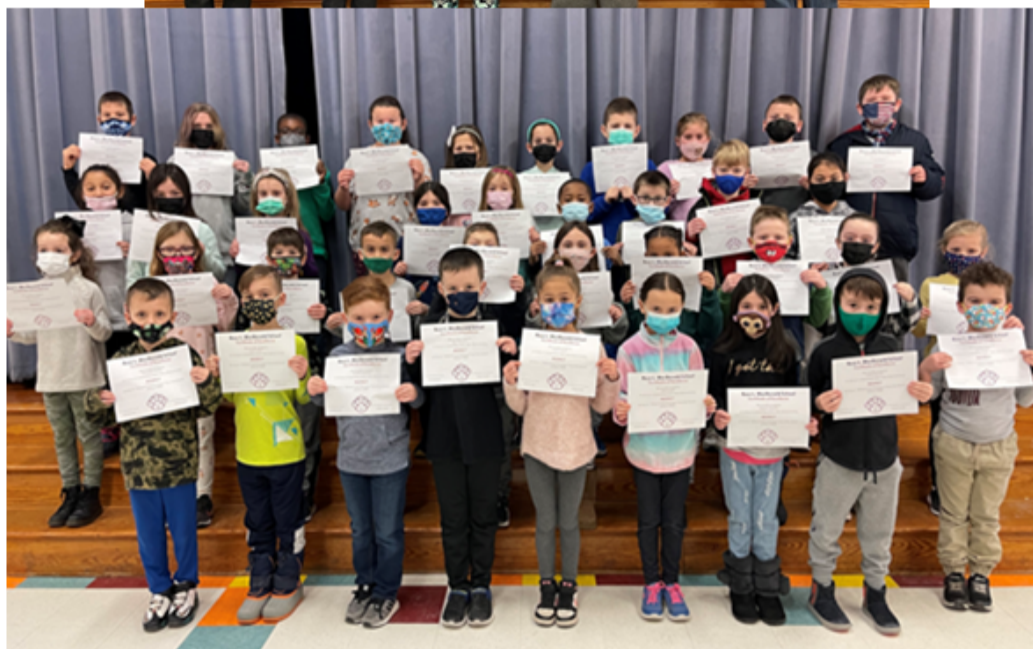
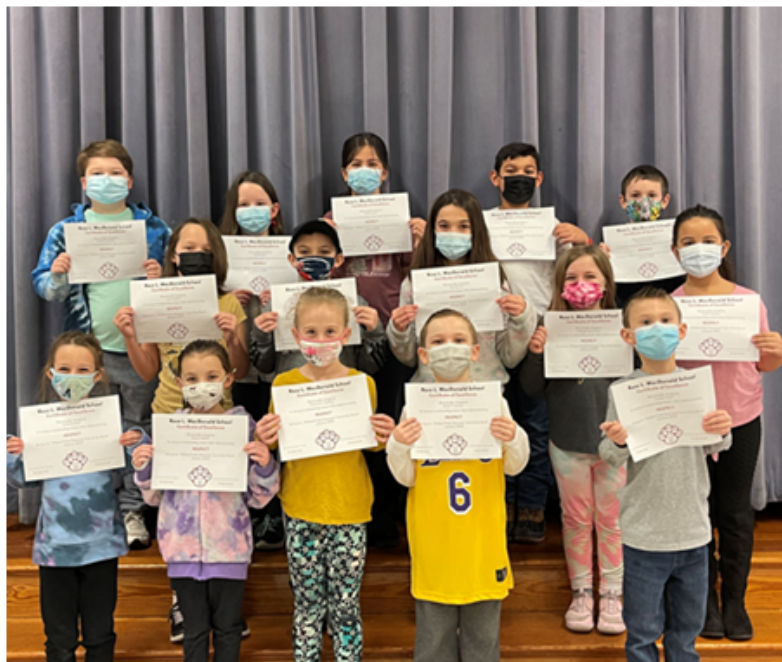




Rose L. MacDonald Pride Program
