Intro plays

I ain't got no home to go to
I ain't got nothing to sell
But my stars will never leave me
Even when I'm sold to hell
I was born under a blue sky
And I'll die out in the black
When I'm gone don't no one mourn
me

'cause my debts will drag me back

Intro fades out

STATION ANNOUNCER (sounds like it's coming from a speaker)

Attention everyone! The shuttle to Mars from the Vesperi SPACE stop will be leaving in the next hour. Please have your luggage and personal items on you before you board. I repeat the shuttle to Mars will be taking off in one hour.

(There is a click as the announcement ends)

YUE TANAKA

(in a cheerful, announcing way)

Well it's our last night here on Vesperi, friends and foes! But it has been a lot of fun spending time with you all. We need to do this again as soon as possible!

LUKE KINGSLEY

(nervous)

Which ones of us are the friends and which ones are the foes?

MYLLIS TANAKA

(teasingly)

Well if you don't already know Lu, I have some bad news.

EMBER SMAUK

(annoyed)

I think I know what I am.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

(comforting to Luke)
Hey now we're all friends here.
Don't let Yue's dramatics get to
you.

YUE TANAKA

Hey! I'm not that dramatic....
Right?

LUKE/MYLLIS/EMBER

(firmly)

No.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

(fondly like a parent)
Of course you are Yue.

YUE TANAKA

It's been tough to gather the whole group since we left Venus. We all live busy lives now as adults. It's nice to be back at the orbital again. It was good to

see the neighborhood. Seeing it I can remember all of the times we dragged the rest of you along with us as we searched for adventure!

MYLLIS TANAKA

And Devan always had to guide us back to our houses! Always reliable.

(Teasing)

I'm sure you still are.

YUE TANAKA

Although I wouldn't mind having visited Caritas. Get closer down to the planet. Not too close of course. Shame we have to leave again after just two weeks.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Yeah, you all need to come back to Vesperi more often. I get so lonely here! Like you need to tell your jobs you need more vacation time.

EMBER SMAUK

We have a lot of time to kill before the next shuttle arrives and before we have to go our separate ways. Does anyone have any ways to pass the time?

MYLLIS TANAKA

As long as it's not like a card game or anything. They're always so boring without gambling.

EMBER SMAUK

(scoffs)

That's because everyone knows not to gamble with you. You cheat.

MYLLIS TANAKA

(indignant)

Wha-what no, I do not cheat, okay, I simply am just-

EMBER SMAUK

(interrupting)

We know, we know. 'You're just lucky is all'.

(scoffs)

Whatever you say Mylls.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

Hey, let's not get into a fight. I don't think the station attendants or the other passengers will enjoy it. It is pretty late and this is the last flight out of Vesperi.

There is a sound of a baby in the crowd and someone coughing among the ambience noise of the station.

LUKE KINGSLEY

We could tell scary stories.

(Excited now)

Like we did when we were kids!

EMBER SMAUK

We're not kids anymore Luke.

YUE TANAKA

No, I think it could be exciting! Scary stories are made for times like these. Hold on, I got one.

YUE TANAKA

(in a hushed I'm trying
to tell a scary story
voice)

Have you ever heard of the Station at the End of the Universe? It is told on planets, ships, and space stations alike; told late at night. There is no agreement on what this station is like besides a large mostly metal structure. Or where it is exactly. Some say it's a bright place, cheerful and

inviting. Others say it's derelict and in ruins. Some claim it's located in a Black Hole. There are some who claim it's endless, so large and maze-like that you'll never find your way through. Others say it's always there, on the edge of your peripheral vision. Some say it exists outside of our perspective of space and time which is pretty ridiculous if you ask me. Its appearance changes depending on who you ask about it. You'll always find someone who has seen it.

EMBER SMAUK

You mean like seen it, or seen it?

LUKE KINGSLEY

That's black brass!

YUE TANAKA

It isn't! It's a real place!

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I think I've been to the Station.

YUE TANAKA

Wait, really?

MYLLIS TANAKA

Yeah. It's totally a real place. But you can't just take a ship to it or anything like that.

LUKE KINGSLEY

What??

