FOR ALL STUDENTS:

- **Be informed:**
 - Get in the habit of checking your school email often.

- **Connect:** Visit College Recruiters/Armed Forces/Business Professionals when they come to your campus. **Look out for College and Career Night to be this fall!**

- **Be involved:** Continue to be involved on campus and in quality volunteer/community service activities. These look GREAT on a resume! (Run for office, don't be a member in name only, join clubs/get involved, and update your resume at the end of the semester)

- **Explore Careers** and try to narrow down your interests and pursuits:
 - Take a Career Quiz at <https://www.mynextmove.org/>
 - Browse your individualized **YouScience** aptitude and career interest results at signin.youscience.com (sign in with your school google account).
 - **JOB SHADOW:** Senior students are permitted **TWO** job shadowing experiences per academic year. See Mrs. Tolbert for a **Job Shadow Form**.

- **Tap into your Boss Energy**
 - Know your GPA. Strive for success in all of your classes. Finish high school strong!
 - Prepare a résumé and practice Interview Skills for Scholarships or Jobs. (We can help you with interview coaching, resume development, scholarship applications, and more!).
 - Request letters of recommendation from administrators, teachers, coaches, supervisors, club sponsors, and counselors for scholarships. Follow guidelines and ask for letters **well before** deadlines, not the day before (at least three weeks before!).

☐ **Participate in the FAFSA process: This is a GRADUATION REQUIREMENT!**

- “Participating in the FAFSA process” means understanding the FAFSA and submitting the application or completing a waiver. It is best for all students to complete the FAFSA.
- **The FAFSA is set to open on October 1st.** As resources are released, we will inform you!
- Closer to the launch date, we will visit your class to help you create your FSA ID and give you instructions for your parent to create his/her FSA ID if you are a dependent student.
- **FAFSAs for the 2026-2027 school year use your &/or your guardian’s 2024 tax returns.**
- Visit studentaid.gov/aid-estimator to see how much financial aid you **MAY** qualify for from FAFSA.

☐ **Check your CCRI: This is also a GRADUATION REQUIREMENT!**

- Every senior should graduate with **at LEAST one College and Career Readiness Indicator (CCRI)**. You can obtain a CCRI in one of these ways:
 - **Benchmarking on the ACT** (18 English; 22 Reading; 22 Math; 23 Science)
 - **Enlisting in the Military**
 - **Earning an Industry Credential** (this can be done through many career tech courses and pathways)
 - **Earning Dual Enrollment Credit** (students who earn an 70 or higher in a dual enrollment course)
 - **Earning a Qualifying Score on an AP Exam** (scoring a 3 or higher)
 - **Benchmarking on the ACT WorkKeys** (Scoring a 4 or higher on each of the 3 WorkKeys subtests. We will be administering the WorkKeys Assessment here at school later this semester.)
 - **Being a CTE Pathway Completer** (Earn 3 credits with a grade of 70 or higher in career tech courses *from the same pathway*)
 - **Completing a Youth Apprenticeship**

FOR COLLEGE-BOUND STUDENTS:

☐ **Apply for colleges!**

- **Free College Application Week is October 6-10!** Many college admission fees will be waived this week! We will host several college reps on campus that week.
- Mark your planners/calendar with **deadlines for scholarships, financial aid, and admission** (many schools have early enrollment deadlines in the Fall or Dec).
- Determine if you are eligible for admission and scholarships by GPA and test scores.

☐ **Apply EARLY for scholarships!**

- Don’t wait until the last minute!
- Check our Social Media pages often for scholarships posted! Do not miss out on applying for local scholarships, especially. Use a website like gomerry.com to tailor your national scholarship search.
- Write a great general scholarship application essay. Then you can tweak for all scholarship essays. **We can help you with this!**

☐ **Take the ACT (or SAT) if you have not taken it yet or are dissatisfied with your score.**

- See one of us for free practice tests and further information about how to improve your score.
- Do you get Free and Reduced Lunch? Talk to us to see if you qualify for an ACT Waiver.

☐ **Visit Colleges**

- You are permitted **TWO** excused college visit days. Check with us for college visitation guidelines and forms. Visit colleges that offer your program of interest and other qualities that are valuable to you.

FOR WORKFORCE-BOUND OR MILITARY-BOUND STUDENTS:

- ☐ **Make contact** with businesses/military recruiters ASAP. Set yourself apart from the rest by being proactive and professional! Reach out and find a mentor in your chosen field.
- ☐ **Work toward** obtaining necessary training, experience, certifications, and credentials.
- ☐ Look up **apprenticeships, internships, and job opportunities** for students.
- ☐ **Research:** Which businesses have **tuition assistance or reimbursement** programs. Does your chosen business/company/field offer **upward mobility**?
- ☐ If you are military, discuss enlistment with a recruiter; let us know so we can schedule your **ASVAB test**.
