EVAAS Analysis

The students at Sunny View Elementary School have made many positive gains over the past few years. Even with the learning gap that was created by the time students missed for COVID, we were able to show positive growth in ELA and Math during the 2021-2022 school year. Students met expected growth in two out of the three tested subjects(ELA and Math). Students failed to meet growth in 5th Grade Science. There were several factors that played a role in students not meeting growth standards in Science. We here at Sunny View are dedicated to all of our students meeting growth each year and exceeding growth in years to come.

In our growth data analysis, dating back to the 2018 school year, we have met growth standards in Math and ELA, but our progress in Science has not been acceptable over the past couple years. We are continuing to make enhancements to our Math and ELA curriculums, but this year we have an extra focus on Science. To address our Science deficiencies, we have made several personnel changes, increased our scheduled daily Science time, added a weekly STEM time, and added several curriculum enhancements. We expect to see growth this year and years to come with the changes that have been made and enhancements that have been implemented.
