## October Count

October Count is the process by which the State of Colorado determines how to fund schools based on attendance and participation on the part of students. The official count day is Thursday October 1st. Teachers are creating assignments in their learning platforms (Google Classroom, Blackboard) that become available on October 1st and are due on October 1st to help gather evidence of participation. Please be sure to help your child(ren) complete these assignments on Thursday. Teachers and staff will contact students and families on Thursday who have not completed these assignments to encourage their completion. It is vital that we have participation from every student at PGA, and we appreciate your help in this effort.

We meet to support our kids by learning what and how the district is implementing new measures and making recommendations to the cabinet and superintendent about what we parents feel through our monthly meetings and through our annual report to the full board. We have made recommendations to the full board about school start times in 2018-2019 and about use of the increased tax dollars for mental health in 2019-2020. 
## Seniors Don't Miss Out!
