OP-ED: Five Days In, Democrats Display Best Examples of Bad Governance

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Democrats, having swept the recent State elections, are wasting no time in making voters regret their choices.

For example, in the State of Superior, Governor Charles Baines, [unilaterally relocated the executive branch of the State](#). This led to significant controversy, including a [spat](#) between the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor, Solomon Dewey. Presumptive Superior Senate Minority Leader Greylat too came into the

ring, writing [a biting condemnation](#) of the Governor in the Lincoln State Lockean, a widely syndicated paper known for its libertarian tilt. The op-ed was met with a late-night open letter by the Governor himself, attempting to defend a TIME Magazine interview he gave and offering a clarification on the actual implications of Executive Order 1.

Shortly after issuing EO1, the Governor decided that and [directed the construction of a statue](#) of [known racist](#) and anti-war socialist Eugene Debs (among other historical and controversial figures like Dwight Eisenhower and Hillary Clinton). Eugene Debs had strongly racist opinions, authoring the socialist essay [The Negro In The Class Struggle](#) in 1903 wherein he attributed the “n***er question” merely to capitalism and not to any racial bigotry on the part of his own White race.

In Greater Appalachia, newly-elected Governor Goog Mann issued [Executive Order 02](#), bringing the Chesapeake National Guard, which had been deployed to Washington D.C. post-1/6, to maintain the security of the Capitol. Reaction to the Order remains muted, but when the Rational Southerner approached Dixie Senator and President Pro Tempore Adith_MUSG (formerly known as Adithyansoccer), he had this to say:

I'm not a massive fan of Goog's new EO. I mean sure, the threat seems to have subsided, but we need to wait for word from the FBI and the DoD before returning to normal. At the end of the day, Goog is well within his rights to do what he did, but in my own opinion he should have waited. I say this for the sake of my colleagues in the Senate and House, as well as our hundreds of staffers and public servants working to ensure a Government of, by, and for the People.

Governor Mann also issued [Executive Order 03](#), an Order to erect statues of Bobby Kennedy and Lyndon B. Johnson.

Criticism has arisen from socially progressive circles, believing that these executive orders for the construction of statues are in bad taste. They are not wrong: after a deadly COVID pandemic, an economic crash, a political earthquake, and an ever-unstable world, it just seems *offensive* to dedicate the initial week of a Governor's term to the construction of monuments.

However the worst job may be by former Senator and current Governor of Dixie, Tripplyons¹⁸. His administration thus far has produced four executive orders, each stirring up immense controversy in the influential state of Dixie.

He started with [E.O. 005](#), a brief and simple “undo [former Governor] Whitey” action that was seen as par for the course from most, but as sign for alarm from conservatives. The Order would gut Governor Whitey’s steps to ensure Second Amendment rights in Dixie, and would significantly harm his agenda on the issue of immigration. *More on that in a bit.*

Next, he wrote [E.O. 006](#), an altogether far more controversial (and poorly written) executive order. Arguably unconstitutional, the Order somehow attempts to ban offshore drilling by...throwing money at it? I’m not sure.

But the single-most feces-stirring Executive Order, the most fetid and insensitive act of governance to come out of the Democratic Party all week, is Executive Order 007: “Sensible” Immigration Policies.

This blatantly unconstitutional Executive Order directs Dixian police officers not to cooperate with Federal agencies on enforcing immigration law, and expands

healthcare benefits that were specifically earmarked for Dixian citizens to illegal immigrants.

Understandably, this has infuriated a significant section of Dixians, who have been protesting at the Dixie State Capitol for not [one](#) but [two](#) straight days. One protestor told PBS News “When the state is giving handouts to illegal immigrants and is letting them come in as they please, what happens to the students, the elderly, and everyone else across the state?”

The response to the incidents from political figures nationwide has been varied. However Democratic politicians have seized upon this news, proclaiming it to be a repeat of the truly evil attacks on the United States Capitol on the 6th of January.