EMBER SMAUK

(nervous but trying to
hide it)

But it's not a real place. It's just a scary story meant to scare people or-

MYLLIS TANAKA

(ignoring Ember)

Yeah! You don't always end up there by flying through space. Sometimes you just... end up there.

YUE TANAKA

Exactly. Almost everyone has a story about when they ended up on the Station at the End of the Universe.

EMBER SMAUK

(exacerbated)

I-I don't understand. It's
completely fake!

MYLLIS TANAKA

I mean you know- um...

EMBER SMAUK

(interrupting in a harsh
tone)

What have you been there too?

MYLLIS TANAKA

Okay. You don't have to be rude about it.

LUKE KINGSLEY

Devan h-have you been there as well?

EMBER SMAUK

Oh for the love of- are you serious? There's no way you all believe you've been to this place. It's black brass! People have told them since the beginning of time or something!

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I mean, everyone's had that weird experience-- like when they take a flyway they've gone down a

thousand times and suddenly it leads somewhere else. Or, or they hear a voice over the comm on a greenline frequency that couldn't exist.

MYLLIS TANAKA

(excitedly, like a child)
Yes, yes, exactly! THAT is going
to the station.

EMBER SMAUK

Whatever.

YUE TANAKA

Don't believe me? If we've all been there, then we should talk about it. We should share our stories. That's how black brass spread, right? Through sharing it.

EMBER SMAUK

What's the point if it's not even real?

YUE TANAKA

Because it's fun. You know what that is right? Listen. I'll go first and then you can all decide if you want to share your experiences. And I promise as your dearest friend, I will not judge you or think you're making it all up.

MYLLIS TANAKA

(in a joking tone)
And here I was thinking some of us
were your foes?

YUE TANAKA

Dearest foes too. Now let me talk!

(clears throat again
before starting in a
hushed tone like before)

Now this is a story from when I was about ten years old. I was home in bed sick from something. Not important! Myllis, my dearest twin, was off having fun with the rest of you, leaving me to entertain myself. Not that I was capable of it. I was pretty much bedridden at the time.

LUKE KINGSLEY

I remember that. Myllis tried to convince me you were going to die.

MYLLIS TANAKA

You cried so hard at the thought. I felt terrible.

YUE TANAKA

I thought I was going to die if I'm being honest. I was sooooo bored. The fever was really bad that day. I remember feeling weird. Like I was floating. And since I had nothing better to do with my sick self, I thought why not use that. I imagined I was out in space, just floating among the stars. No spacesuit needed. Nothing to hold me back from really experiencing being there. I could travel sunward if I wanted, fly right into the sun. I didn't have a great grasp of what being out in space without any protection could do to a person, but that didn't matter. I lost myself in the daydream. Of floating in the stars, chasing ships, watching planets from below me.

(pauses)

That's when things changed. Like something took control of my imagination.

LUKE KINGSLEY

(scared)

T-took control?

YUE TANAKA

Took control. I was floating out in space and then suddenly it was like there was this building in front of me. A station of some kind, but it didn't, it didn't look like any space station I've ever seen. It didn't feel like one. It felt like something had intruded upon my daydream and I had no choice but to approach it. I entered the station through some, some doors. Like a door on a fucking house. There was nothing inside. No, that's not right. There was furniture, plants, things like that. Like this place has. But it was dimly lit and there were no people. I wandered through it and-

There is another moment of silence as Yue struggles to speak.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

You don't have to keep going if it's too much.

YUE TANAKA

No, no I'm almost done. It felt like something was following me. The same thing that brought me in there. I remember wandering deep and I thought something was right behind me. I turned around as if to confront it or my demise and suddenly Myllis was jumping on my bed to check on me. I was back here. It felt so real. Like I had actually gone there... but I had convinced myself it was just my

fever giving me a really messed up dream

(in a forced chipper
voice)

So that's my story! Who's next?

DEVAN HEIGHTS

Yue...

YUE TANAKA

Don't Dev. Let's just keep going.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Well as Yue's twin, I might as well go next. Mine is... pretty different.

(clears throat)
Mine also felt like it was just a
dream, but I knew I was awake.
This was still back on Venus's
Bosom.

LUKE KINGSLEY

Don't call it that!

