

Here are different ways to practice snap words! No matter what kind of work it is (tracing, drawing, forming, etc.), have your child say the word before and after making it so that they remember it!

RAINBOW TRACE word. Have the student trace the snap word using 5 different color of crayons.

MAGNETIC LETTERS to build sight words.

FINGER PAINT the snap words.

GLUE VARIOUS ITEMS (beans, noodles, cloth, cotton balls, miniature marshmallows, rice or paper) to make mosaic in the shape of words.

PLAY DOUGH Build words with Play DOUGH

MASKING TAPE or ROPE to make words on the floor and have children:

- Trace letter with their feet
- Walk or slide on them following the path of the letter
- Drive toy cars on them
- Follow the shape of the word by rolling with a paint roller paint
- Hop or jump along the letter lines

GONE FISHING: Fish for snap word cards using a homemade fishing pole with a magnet hanging on a string. Snap word cards can have paperclips placed on them so the magnet picks them up.

PRINTED MATERIALS: Find snap words in newspaper articles, magazines, books, on cereal boxes and other household items.

HIDE AND FIND: Hide snap words in sand, rice and beans, or birdseed and have the students find them and identify them by feeling and then looking.

I SPY: I spy the word 'the' hiding on this page. Then have the student look to find the word.

CONCENTRATION or MEMORY: Place snap word cards face down. Each person takes a turn by turning over two cards. If they match they are removed. If they don't match, the cards are turned over again and the next person plays.