Superior State Governor Charles Baines led the Democratic assault on the protestors, countering their legitimate claims by terming the Executive Order a “civil rights victory” and painting the protestors in Austin as “the fascists of our time”. Speaker of the House of Representatives Brihimia called the protestors “largely far-right, white supremacist(s)”. (It should be noted that Brihimia represents the 4th Congressional District in Dixie, where these protests are taking place).

Dixie Lieutenant Governor John G Roberts Jr stated that he was [“disappointed by the actions of these protestors”](#), smearing the demonstrators as a “mob”, “radical in nature, and similar to the one we saw inflicting horrors upon the national capitol in Washington”. Greater Appalachia Governor Goog Mann [said](#) “Let me be frank, I hold no sympathy for these individuals, I hope Governor Tripp shares my view...”.

Newly-appointed Senator Alpal2214 offered a different approach from the rabid, “Let them eat cake”-esque approach of the rest of his party. Presenting some moderation, he issued in a statement “Unlike many of my fellow Democrats, I do support the protesters and their right to protest, as long as it remains peaceful.” and “as the legality is in question, I would not begin enforcement until any court decision is final”.

Senator Nazbol909 (D-SP) returned the Democratic Party’s messaging to its tone-deaf normal, [saying](#) “Protest, That’s Your Right, But I Give Zero Damns” and denigrating the protestors as issuing “racist demands”.

Atlantic Governor Jason “House” Fire, a Republican, was one of the first in the nation to respond to the protests with a [statement](#). In it, however, he appeared to side with the Democrats, pillorying the use of the Gadsden Flag by the protestors:

ACGOP stands with the values of the Gadsden Flag, which they are tarnishing with their ignorance.

The remainder of the Republican Party had a notably different approach to the issue. Assemblywoman Lily-ir took a strong and corrective stance, issuing a briskly worded [statement](#) in which she called out Dixian Democrats for making inflammatory allegations:

To assert that a group of right-wing protestors are violent white supremacists apropos of nothing is to do a disservice to the millions of Dixians who didn't vote for the Democratic Party.

She explained that the protests were in no way violent, and offered her own personal testimony as a member of the hearings being conducted inside the Capitol at the time of the protests. She parted with a warning of sorts:

I will continue to hold the Governor to account in the legislature. I hope that the people will hold him to account in peaceful protest and the continued exercise of their rights: the rights that we do not grant, but which they already had, and is our solemn duty to maintain.



Assemblywoman Lily-ir called out the Democrat lies in the press. Should protests remain peaceful, she stands the most to gain politically.

Newly-appointed Representative Ch33 “Cube” Mazrer, a relative novice in the Dixian political scene but well known amongst members of the Dixie Business Owners’ Association, gave a speech in which he supported the rights of the demonstrators, saying:

I know the events of January 6th are still fresh on all our minds, but the fact that one violent attack on our capitol occurred does not mean that other citizens may be deprived of their rights.

Senator Adith_MUSG was uncharacteristically silent on the issue at first, but gave hope to conservatives and the protestors when [he](#) and Assemblywoman [lily-irl](#) both filed suit against Executive Order 007. Senator Adith continued, and issued a [subpoena](#) of the Governor to the Senate Armed Forces and Foreign Affairs committee (which the Senator chairs).

After these, he finally issued a [statement](#) where he declared strong support for the protests, while calling repeatedly for peaceful demonstrations and accountability for Tripplyons18:

With peaceful demonstrations of the will of the Dixian people and the silent majority, we can ensure that this victory is ours.

Decrying the statements from Democrats as “race-baiting propaganda”, he continued on:

We can and will win this, but it can only happen if we do it right.

SCODX Chief Justice FPSLover1 decided to place both Lily's and Adith's cases on hold pending the completion of the confirmation process of Dixie AG nominee UnorthodoxAmbassador.

President Ninjjadragon enacted an Executive Order halting all federal grants to sanctuary states and cities, a move that sparked a negative reaction from the [National Governors' Association](#), Governor Tripplyons himself, and Senator Adith. However freshman Congressman Ch33mazrer was strongly in support of the President's actions, issuing a [statement](#) acclaiming the coercion and calling it an example of “courage”.
