Dear Minister:

I write to urge you to make the federal investments that will allow Hamilton's non-profit housing providers to start building, right now, badly needed new affordable and supportive housing units. They are ready to build the 400+ units of supportive housing and 600 units of affordable housing detailed on the back of this letter. They just need the federal government to approve the funding to let them move ahead.

Those investments would allow Hamilton to make substantial inroads quickly on its challenges with the most desperate of those experiencing homelessness. Hamilton has about 1,600 identified individuals who are experiencing homelessness, of whom several hundred are currently living in encampments. Much greater investments will be needed to *end* homelessness and to reduce core housing need, as your government committed to do with the National Housing Strategy—28,055 Hamilton households were in core housing need at the time of the 2021 census. That is a lot of people at risk, a lot of people living with high stress, pinching their pennies, wishing they had better options.

Federal investments since 2019 in Hamilton provided funding for badly-needed repairs to preserve existing public housing units, which is vital, but only to build about 990 units of new housing, at various levels of affordability. Those results matter but much, much more is needed.

Our non-profit housing providers are proven builders and they are ready to build more, now, if they get the federal support that their projects—and people struggling in this city—need and deserve. Knowing that we have no guarantee that a new government will make any investments in non-market housing makes your response even more urgent.

Hamilton's Housing Sustainability and Investment Roadmap (HSIR) targets creating 200 new supportive housing units for people leaving shelters and encampments. Hamilton Is Home partners can double that with 418 units ready to build in 2024. Construction can begin within 30 days, with occupancy starting within 15 months.



We need \$193 M in financial investments from CMHC and Ontario to leverage Hamilton's co-investments, including \$30.52 M CMHC loans and \$62.55 M CMHC grants.
