- Simmons requires that all undergraduates complete a minimum of 128 credits of coursework, fulfill PLAN and major/program requirements, and submit a Senior Audit form to graduate.
- All Students are required to complete a capstone before graduating. Consult with your advisor on how best to fill this requirement.
- You may declare a major in the beginning of the first year fall semester. You must declare a major prior to earning 80 credits.
- Students need to complete 12 "extra credits" to graduate within the 3-year time period. Those credits can be completed through summer courses and/or AP/IB credit. Students should talk to the 3+1 public policy advisor about where they stand with credits during their first year.
- All students must complete the Political Science major and Public Policy minor as undergraduates in the 3+1 POLI SCI/MPP track.
