofreaders, Typos, and Suppliers who may have provided materials.

## **REFERENCES ← 13pt, Arial, Bold, UPPERCASE**

The bibliography is a list of written works that the author reads in preparing his/her article and then uses as a reference. In scientific articles, a Bibliography must be present as a complement to references and reference source instructions. Writing a Bibliography follows the APA Style 7 version rules. Writing a bibliography uses an automatic citation application (Mendeley, Zetero, and the like) and citing at least 2 articles in Jurnal Inovasi Sekolah Dasar. Here is an example of writing (12pt):

### Online Submission Guidelines

Authors must first register as Authors and/or be offered as Reviewers through the following address: <http://JISD.ejournal.unsri.ac.id/index.php/JISD/login>

Authors must fill out the form as detailed as possible where the asterisked form must be entered. After all the form text boxes are filled, the Author clicks the “Register” button to continue the registration. Therefore, the Author is taken to the online author submission interface where the Author must click “New Submission”. In the Start New Submission section, click “Click Here”: to proceed to the first step of the five-step submission process”.

The following are the five steps in the online submission process:

**Step 1 - Start Submission:** Select the appropriate journal section, namely Original Research Article, Review Article, or Short Communication. Accordingly, the author must check the submission checklist.

**Step 2 – Uploading Submission:** To upload a manuscript to this journal, click Browse on the Upload submission file item and select the manuscript document file to be submitted, then click the Upload button. Please ensure that the manuscript file has been uploaded.

**Step 3 – Entering Submission Metadata:** In this step, detailed author metadata should be entered including the corresponding author marked. After that, the manuscript title and abstract should be uploaded by copying the text and pasting it in the text box including keywords.

Step 4 – Uploading Additional Files: Additional files should be uploaded including Cover Letter/Submission, and Signed Copyright Transfer Agreement Form. Therefore, click the Browse button, select the files, and then click the Upload button.

Step 5 – Confirming Submission: The author should finally check the manuscript document uploaded in this step. To submit the manuscript to Jurnal Inovasi Sekolah Dasar, click the Finish Submission button once the documents are correct. The corresponding author or primary contact will receive an email notification and will be able to view the submission's progress through the editorial process by logging into the journal's web address. After submission, the author who submitted the manuscript will receive an email confirmation of the submission. Therefore, the author can track the status of his/her submission at any time by logging into the online submission interface. Submission tracking includes the status of the manuscript's review and editorial process.
