## **Meeting Agenda**

- 1. Welcome (8 SHAC Members were present for the Meeting)
- Recap of Meeting #3 provided; focus of nutrition and health services was decided as the focus for the SHAC. Purpose of the meeting was to come to a recommendation or not as decided by SHAC. SHAC work is always ongoing.
- II. **Nutrition Committee Summary for Full SHAC** Provided by Robin Hall, MS, RDN Nutrition Sub-Committee Parent Chair
  - Report of Committee Work
    - o Background: RH met with ED Pamela Watson in March to gather basic information about nutrition services prior to setting up a full sub-committee meeting.
      - Sodexo is the District's current food vendor; 5-year contract annual renewable
      - Role ED to oversee the contract and ensure rules and regulations are met.
      - Team of registered dieticians who do menu planning and meet USDA regulations
      - Team of 4 compliance members: temperature, menu alignment, etc.
      - Parent Advisory committee required: this committee provides recommendations to Nutrition Services (this is the SHAC nutrition sub-committee)
        - Decision making on what is served; Sodexo
        - Recommendations may be more beneficial for Sodexo
      - SHAC Nutrition Focus discussed with FWISD Nutrition Services/ED PWatson
        - **Taste of food**: Dieticians hold Tasty Tuesdays, open to SHAC sub-committee visiting the Tasty Tuesdays
          - o Students selected to sit on Tasty Tuesdays



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- Snack Availability: Snacking must meet guidelines; vending machines are not supposed to be ON during the school day. There are a lot of rules and regulations around snacks and vending machines.
  - Q: What's the purpose of vending machines at school?
    - o Open for after-school hours and afterschool events
- Whole Food Waste: Cafeteria staff at campus level have to wait to see how students receive (like or dislike) food items; if it goes over well they scale up, if students dislike, then they scale back. This doesn't address food waste concerns; however, it's on Sodexo's radar to begin Tasting Tables. Something to look into.
- Vendor Process: RFP process. ED Watson is very familiar with Sodexo's processes, etc. having previously worked with them.
- Preservatives and Sugars: Communicate with Sodexo for more information on food nutrients. There are new sugar and sodium guidelines that will be implemented next school year.
  - SHAC Comment: having food taste good with reductions in sodium...this might be a reason why students turn to other food sources if the food is lacking seasoning (salt)
  - Food processing also reduces flavors; fresh foods have flavors. Food that fits the guidelines may not be most flavorful.
- Food Allergies: Communicate with Sodexo on how food allergies are taken care
  of in the district
- o Additional Discussion Points with Sub-Committee Members
  - Sodexo contract with the district: does the contract limit what is served or can it be subsidized to offer fresh options?
  - Opportunity to attend Tasty Tuesday for SHAC members

- b. Access to Health Services Next Steps (see handout provided to committee)
  - Parent Needs Assessment: what do they want and need when it comes to health services available for their children: short survey just after start of the 2025-2026 school year. How do parents want to receive information?
    - o Communication Strategy for Teachers: quick reference guide
    - Services are underutilized based on the number of students uninsured; how can we connect resources and expand communication
    - Keep in mind that many families do not have access to receive and communicate digitally; other methods have to be utilized