EMBER SMAUK

Everyone calls Vesperi that Luke. Have you seen the shape of the orbital?

LUKE KINGSLEY

Doesn't make it any better! It makes it worse I think.

Sounds of Ember mocking Luke.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Fine, fine Luke. This was back home here on Vesperi. I was out on an errand for our mother. I don't really remember the specifics of what she wanted. I mean I've never been into shopping. I think I had to be like seventeen at the time. Best that I can remember.

(pause)

Yeah. Actually there is a lot of weird stuff I remember about that day. So I was wearing orange pants that I had spilled hot pink paint all over. Devan had just moved away to Ganymede last month. And there was that, that um, lingering scent of, of lavender that always seemed to permeate the settlement no matter what. It was a busy day though. Like you'd think we'd be heading for a Sulfur Storm. I'm not the biggest person out there, obviously, so it was rough navigating the crowds. Pushed around a lot and then suddenly it was like... well...

EMBER SMAUK

Go on.

MYLLIS TANAKA

It was like I was somewhere else. There were people still all around me. Like crowds and everything. And I'm not familiar with everyone and I certainly wasn't then, but it didn't seem like the same crowds. Didn't feel like the same places. Like the halls and the rooms. It was blindingly white and a little unnerving if I'm honest. People were talking- I couldn't really understand any of it. But you know I kept going, knowing I needed to complete my errands, but as I continued I couldn't find any of the local stores. Couldn't find anywhere that was familiar. I, I mean until

LUKE KINGSLEY

Until what?

MYLLIS TANAKA (forced out)

So until I was... face to face with some woman. I can't really remember her face or anything, but she grabbed me by the arm hard. Like real hard.

(A pause then laughter)
I thought she was drunk on Polar
or something, her breath did smell
like it. She said, um...

(taking on the effect of an old woman)

'You're not supposed to be here!' or something like that and suddenly I was back in the earlier crowds near the grocery store. I always thought maybe I went to the wrong place on the orbital. You know took a wrong turn somewhere, somehow, but I was never quite sure. And when I heard about the black brass of the Station at the End of the Universe, that just felt right. I had been to the Station.

YUE TANAKA

(angry but trying to hide
it)

Why did you never tell me this?

MYLLIS TANAKA

Why did you never tell me about your experience?

(laughs)

Look, we both brushed it off, Yu. Don't um, don't think too hard about it.

YUE TANAKA

Fine but if you get kidnapped or something, don't come crying to me!

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I ah, I think as the person that came up in Myllis's story, maybe I

should be the next to go? A-actually, my journey to Ganymede is when it happened.

LUKE KINGSLEY

I thought you said that the journey was safe. Boring even. Has no one told anyone else about their experience before?

EMBER SMAUK

Look, I understand if you all think it's common to just talk about 'going to the Station' but some of us don't want to believe in that crap.

LUKE KINGSLEY

(dejected)

S-sorry.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

Ember, don't be cruel. We all had our reasons for not talking about it before. Let me just tell mine and then you two can do yours. We've been away from each other for three years. A lot can happen in a short time.

EMBER SMAUK

(angry)

Fine. Get- just get it over with. I always thought you were the sensible one. Maybe I was wrong.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

(sadly)

Maybe.

(In a calmer voice)
Anyway. This was about six years
ago but I still remember what
happened pretty clearly. We were
heading to Ganymede, me and my
family. There weren't any problems
with our travel, or at least that

was how it was supposed to be. It was a flight we'd taken, I mean, several times since my mom is- was from there. And my parents were going to go back to Venus in a, in a few months. I was going to stay this time. I had an uncle there who was going to help me with starting my new life. But I guess none of that is really important to the story. It's what happened on the trip there that matters. It had only been a day or so, relatively, since we left Venus. Nothing seemed amiss. But then the power went out.

(There is tension in his voice now)

Our greenline comm wasn't working. Nothing was working. I don't know if you've ever been aboard a ship that went just dead like that. You know more than fear. We all thought we were going to die out there. Who knew when we'd be found. If we wouldn't just be prey for a Vulture. And that's when we saw it. A station just floating out there in space. I got a creepy feeling off of it, but my parents were relieved. It didn't matter that it shouldn't have been there, that we'd never seen it there before. It wasn't attached to anything but... it did mean that we could repair our ship.

