Code of Conduct for Mentors, Mentees, and Parents

Peace Tower Church

Purpose

This Code of Conduct sets shared expectations for everyone involved in the Intergenerational Mentoring (IGM) Ministry **involving youth participants**. It ensures that mentoring relationships are safe, transparent, and Christ-centered while encouraging healthy partnerships between mentors, mentees, and parents.

1. Christian Commitment

All participants (mentors, mentees, and parents) agree to:

- Conduct themselves in ways that reflect the love and character of Jesus Christ.
- Treat one another with dignity, respect, and compassion.
- Support mentoring relationships with prayer, encouragement, and grace.

2. Expectations for Mentors

Mentors agree to:

Safety & Boundaries

- Meet only in approved public or church settings, or in homes with parents/screened adults present.
- o Inform parents/guardians and program leaders of all scheduled meetings.
- Communicate with mentees only through approved channels (text/email)
 with parents/guardians copied.
- Avoid physical, emotional, or spiritual boundary violations.

Role & Responsibility

- Serve as Christian role models and encouragers, not as substitutes for parents.
- Empower mentees to grow in faith, character, and life skills.

- Maintain confidentiality except when safety concerns require reporting (abuse, neglect, self-harm, or threats of violence).
- Submit documentation of meetings through the program's reporting process.

Prohibited Behaviors

- o Any form of abuse, manipulation, or inappropriate behavior.
- Private or secretive meetings.
- o Flirtatious, sexualized, or disrespectful conversation.
- Use of drugs, alcohol, or inappropriate media in mentoring contexts.

3. Expectations for Mentees

Mentees agree to:

- Respect the mentor's time, boundaries, and guidance.
- Communicate openly about scheduling and concerns.
- Keep parents/guardians informed of mentoring activities.
- Participate in activities and conversations in a respectful, honest, and Christ-centered way.
- Avoid putting mentors in situations where safety guidelines could be compromised.

4. Expectations for Parents

Parents/guardians agree to:

Support & Participation

- Encourage their youth's involvement in the program.
- Assist with transportation to and from mentoring meetings.
- Participate in the three key events of the mentoring season:
 - Kick-off Mentor Me Café

- Midway Refresher Gathering
- End-of-Season Celebration

Partnership & Oversight

- Stay informed of their child's mentoring schedule and maintain open communication.
- Give and renew parental permission for mentoring activities.
- Model encouragement and trust by supporting both their youth and the mentor.

Optional Engagement

 Consider serving as mentors themselves for young adults in the program, modeling intergenerational discipleship.

5. Accountability

- Mentors are accountable to program leaders and church leadership.
- Mentees are accountable to their parents/guardians and program leaders.
- Parents are accountable to the program's leadership team in ensuring safe and supportive participation.
- Any breach of this Code of Conduct may result in removal from the program.

6. Agreement

By signing this document, mentors, mentees, and parents/guardians commit to upholding these expectations, creating a safe, trustworthy, and Christ-centered mentoring community.
