What Is a School Community Council?

A School Community Council is a group of parents, school employees, and the principal who work together to identify academic needs and recommend how School LAND Trust funds are used to support student success.

What Does the Council Do?

- Reviews academic data and pinpoints strengths and specific academic challenges
- Creates a School LAND Trust Plan with clear goals, measures, actions, and budgets
- Encourages communication and community engagement
- Provides meaningful feedback on a wide range of school matters

Can I Serve on the Council? What is Required?

Parents and guardians are encouraged to participate! No special experience is required. Just a willingness to participate and support student success. Most councils:

- Meet a few times each year, often just once a month or less
- Welcome diverse perspectives
- Provide meaningful opportunities to contribute