YUE TANAKA

I guess we really all are keeping secrets, huh.

EMBER SMAUK

(angrier than before)
You almost died, Devan? This is (upset stuttering)

LUKE KINGSLEY

(softly interrupting)
I'm, I'm glad you're safe, but....I
mean how did you manage to survive
if...?

DEVAN HEIGHTS

Let me keep going. We would have tried to contact the station but there wasn't a way to. Our relief became fear again when my folks realized we couldn't contact it or fly to it. So unless they spotted us back, well... But they did, they did spot us. I think. Or at least something pulled our ship to the station. I remember hearing a voice on our comm which shouldn't have been possible. The voice made my head hurt. And then I don't remember much about what the station was like. It was dark. Kind of creepy. Unsettling. I remember waiting in an area for too long but also not long at all. There were other people there, some of them looked pretty, pretty messed up. It almost felt like I was sleeping. And then suddenly... I... it was like I woke up and we were back on the ship and leaving. My parents never talked about it again. And I never pressed them on it. I... I just wanted to forget that place even if it did, I guess, save our lives.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Well, you have the strongest case for it being real so far. Unless you hallucinated it in your terror. You really don't seem the type to lie about these things. Actually, I don't know if lying is even something you're capable of Dev. You've always been the best of the five of us.

YUE TANAKA

Or as you suffocated and passed out! And had some kind of bizarre nightmare.

LUKE KINGSLEY

But if it wasn't real then how did Devan and his parents survive?

There is a long-drawn-out silence. No one in the group wants to say anything.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I, I don't know what to tell you all. I... Everything I experienced that day felt like going to the Station. Almost too strange to believe that it was real at all. Like it, like it shouldn't have happened.

EMBER SMAUK

(shouting)

Like you should be dead.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I, I didn't say that.

EMBER SMAUK

(furious)

You didn't have to. You lived and waited until now, six years later, to tell us you could have been lost out in space? Thanks a lot, Devan.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I'm sorry. I'm sorry. When we survived and just kept going, I just... I thought it would only upset you all. I lived with, with a weird story about it but... Maybe

you're right. Maybe it was wrong of me to keep it from everyone.

YUE TANAKA

We all kept it a secret. Don't be so hard on yourself Dev.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Okay, Luke. Hi! It's your turn. What happened to you?

LUKE KINGSLEY

(nervously)

Not Ember?

EMBER SMAUK

(still furious)

Did it sound like I had something to share?

LUKE KINGSLEY

Oh, okay.

(takes a deep breath)
I was pretty young when it
happened. I think maybe five? We
were traveling from Vesperi to one
of the Venus settlements on the
planet. Cloud 87, I think. My dad
had important business over there.
I don't think he really wanted me
to come with him. His
five-year-old son. But I didn't
think he wanted to just leave me
either.

(pause)

For five years old, traveling between settlements is pretty boring. I had a book to read, something about ancient art practices. More advanced than I really understood but my dad had high hopes and the pictures were pretty. It was ten minutes before I was asleep.

YUE TANAKA

Another dream then.

LUKE KINGSLEY

(flustered)

It-it didn't feel like a dream! I was on the shuttle. My dad was talking to someone on a comm. There was a girl across from me. Seemed about my age but she was... strange. She didn't look unusual but she was alone and that was weird. Humming something to herself. She grabbed my wrist suddenly and said they were waiting for us. I didn't understand. Who were they? Where were we going? My dad is going to be so mad if I just ran off. Where could we even go when we're between an orbital and a settlement? But I couldn't stop her!

MYLLIS TANAKA

Why? You couldn't fight back?

LUKE KINGSLEY

Look at me! She was stronger than a child should be.

(pauses)

That wasn't the strangest thing. The shuttle stopped suddenly and then the door opened. I-I tried to call out to my dad but she dragged me onto a platform. One that shouldn't have been there.

