Overview

The high school faculty has implemented a variety of instructional strategies, interventions, and accommodations to support students' academic success and preparedness for post-secondary education and careers. The focus areas include targeted academic support, differentiated instruction, and enhanced engagement strategies to improve student outcomes across core subjects.

Key Interventions & Support Strategies

1. Targeted Academic Support in GEAR Up

- **Push-in Support**: Providing reteaching of Algebra 1 concepts for both ESE and general education students during 1st period.
- **Small Group Instruction**: Pulling small groups or working one-on-one with students needing additional support in math and English.
- **Collaboration with Teachers**: Working closely with Ms. Black (Math) and Ms. Sheets (English) to reinforce concepts and ensure continuity in instruction.
- Accommodations for Testing: Facilitating small group testing and extended time accommodations, including meeting with ESE students before school for assessments.

2. Special Education & Accommodation Support

- Navigating Accommodations: Collaborating with counselors and parents to ensure appropriate student support.
- **IEP Meeting Coordination**: Scheduling high school and college IEP meetings immediately after 1st period to maximize time and ensure student needs are met.
- Weekly Parent Communication: Maintaining regular communication with parents to address concerns and monitor student progress.

3. Tier 1 Interventions in Core Subjects

Entrepreneurship & U.S. History Honors

• Reading Comprehension Strategies: Increased use of read-alouds, formative assessments, and student-led discussions.

• Test Preparation:

- EOC-style questions for analysis and fact retention.
- Teaching test-taking strategies such as eliminating distractors.
- Use of Google Classroom for study guides and structured review sessions.

• Engagement Strategies:

- "Historian of the Week" game to reinforce learning.
- Small group interventions for students struggling with historical themes.

Algebra 1 & Geometry

- Clear Learning Objectives: Setting clear expectations at the beginning of each lesson.
- Varied Instructional Methods: Utilizing graphs, tables, and equations to illustrate mathematical concepts.

• Active Learning Approach:

- Encouraging students to justify answers.
- Using "I Do, We Do, You Do" scaffolding to support learning.

Assessment & Feedback:

- o Providing immediate feedback.
- o Implementing tiered practice problems to build mastery.

English Language Arts

• Differentiated Instruction:

- Guided annotation of texts.
- Small-group work focused on rhetorical strategies and writing.

Academic Discourse:

- Socratic seminars where students lead discussions based on their text analysis.
- Writing assignments focused on strategy application.

Chemistry & Stoichiometry

- **Explicit Skill Instruction**: Step-by-step guidance in predicting chemical reactions and balancing equations.
- Active Learning:
 - Lab-based experiments with real-world applications.
 - "Stoichiometric relay" activity to reinforce problem-solving.
- Formative Assessments: Quizzes and practice problems to track student progress.

SAT Prep

- Weekly SAT workshops hosted by SCHS teachers (culminating with Free SAT)
- IXL lessons focused on the student gaps.
