Butterflies have had a very busy half term! They have been learning all about the nativity and even had


the chance to put on their own Twinkly Nativity! They have been exploring different ways to write at school. This has been through

would like to wish you all a Happy Christmas and enjoy the holidays with family.










Green Class have enjoyed their topic Pantomime this half term, they have been reading and watching lots of traditional pantomime stories.
