Dear Parents/Caregivers,

Tena tatou katoa;

We are still experiencing issues with phones and the internet at school. We have the landline being diverted to a cell phone held in the office. Our staff and students are working around this by hot spotting from their phones for the time being.

Students not in class

Whanau please talk with your tamariki about the importance of staying in class and turning up on time.

Uniform

It is an **expectation** that students wear the school uniform. We require whanau to support this. Students need to be proud of who they are, be proud of their whanau and be proud of our school.

The board have authorised a review of a school polo shirt. We will work with students on a design and bring it back to the board and whanau for approval. This will be a process and changes will be transitioned at a much later date. Please ensure your tamariki are in the correct uniform and have no hooded jumpers.

Attendance

Concerns have been highlighted around prior attendance for 2022. The Ministry of Education are focusing on attendance and it is a school priority for 2023. The school is concerned if attendance is low, students' learning, progress, achievement and overall wellbeing are negatively affected. 90% is the minimum expectation by the Ministry of Education for 'regular attendance'. While 90% is 'regular' it still means a student misses an average of 1 in 10 days of school, which equates to almost 100 hours of lost learning time. "Every day counts" illustrates the loss of learning caused by absences.