(pauses)

She-she pulled us down dim hallways and then into a control room? It had a lot of machines. And a large screen. It showed different places in the settlement but nothing looked familiar. She walked up to this button and then turned to me saying, 'Want to blow

it up?' I-I heard voices from outside of the room and I was so scared I just took my chance and ran off. I thought I was just going to get lost but then it was... I was back on the shuttle sobbing in fear claiming some girl was going to blow up Caritas. My dad said it was just a nightmare but, I could still feel how much my wrist hurt from her pulling me.

(Uncertain)

I-I don't know.

EMBER SMAUK

That's terrifying. Got an excuse on why you didn't tell us?

LUKE KINGSLEY

I thought it was a nightmare and it terrified me. I didn't want to relive it and then it never felt right to bring it up. I thought I could just forget it.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

(calming)

You're safe Luke. Nothing happened. Nothing exploded. I, I can't imagine carrying that for fourteen years.

YUE TANAKA

I know I'm the dramatic one but Dev yours is so much worse to keep from the rest of us. You could have died.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

(quilty)

I-I know. I know. It was my job to take care of you all. I, I just thought it was the right thing.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Ah yeah, Devan? You were wrong.

YUE TANAKA

What about you Ember? You're the only one who hasn't said anything about their experience.

EMBER SMAUK

(groans)

That's because I don't have one to share.

LUKE KINGSLEY

I thought you said something strange happened to you earlier. Or, ahh, you told me earlier.

EMBER SMAUK

(sputtering)

No, that's... well it's, it's kind of....

MYLLIS TANAKA

Oh, come on! Spit it out Em!

EMBER SMAUK

(frustrated but nervous)
Someone, fine someone handed me
like a business card, a fucking
business card, and they said
they'd be expecting me there, but
the location doesn't make any
sense. Like nothing's there, I
checked.

(pauses)

It's fine, it's fine though. It's fine because it's just a joke. Some asshole pulling a prank to freak me out. It's not true. I'm not going to some fake made-up station used to haunt nightmares. All of your experiences can be explained if you think about it. It's not real.

LUKE KINGSLEY (in a quiet voice)

But what if it is?

EMBER SMAUK

Then I'll be the only one next with a story to tell.

There is a crackle of an intercom.

STATION ANNOUNCER

The shuttle has arrived! Please board as quickly as possible. This will be the last shuttle leaving Vesperi Station for the evening. Once again, the shuttle to Mars is leaving.

YUE TANAKA

Well, friends and foes, it looks like our time together is over. It has been fun getting to spend time together, the five of us.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Maybe we will all have more scary stories to share next time. Who knows. We all have a friend now who's been to the Station.

LUKE KINGSLEY

Please don't say that. I never want to think about it again.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

I'm sure it'll be fine. No matter if it's real or not, we all survived our encounters. I-I mean most people do. I'd imagine that's why people talk about it all the time. Why else would there be a word for what happened to us? Ember, you shouldn't be scared to-

EMBER SMAUK

(defensive)

I'm not scared!

(firmly)

I'm not scared.

DEVAN HEIGHTS

It's just, it's one more thing we all share now. Connected together, even as far apart as we are.

YUE TANAKA

(giggling)

Can't separate this squad!

MYLLIS TANAKA

Oh like the blue string of fate!

EMBER SMAUK

You mean red?

MYLLIS TANAKA

No, isn't red for romance? Blue is for friends! Trust me, it just feels like a friends color.

EMBER SMAUK

I guess.

LUKE KINGSLEY

We should get going. I can't be late for my new job.

YUE TANAKA

Be sure to get us souvenirs from your ranch, Lu.

MYLLIS TANAKA

Something cute, oh oh and cool. Like us!

DEVAN HEIGHTS

Stay in touch everyone. Especially you Ember.

EMBER SMAUK

If a mysterious station doesn't eat me first, sure.

LUKE KINGSLEY

Be safe everyone. I'll miss you. It was fun? I mean most of it was fun. Not this part.

MYLLIS TANAKA

(in a cheerful voice)
Miss you all until the sun goes
out and consumes us all!

EMBER SMAUK

Still the worst way to say goodbye.

MYLLIS TANAKA

And you're still no fun.

YUE TANAKA

So long, Venus. Until we return home again.

There are sounds of people walking and boarding a spaceship. Once it fades there is a brief pause of eerie silence.
