In making predictions, we need to do two things; First, we need to use the clues in the pictures and second, we may use our own experiences or simply what we know about it. If these two are combined, we can make relevant predictions about the book cover.

EXAMPLE:



Prediction: I think the story is about the girl and her pet turtle.

You think that the story is about the girl and her pet turtle because of the drawing seen on the cover page.



Prediction: The story is about the students and the teacher.

You predict that the story is about the students and the teacher because of what you see on the picture.

the title may tell the main story, pictures and images are also helpful elements in predicting what the story may be about. As such, by looking at the pictures or images on book covers, you will be able to predict the story that it tells.

Example: If the cover shows picture of a farm, the story may be about a farmer or a farm (including farm plants and animals).
